“The Last Chance for Stability ... Or Chaos?”

Forty seven coalitions and political movements have declared intent to participate in Friday’s million man march, titled “The Last Chance”. Movements have made their intentions clear amidst purposeful efforts by security forces to ensure stability in this upcoming period.

Youth coalitions have stated that national committees will assist in securing the protests.

In a message SCAF had called on the protestors to remain apprehensive and unite forces against any attempts to lead the nation into a state of full chaos and disruption, which can have serious consequences on the stability of the country. SCAF especially warned against attempts to attack the Ministry of Interior, a move that could have dire long-term effects on the state of security in Egypt.

In the Square, protestors have reiterated their eight requests: (1) the formation of a national presidential council, (2) the formation of a “salvation” government, (3) the formation of a judicial fact-finding committee to investigate Tahrir events, (4) immediate suspension of all military court trials, (5) the political isolation of former NDP members, (6) full restructuring of media institutions, (7) the elimination of the

Ministry of Communications and Information Technology, (8) subjecting Mubarak and followers to trials, and accusing them of treachery.

The death toll has risen to 38, among which was a young boy killed yesterday in Ismalia. Thirty eight political coalitions and rights organizations, and 28 public figures, have said SCAF was fully responsible for the death toll.

Amr Moussa, former head of the League of Arab States, presidential hopeful Mohamed Saleem, and head of *al-Wasat* political party Abol Ela Maadi held a meeting to discuss the ongoing crisis, and reiterated the importance of protecting protestors from assaults.



Sources had told Al Ahram that there were ten names currently being suggested to form the new cabinet, among which are Amr Moussa, Kamal al-Ganzouri, Mohamed ElBaradei, Hazem al-Biblawi, Hussam Eissa, Mohamed Ghoneim, Mansour Hassan and chancellor Hisham al-Bastawisi.

Amr Moussa had earlier received a call to help form a national salvation government that helps the nation emerge out of the current crisis. Sources had previously revealed that Moussa refused to take on the post of Prime Minister.

Other colations and political movements in Tahrir had brought to the table the names of Hamdeen Sabahi, Abdel Moneim Abul Fotouh, Abdel Galeel Mustafa, Monir Fakhri Abdel Noor, and Al Sayyed Al Badawi to head the new cabinet.

Clashes also continued in the city of Alexandria. The classy area of Smouha witnessed attempts to vandalize and break into nearby vehicles. The death toll in Alexandria has risen to three citizens and one member of the military force, amidst continued acts of violence that involved the use of Molotov cocktails, live ammunition and tear gas canisters.

A number of youth coalitions in Alexandria had issued a statement condemning the excessive use of force. Intensive efforts are being exerted by mosque Imams to calm the storm.

Dr. Mahmoud Mohamed Ali, chief forensic physician vice, said the Zeinhom morgue received 38 bodies. A large number of casualties also visited the morgue to receive treatment and/or issue injury reports for the prosecutor's office.

Meanwhile, forty seven coalitions and political movements have specified requests and presented a roadmap for the upcoming period. The movements have reaffirmed that the revolution will continue.

On a different note, Minister of Interior Mansour al-Essawi denied the use of live ammunition against protestors.

The Public Prosecutor's office had also decided not to press charges against three American citizens (Derrick Sweeney, Luke Gates and Gregory Porter) seen atop The

American University in Cairo's buildings, taking photographs and throwing Molotov Cocktails on the Ministry of Interior's building.

The Muslim Brotherhood had earlier announced that they will not be participating in Friday's million man march. The Brotherhood had stated it believed in the mediatory role it plays between the people of Egypt and security forces, adding that it has no intent to contribute to the state of chaos and instability.

'Battle of the Camel 2'

Al Gomhoreya reported on a state of "watchful peace" on Thursday night, following attempts to stop the blood bath in Mohamed Mahmoud Street. Revolutionaries were able to form human barricades and halt acts of violence between protestors and security forces.

