### **Bloodshed on the Fifth Day**



On the fifth day of clashes between demonstrators and troops in Cairo, death toll increases to 14 victims and 176 injuries amongst the demonstrators and the troops.

19 movements and coalitions called for a mass demonstration on Friday in solidarity with the protesters.

An official in the Ministry of Interior reported that a number of protesters had removed part of the cement barrier established to separate between demonstrators from the troops.

Demonstrators have allegedly thrown petrol bombs and stones at the troops on the other side of the barrier. Six officers and 120 soldiers have consequently been injured.

Troops are exhibiting self restraint and are not using weapons. However, a physician at the makeshift clinic reported on 50 injuries amongst protesters during the police crackdown yesterday.

Minister of Interior Muhammad Ibrahim called on the security forces to stick to self restraint and not to attack the protesters.

Many attempts have been made to convince protesters to end the sit-in. Talks have been conducted between some political players and the protesters to evacuate the Tahrir Square. On their part, protesters asked the other activists to join the sit-in.

Political players asserted their adherence to the Damir [conscience] Initiative that calls for an immediate cessation of violence and the deterioration of protesters to Tahrir Square. The initiative aims to prevent any hindering of the work at governmental institutions; it also aims at



forming an independent investigation committee and stopping the attacks against protesters in the media.

Some people called for an urgent presidential elections or a military-civil presidential council to manage the country.

Salafists in Alexandria will boycott the Friday rally.

SCAF issued its communiqué number 91 in which it expressed its strong regret over transgressions against women and called for unity and cooperation to reveal the thugs and criminals who threaten the nation's stability. SCAF also welcomed any initiative that might help ending the current crisis.

Five humanitarian organizations denounced the escalating violence against women defenders of human rights since the beginning of the latest clashes.

On the public side, a women's rally was organized yesterday by women activists and students to protest the violations and assaults against women.

Protesters chanted against the trivialization of women and against preventing them from the right to active participation in the democratic transformation. Women also chanted: "We are all Ghadah Kamal Abd al-Raziq," "we are all Ghada Kamal Abd al-Raziq," "Free women, we'll go on," "our honor is a red line." Ghadah kamal Abd al-Raziq is the woman who was stripped off and dragged along the ground.

Potential Presidential candidate Buthainah Kamel stated that her participation in the women rally was not only to denounce the transgressions against female protesters but also to honor the martyrs who died during the clashes.

A meeting was held between SCAF and the Advisory Council. The meeting resulted in condemning the transgressions. It also asserted on taking all the measures to stop the bloodshed. SCAF also confirmed its commitment to transfer the power and go on in the electoral process. It also stressed its respect for the right to demonstration.

SCAF announced that it was ready to restore the Egyptian Academy that was destroyed in arson on Friday and Saturday.

The Sharjah's ruler also offered to fund the restoration of the Egyptian Academy and its valuable documents and manuscripts.

In a related context, the woman who offered the rotten meat sandwiches to protesters on December 14 was interrogated. Investigations proved that Nelly Ismat Sabri Muhammad was a lady who used to offer food to protesters. Investigations proved that the meat was rotten and that there was no in it.



13 bodies have been delivered to Zainhom Morgue since the beginning of clashes on Friday.

University students organized rallies to express their solidarity with protesters.

Al-Ahram also referred to the UN Human Right Commissioner's condemnation of the brutal suppression of protesters. It also highlighted the reaction of Hillary Clinton who considered the violence against women protesters to be disgraceful.

### Runoffs Start Today



Al-Ahram pointed out heated race between the Muslim Brotherhood’s Freedom and Justice and Salafist al-Nour in the second phase of elections to the People’s Assembly.

### Masry Youm Election Updates

The Administrative Court in Qena invalidated the elections of the second phase in the multi-member constituencies.

The HEC decided to follow the ruling of the Administrative Court in Aswan that elections in the governorate will be repeated on January 10<sup>th</sup> with the slate of The Free Communists' Party will be added to the ballot papers.

Supervisors from Carter Center for Human Rights praised the elections in Egypt describing the elections as "peaceful."

