Format and eligibility for the internship

- 6 months preferred
- Full-time preferred
- European and Chinese citizen are invited to apply
- Applications cannot be accepted from candidates who have had or have an internship at the European Commission, European Parliament or EU Delegation before

Political Framework

The scope of intervention will cover:

- **EU-China Joint Declaration on Energy Security** (May 2012)
- **ENER-SERC cooperation agreement on electricity markets** (May 2012)

In addition to annual EU-China Summits, the flagship sectoral mechanisms include:

- The EU-China High Level Meeting on Energy (HLME)
- The ENER-NEA Energy Dialogue
- The Working Group on Energy Security
- The ENTR-MIIT “industrial energy-efficiency and GHG emissions reduction” Working Group
- inputs to the High-Level Economic and trade Dialogue (HED)

Interns are considered full team members in the preparation of these events (contributions to background research, briefings, arrangements of official visits from Brussels, etc)

Overview of key tasks

Under the joint guidance and supervision of the First Secretary and of the policy officer in charge of Energy:

- Contribution to intelligence gathering and reporting (attendance to conferences, press review, data crunching, research...)
- Contribution to public outreach actions (involvement in the management of workshop and conferences, preparation of speeches, PPTs, press releases, social media networks, etc)
- Participation to the preparation, execution and follow-up of visits and missions by EU officials from headquarters
- Support to the coordination with the 28 EU Member State embassies in Beijing and consulates across China

Interactions with other stakeholders

Regular attendance at the following working groups of the European Chamber of Commerce in China (EUCCC) will be expected:

- Energy Working Group
- Renewables Sub-working Group
- Smart Grids Sub-working Group

The work will also entail continuous interaction with EU-funded projects in China, and notably:

- The EU-China Clean Energy Centre (“EC2”)
- The Europe-China Trade Project (EUCTP)
- The EU-China Low-Carbon Economy Platform (www.chinalce.eu)
- and on an ad-hoc basis: The Policy Dialogue Support Facility (PDSF)

NB: the acceptance of the internship position also entails de facto adhesion to the “EU-China Green Growth Corps” (a youth organisation of volunteers supporting the cooperation between Chinese and European institutions in green growth)

- Exposure to the working environment of the EU Delegation and the European External Action Service (EEAS)
