HEC Head Demands EGP125mn for Elections Supervision



HEC Head appealed to Minister of Finance to pay the amount of EGP125mn due to judges and other court employees, who were assigned to supervise the electoral process, in order to not hinder the flow of the elections. The Ministry, however, provided only EGP25mn.



Ganzouri Meets G8 Ambassadors



Prime Minister Kamal el-Ganzouri met with ambassadors of the Group of 8 (G8) Industrialized Nations.

During a press conference last week, Ganzouri said Egypt has not received any part of the \$35 million pledged by the G8 to help Egypt and Tunisia.

The G8 refers to France, Germany, Italy, Great Britain, Japan, US, Canada and Russia.

Meanwhile, the Arab Monetary Fund offered Egypt a \$270 million loan at a 1.69% interest rate, payable in four years.

State is on the Alert for Mubarak's Trial Tomorrow



Cairo's Criminal Court resumes the trial of ousted president Mubarak, his two sons, former Interior minister, and his aides, tomorrow. The suspects are accused of killing protestors during the events of January 25th revolution.

The trial was suspended for over two months and is resumed after the Court of Appeals refused the request of recusal of the judge assigned the case.

Security Authorities have assigned 5,000 officers and recruits to secure the Police Academy where the trials are held.

Mubarak's Smuggled Money Cannot Be Retrieved



Egyptian financial experts assured that Mubarak's smuggled money is almost impossible to be retrieved as banks may prefer to protect the secrecy of their clients. An action such as returning Mubarak's smuggled money might drive investors away.

Galal El-Nadim, former secretary general of transparency and integrity committee in the Ministry of State for Administrative Development, said that international agreements like the international anti money laundering act will not help the country retrieve Mubarak's smuggled money.

Asala Deputy Chairman on Advisory Council: Unconstitutional



Deputy Chairman of the Asala Party, Mamdouh Ismail, assured that changing the date of the presidential elections is unconstitutional. He described it as an attempt to handcuff the upcoming Parliament which is the only elected legislative authority.

He believes that the Advisory Council is being a parallel parliament, which he attacked fiercely.

Abd El-Moez: 11,000 Judges to Supervise Third Phase of Elections



Head of the HEC, Abd El-Moez Ibrahim, stated that he met with the heads of the preliminary court in the 9 governorates of the third phase of the elections: Menia, Kalyoubia, Dakahlia, North Sinai, South Sinai, El-Wadi El-Geded, Matrouh and Qenna.

Tribalism Dominates the Political Scene in Matrouh



Marsa Matrouh includes one single-member constituency, where candidates compete for 2 parliamentary seats and one multi-member constituency, where parties compete for 4 parliamentary seats.

Tribalism will be an important factor in settling the competition over the individual seats as 68 candidates from different tribes compete.

The competition in the multi-member constituency takes place mostly between FJP and Nour Salafi Party.



Minister of Interior Calls for Reforming the Police



Minister of Interior General Muhammad Ibrahim visited the Central Security Sector, yesterday.

In his speech, Ibrahim stressed the importance of providing the police with the highest degrees of training and efficiencies.

He praised the role of the security forces to protect the nation and preserve its security.

He also said that the police families will be provided with decent care.

General Ibrahim met with police officers and highlighted people's right to freedom of expression and peaceful demonstrations and sit-ins.

He called on the police officers to exhibit self-restraint and use the lowest level of their right to use force to control the situation within the frame of human rights.

Khudairi: SCAF is Null



MP Mahmoud al-Khudairi said that SCAF was not apt to rule.

The injured are shackled to their beds in the hospital in spite of their dangerous injuries.

30 people were transferred from Sayyidah Zaynab police station to the hospital due to serious injuries.

Some of the injured were maltreated by the police.

Director of the hospital said he tried to unshackle the injured in order to splint their broken bones, but the officers refused.

Alaa Abd al-Fattah Released



Activist Alaa Abd al-Fattah was detained over the Maspero incidents.

After 55 days, Abd al-Fattah was released.

He spoke about his experience during the detention.

He said he was detained for five days in the beginning under inhuman conditions.

Then things changed when he was transferred to Torah prison.

Officers at Torah punished any prisoner who spoke to him.

Only the official Egyptian TV was allowed in the prison, and Abd al-Fattah accused the state TV of lying.

His sister used to bring him newspapers every day.

His son, Khalid, was born while he was in Jail. He knew about his son's birth from a message that his sister hid in food with a photo.

Abd al-Fattah asserted that the revolution was continuing.

"The time of peaceful demonstrations has ended; may God give you time," Alaa said addressing Field Marshal Tantawi through al-Tahrir.

Alaa denied all charges pressed against him.

❖ **Al-Ahram: Egyptian state-run official daily newspaper**

Founded in 1875, is the most widely circulating Egyptian daily newspaper, and the second oldest after al-Waqa'i`al-Masriya (English: The Egyptian Events, founded 1828). It is majority owned by the Egyptian government.

❖ **Al-Akhbar: Egyptian state-owned semi-official daily newspaper**

It was founded in May 1952 as a part of Akhbar El Yom.

❖ **Al-Gomhoria: Egyptian state-owned daily newspaper**

An influential state-owned Egyptian Arabic language daily newspaper. It was established in 1954.

❖ **Al-Shorouk: Egyptian daily independent newspaper**

Is a prominent Arabic newspaper published in Egypt U and several other Arabic nations It is a daily independent newspaper, covering mainly politics, militant affairs and sport.

❖ **Al-Masry al-Yom: Independent daily newspaper**

On 7 June 2004, it published its first edition. The paper initially circulated primarily amongst Cairo's intellectual elite, providing objective news coverage in the belief that good news would beat sensationalist reporting found in other Egyptian print media. After 3 years, it was challenging *Al-Ahram* for the status of being the national paper of record. Though