### Women March Against SCAF Brutality



A number of political movements and coalitions held press conferences yesterday to respond to the Military Council’s press conference in which they criticized the Council’s performance whether during the clashes or during the conference. Ghada Kamal, a girl who was dragged over the ground by the army, called for a million-man demonstration on Friday to be named “Regaining Dignity.” Over 20 political movements co-held a conference condemning the footage SCAF used in its conference and responded by showing videos that prove the Army used extreme violence.

Thousands of girls and women joined a demonstration in Tahrir yesterday chanting “Egyptian girls are a red line” and “Egypt’s girls are not to be stripped” protested the manner CSF treated girls in the clashes.

Masry Youm reporters followed the latest updates on the events, clashes in Tahrir area started again at dawn. The Military Police and Central Security launched an attack from Omar Makram Street using pellets, tear gas bombs and water to disperse protestors. A medic in the makeshift hospital said they received victims with bruises, fractures and facial wounds. One young man received a gunshot to the chest, he added.

The prosecution has ordered the detention of 35 suspects arrested on Monday. They were planning to set the Egyptian Museum and the People’s Assembly on fire. They were charged with mobbing and vandalism. The National Security Authority received recordings that show a former parliament member talking to the suspects.

The statement made by Egypt’s Grand Mufti saying that burning the Egyptian Institute was a mistake as it contained the maps that restored Taba enraged Facebook users. They blamed him for his statements saying that the lives of martyrs are more important especially when there is a copy of the documents in Dar El-Kotob.



The Military Council issued a statement yesterday apologizing for Egypt's women over Tahrir transgressions assuring its respect and appreciation to all Egyptian women. The Ministry of Health announced that the latest death toll has reached 13 after another death case yesterday. According to the ministry there were 630 injured; 538 were treated and discharged while the rest remain hospitalized.

After meeting with the Advisory Council, SCAF Head, Mohamed Hussien Tantawi, assured that Egyptian Institute will be rebuilt. The Military Council is committed to handing over to an elected president in June 2012, stated Tantawi. Mansour Hassan, the advisory council's chairman, described the meeting as "fruitful."

The Democratic Alliance, headed by the Muslim Brotherhood, accuses the Military Council with failure and calls for handing over power after the elections.

The National Council for Human Rights forms a committee to investigate the conditions of those detained in Occupy Cabinet events. Youssef Boutros Ghali, NCHR chairman, said that the council is holding non-stop meetings until those difficult times are over.

### Al-Gomhoria Review on Cabinet Events



Uneasy calm prevailed in Downtown Cairo's Sheikh Rihaan and Kasr Al-Aini streets after the Armed Forces rebuilt a concrete barricade to prevent further clashes with protesters.

In Tahrir Square, medical sources at field hospitals said three protesters were killed and dozens injured during an attack by security forces on early Tuesday. The attack was launched after a number of youths hurled Molotov cocktails on Army soldiers deployed at the street leading to the American Embassy.

A total of 601 people have been injured so far since the start of the events on Friday, said Assistant Health Minister Adel-Adawi.

- ✓ 460 of them were discharged from hospital, Adawi said.
- ✓ The number of dead stood at 12, he underlined.

Al-Gomhoria newspaper received a phone call from a worker at the Tahrir Governmental Complex, saying that suspicious people over the rooftop of the Omar Makram Mosque wore military helmets.

The group, who look like thugs, started beating one of their own and made sure the event was captured on video, the worker said.

### Army Back to the Barracks in January



Tahrir's reporter Iman Abd El-Moneim depicted two scenarios for "salvaging the revolution" by handing over power to civilians as soon as possible.

The first one is electing a temporary president from the parliament approved by two thirds of the parliament members. He will run the country temporarily for 6 or 9 months.

In this scenario, parliamentary elections will end on January 13<sup>th</sup>, an emergency parliament session will be held on the 20<sup>th</sup>, to open candidature for the post of the temporary president which, will last a week. On February 5<sup>th</sup> the new president would be elected, to be sworn in on the 11<sup>th</sup>.

The second scenario states that a constitutional decree should be issued by January 25<sup>th</sup> to open candidature for a week. The presidential elections would be held on March 3<sup>rd</sup> with the runoffs on March 10<sup>th</sup>.

This way the new president would be sworn in on March 15<sup>th</sup>. The Muslim Brotherhood stated they would not nominate anyone for the position of the People's Assembly Speaker.

