All eyes turn to Tripoli

On Monday and Tuesday, African and EU leaders will be meeting in Tripoli to evaluate the results of the Partnership three years after Lisbon and discuss the way forward for Africa-EU relations. The Summit will convene under the overarching theme "Investment, Economic Growth and Job Creation" and will take cooperation between the two continents to a new, more ambitious level.

In the run-up to this 3rd Summit, several preparatory meetings made considerable progress in reaching agreement on some of the key issues to elaborate the second action plan. It will be one of the major deliverables of the Summit, together with a political declaration and a joint climate change declaration.