Al Azhar clerics had also staged a rally, initiated in Tahrir Square and ending in Mohamed Mahmoud Street. Clerics carried signs that called for an immediate stop to the blood bath.

Meanwhile, 20 political movements and coalitions declared their intent to participate in Friday's million man march, calling for the immediate transition of power and for presidential elections to be held no later than April of 2012. The list of participating coalitions included Ghadd al Thawra Party, Al Tagamoa Al Nassiri, the Revolution Youth Coalition, The April 6 Movement, The National Association for Change, The Democratic Front Party, among others.

Movements and coalitions were reiterating nine specific requests, among which was the immediate formation of a civilian council, a national salvation government, and a judicial fact-finding committee.

The April 6 Movement said it formed committees to ensure the security of the square. The movement had confirmed its intent to be strongly present in the protests that call for the removal of SCAF and the immediate transition to a civilian government.

An estimated 800 protestors had assaulted the security headquarters in the governorate of al-Minya. The protestors used Molotov cocktails, rubber coated pellets, stones and bricks in their assault.

Roadmap in Tahrir Square ... Truce Under Fire

Fifty coalitions and political movements drew a roadmap yesterday in Tahrir, the aim of which is to put an end to the current state of chaos and crisis. The roadmap specifies a timeline for the upcoming presidential and parliamentary elections, and the departure of SCAF. A number of protestors had declined SCAF's apology and described it as a "political maneuver". Youth coalitions had issued a statement saying Field Marshal Tantawi's statement was rejected by "most Egyptians."

Meanwhile, SCAF has been facing difficulty in assigning a national salvation government. Reporters were asked to attend a press conference at 8:30 am, which was later postponed. Sources had revealed that SCAF was negotiating with two possible candidates, namely Mohamed ElBaradei, former IAEA chief, and Amr Moussa, former head of the League of Arab States. Sources also told Al Masry Al Youm that ElBaradei said his acceptance was conditional to being granted full authority over the cabinet, which would deal with three critical issues which are the economy, state of security and the transitional phase. Moussa had also said his acceptance was conditional to being granted full autonomy over his cabinet.

SCAF had said the parliamentary elections will be held as scheduled, and the head of the SEC said they would hold the elections "no matter the circumstances".

The public prosecutor's office had received several CDs showcasing clashes between protestors and security forces. Reports revealed that injuries resulted from the firing of rubber coated pellets and suffocation from gas. Other reports to the public prosecutor's office suggested protestors were killed with live ammunition

Battle of the Million Man Marches

Lieutenant Mokhtar al-Mullah, member of the Supreme Council of Armed Forces, said "the council gained legitimacy with the March 19 referendum", and that protestors in Tahrir Square cannot determine the fate of SCAF.

Al-Mullah had reaffirmed SEC's ability to hold the parliamentary elections as scheduled, and said he hoped a new cabinet would be in place prior to the elections. Al-Mullah said SCAF rejected any form of international monitoring on the elections.

Meanwhile, "silent majority" coalitions have been staging pro-SCAF protests in al-Abassiya district. Coalitions have allocated more than 20 buses to move protestors from nearby governorates and bring them to al-Abassiya, where they would rally in support of SCAF. The movement has initiated a petition that managed to gather more than 150 thousand signatures so far, and said it aimed to collect 5 million signatures in total.

Youm 7 describes the scene in Tahrir Square as follows: Makeshift hospitals and committees formed a few hours before protests are expected to start. Motorcycles are available to transport injured individuals. Street vendors were back in the square, and none of the political powers had set up platforms for their speeches.

Islamic movements were not in agreement over whether or not to participate in Friday's protests. The Muslim Brotherhood and *al-Jama'a al-Islamiya* had publicly announced that they will not be taking part in Friday's rallies, while Salafi and Sufi movements said they would be protesting.