Yesterday, thousands of women organized a huge march that started from the Syndicate of Journalism against the mistreatment of female protestors by the hands of Army soldiers. Thousands of female political activists participated. 20 Women's organizations participated in the March.

Tahrir reporters, on page 7, followed the demonstrations that were staged in different governorates against the Military Council, using violence against protestors and dragging an d



undressing female protestors. There were also a number of sit-ins in Egyptian universities in solidarity with the protests.

Tahrir reporter, Mahmoud Badr wrote about Tuesday events; after, protestors in Kasr-Einy and Rehan Streets forced Army Forces to retreat, they attempted to bring down the concrete barriers in both streets. Later, protestors retreated to the square where the security forces attacked them from Omar Makram Street. Clashes between both sides lasted from 2am until 5am.

Chairman of the Military Council, Mohamed Tantawi and SCAF member Sami Anan met with the Advisory Council yesterday. They promised to stop violence against protestors immediately.

The Ministry of Interior revealed the lady who offered protestors bad meals. Nilly Essam said she is used to preparing food for protestors and did not know that the meat was rotten.

The minister visited Rehan Street yesterday demanding utmost self-restraint from his officers. He stated that the ministry is only responsible for securing facilities, and not dispersing protests.

Hillary Clinton, US Secretary of State attacked Egypt's 'disgrace' to women. "This systematic degradation of Egyptian women dishonors the revolution, disgraces the state and its uniform and is not worthy of a great people," Clinton said. Washington Post said that the army is trying to distort the image of revolutionaries.

Egypt's Governmental Complex in Tahrir has 176 cameras that videotaped all the events in Kasr-Einy and Sheikh Rehan Streets, said Osama Abd El-Aal the complex's security head.

The Forensic report of Sheikh Emad Effat's cause of death revealed that he died of two gunshots to the arm and chest. Forensic reports prove that all those who died during the events died were shot by live ammunition.

The public prosecution revealed that they have handed over all investigation documents related to Occupy Cabinet events to the investigation judges appointed by Cairo's Court of Appeal. This contradicts what SCAF Member, Adel Emara stated in the last press conference. In the same conference he revealed plots to burn down the People's Assembly, "since they knew about burning the Egyptian Institute, they should have tried to protect it," said George Isaac, political activist.

Ayman Nour, presidential hopeful, filed a report to the Public Prosecutor yesterday against the Military Council accusing it of Libel and Slander. Nour said in his report that the Army was behind those clashes.

### Al-Shorouk Press Review on Cabinet Events



Thousands of protesters flocked to Tahrir Square after bloody clashes in Kasr Al-Aini and Sheikh Riham streets ended.

According to Al-Shorouk source, the new clashes left 10 protesters dead and 48 injured. The Health Ministry and Forensic Medicine Authority denied the figures, saying 13 were killed since the start of the clashes on Friday.

Malek Assal, a field doctor, confirmed that 10 people were killed and 48 injured during the clashes that erupted at dawn Tuesday.

All fatalities were resulted from shotgun wounds in different body parts, especially in the head and neck, Assal said.

Meanwhile, dozens of protesters formed a human shield to prevent other demonstrators from reaching the restive Sheikh Riham and Kasr Al-Aini streets.

A doctor, who asked to remain anonymous, said he saw four people killed on dawn Tuesday. Military police tried to storm field hospitals more than once, the doctor said.

Head of the Forensic Medicine Authority Ehsan Kamil Georgy said Fatwa secretary Emad Effat and medicine student Alaa Abdel-Hadi were killed by gunshots fired from a distance.

Thousands of women staged a march from Tahrir Square to the Syndicate of Journalists to condemn assaults against girls by army personnel.

The march was surrounded by a human cordon formed by men.



SCAF issued a statement to apologize to Egypt's women over the violations committed during the recent clashes outside the Cabinet and People's Assembly premises.

A lawyer, Tareq el-Awadi, filed a complaint with the attorney general against SCAF and the interior and information ministers, accusing them of misleading the public opinion.

According to Awadi, the three bodies posted the photos of the suspects involved in the Cabinet events, three of whom had nothing to do with the incidents.

