## MINISTERIAL MEETING

<u>125th session of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe</u> 19/05/2015 - Council of Europe

Ministers for Foreign Affairs of the 47 member states of the organisation were brought together in Brussels. At the close of the session, Bosnia and Herzegovina has taken over from Belgium the chairmanship of the Committee of Ministers for the next six months. Outgoing Chairperson Didier Reynders presented the stocktaking of Belgium's chairmanship and Igor Crnadak, Minister for Foreign Affairs of Bosnia and Herzegovina, presented the priorities of his country's chairmanship.

"A major document was adopted - a declaration on combatting terrorism and extremism. It lays additional principles of joint work of all of us in this direction. An action plan for the implementation of this declaration was approved," Lavrov said.

Speaking at a joint briefing with OSCE Secretary General Lamberto Zannier, Jagland told reporters that a special group is needed for an impartial probe into numeral reports on violations of citizens' rights in Macedonia and for political reconciliation in the country.

Armenian Parliament Speaker calls on Council of Europe to fight intolerance 19/05/2015 - Panorama

The Council of Europe has a serious work to do in the fight against intolerance, Armenian National Assembly Speaker Galust Sahakyan said in his remarks at the session of PACE Committee on Legal Affairs and Human Rights in Yerevan. "Intolerance generates racism and violence, which eventually grow into conflicts. The Armenian nation has experienced the consequences of xenophobia," Mr Sahakyan said.

A move, they claim, will make Britain's Supreme Court "the ultimate arbiter of human rights" in the UK.

"I hope Belarus will soon become a full member of the Council of Europe", Commissioner for Human Rights Nils Muiznieks said at the first Eastern Partnership media conference in Riga on 20 May.

<u>Council of Europe asks France to change surveillance law</u> 21/05/2015 - Videonews

The Council of Europe's commissioner for human rights has urged France to make necessary changes to a proposed law that plans a further expansion of the government's surveillance program, the council said in an official statement. The surveillance bill was adopted by the French National Assembly on May 5 and sent to the upper house for further debate; it gives French intelligence agencies the power to have real-time access to a data connections, email contents, key log-ins and phone or mobile geo-location data without seeking permission from a judge.