The Ministerial Cabinet had earlier announced that it was able to reach a truce between protestors and security forces, where barricades would be constructed on both ends of Mohamed Mahmoud Street, where conflict between the two parties had erupted.

Peace Dominates Mohamed Mahmoud Street

Tahrir Square is getting ready for yet another million man march. Whereas there have been variations on the name of the protest, the demands were one and the same – protestors were calling on SCAF to immediately transition power to a civilian government, and to trial those behind the killings of the past few days.

Prominent political powers have announced their intent to participate in the protests. Mahmoud Ghozlan, spokesperson of the Muslim Brotherhood, confirmed that the MB will not be participating in Friday's protests as it seeks the reinforcement of a state of stability and for elections to be held as scheduled, to ensure the transition to a civilian government.

SCAF had issued an apology to the families of the martyrs, and offered to provide medical care to those injured in Tahrir events through the establishment of makeshift hospitals within the area.

Presidential hopeful Mohamed ElBaradei described these times as “difficult”, and said protestors were not to blame for the current state of chaos, and that they had legitimate requests.

Earlier reports had revealed five dead, 500 injured in Mohamed Mahmoud clashes. Political movements had issued a roadmap for the forthcoming period.

“Last Chance” Million Man March

SCAF was given an ultimatum by protestors set to demonstrate in Tahrir today – they either leave immediately and transition power to a civilian cabinet, or face outrage by thousands set to protest in Tahrir Square.

A number of political movements and coalitions rejected yesterday, in a collective statement, SCAF’s apology, asking them to order an immediate investigation into the Tahrir events. Calls are also being made for SCAF to specify a timeline for the presidential elections.

Reports have been circulating of abnormal injuries and convulsions witnessed by protestors in Tahrir who have been subjected to tear gas canisters by security forces. Al Tahrir newspaper revealed that the gas being used is known as “C.R.” has, a weapon no longer used by British or American forces as it is said to contain carcinogenic substances.

As protests continue in Tahrir Square, Egypt’s governorates are staging protests of their own in al-Minya, Damietta, Alexandria, Bani Sweif, Luxor, and al-Ismaia.

Friday Protests Leave Egypt At Crossroads

Al Akhbar had reported on consensus reached in choosing former Prime Minister Kamal Al Ganzouri to head the new cabinet. Al Ganzouri had met with Field Marshal Mohamed Hussein Tantawi at the Ministry of Defense's General Secretariat. A list of nine potential candidates was formulated, some of which were eliminated while others rejected the post.

SCAF had also issued a statement rejecting pro-military protests, and said they were keener on maintaining stability within the nation.

Current Prime Minister Essam Sharaf rejected rumors that he asked Minister of Interior Mansour El Essawi to resort to violence in dispersing protestors. An Egyptian newspaper had earlier published quotes by Essawi suggesting that Sharaf asked him to resort to violence against the protestors.

Essawi also rejected the notion that the Ministry of Interior used live ammunition, rubber-coated bullets against protestors.

Egypt Resumes Revolution Today

More than 38 political movements and coalitions have announced today that they will be participating in the Tahrir Square protests.

The April 6 Movement has called on postponing phase one of the parliamentary elections until a national salvation cabinet is in place.

The Ministry of Justice had earlier announced that a fact-finding committee was in place and ready to operate, but that they had not received confirmation from SCAF to begin operation.

Meanwhile, clashes have continued in Alexandria, where protestors engaged in an open-ended protest as they carried signage prohibiting coming near the security headquarters.

Al Dostor had reported on its finding of expired C.R. gas canisters in Dakahlia. Fine print on the canisters said that "use beyond the expiry date can lead to death."

Al Dotor also reported on the Church of Qasr Al Dobara, which has become a field hospital for those injured in the Tahrir events. Pope Sameh Morris had revealed that they were able to offer medical care to 350 injured individuals

❖ **Al-Shorouk: Egyptian daily independent newspaper**