The prosecution decided to extend to 15 days the detention of 118 people involved in the Cabinet events.

Interrogating and torturing children over the Cabinet clashes runs counter to international law, said Director of the Cairo Center for Human Rights Studies Bahieddin Hassan.

In unusually strong language, the US secretary of state accused Egypt's new leaders of mistreatment of women both on the street and in politics since the street revolt nearly a year ago that overthrew leader Hosni Mubarak.

"This systematic degradation of Egyptian women dishonors the revolution, disgraces the state and its uniform and is not worthy of a great people," Hillary Clinton said in a speech at Georgetown University.

"Recent events in Egypt have been particularly shocking. Women are being beaten and humiliated in the same streets where they risked their lives for the revolution only a few short months ago," Clinton said.

She denounced a "deeply troubling pattern" of military authorities and the major political parties alike keeping Egyptian women out of decision-making.

"At the same time, they have been specifically targeted both by security forces and extremists," the top US diplomat said.

Spokesman of the Salafist Call Yasser el-Barhoumi warned that the Cabinet events were meant to provoke Salafists.

In an online video, Barhoumi said the girl, who was stripped off her clothes and beaten by Army soldiers, was not a Salafist member. The girl wore the Niqab to fuel the events, he said. Meanwhile, presidential candidate Hazem Abu-Ismael called on the people to organize a massive rally to defend the honor of women.

Presidential hopeful Mohamed el-Baradei called on SCAF to immediately halt the use of force against protesters.

Al-Yom al-Sabee focused on the developments of the current situation in Egypt. Al-Yom al-Sabee referred to a meeting between SCAF and the Advisory Council to discuss the current development.

The prosecuting jailed 58 suspects in the clashes and detained the woman who was accused of poisoning the protesters last week.

### Al-Akhbar Press Review on Cabinet Events



On the fifth day since the Cabinet events started, clashes continued between protesters and Army forces in Downtown Cairo.

Army forces stormed Tahrir Square at 3am and seized control over the whole area. Protesters hurled stones on the forces, which fired rounds in the air.

Clashes broke out between the two sides at the entrances of Talaat Harb and Tahrir streets as well as Abdel-Moneim Riyad Square.

The three-hour clashes left dozens injured. It is said that one protester was killed.

Army and police forces set ablaze a number of tents in Tahrir Square and removed hanging banners.

Protesters broke the floor's piles to use them against security forces. They also damaged part of the wall of the Principal Bank for Development and Agricultural Credit for the same purpose.

In Sheikh Riham Street, protesters attacked a woman after she cursed and accused them of sabotaging the country.

They also assaulted another girl, who asked them to stop clashing with the Army.

Last night's clashes left dozens injured and two dead. Field doctors identified the dead as a university student and a 12-year-old boy.



A group of youth formed vigilante groups to secure the Egyptian Museum in the evening. Several attempts to attack the museum with Molotov cocktails were foiled.

Interior Minister Mohamed Ibrahim urged Central Security officers to exercise self-restraint.

The interior minister inspected the Sheikh Riham Street on Tuesday.

A number of suspects arrested over the Cabinet incidents confessed to receiving cash to sabotage and set fire to public property, Ibrahim said.

Seven people were arrested over the incidents and are under investigation, he added.

Dozens of activists staged a protest outside the Alexandria Criminal Court to condemn the recent violent events of Kasr Al-Aini Street.

They also denounced the court's ruling to postpone the trial of police officers over killing protesters on January 28, known as the Friday of Wrath.

In a statement, the Awqaf Ministry said Islam rejects all forms of vandalism, violence, bloodshed and chaos.

It expressed grave concern over the recent incidents of Sheikh Riham and Kasr Al-Aini streets and called for unity to preserve public property.

The detention of 118 suspects was extended to a further week over their involvement in the recent events outside the Cabinet premises.

Five of the suspects were released.

The military police arrested three protesters in Assiut during a rally staged outside the HQ of the Southern Military Zone.

The paper initially circulated primarily amongst Cairo's intellectual elite, providing objective news coverage in the belief that good news would beat sensationalist reporting found in other Egyptian print media. After 3 years, it was challenging *Al-Ahram* for the status of being the national paper of record. Though
