#### Turkish FM, PACE president condemn terrorism, urge easing of tensions

#### **UN, PACE condemn PKK terrorist attacks**

#### Azerbaijan: PACE President outraged at sentences for Leyla and Arif Yunus

"I am shocked and outraged by the sentencing of Leyla and Arif Yunus for eight-and-a-half and seven years of imprisonment, respectively," said Anne Brasseur, the President of the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe (PACE). "The Council of Europe has repeatedly urged the authorities to stop the unprecedented crackdown on civil society – including reprisals and judicial harassment of human rights defenders and independent media – and address human rights problems in the country," she said.

#### Azerbaijan criticised for jailing activist couple

This tragic event should serve as a last reminder to the authorities and society as whole that the country cannot continue like this: all must re-engage, and all must be done, to restore internal dialogue and trust between civil society and the authorities", he said.

#### CoE body seeks full application of transparency advice

The new compliance report by the Group of States Against Corruption (GRECO), says that to date, Georgia has satisfactorily implemented eight out of a total of 15 recommendations given in 2011.
