## Jobs and Loans for the Revolution Victims

## Low Turnout in the Elections to the Shura Council



A low turnout was reported on the first day of the first phase of elections to the Shura Council. It is expected that the voting rate will not exceed 5% in some governorates and 10% in others.

The first phase of the elections to the Shura Council started yesterday in 13 governorates: Cairo, Alexandria, Assiut, Qena, al-Wadi al-Jadid, South Sinai, North Sinai, Munoufiya, Gharbiya, Daqahliya, Damietta, the Red Sea and Fayyoun.

In Qena some judges arrived late, which delayed the votes. Ahmad Talaat reported on “empty” polling stations in and an officer reportedly assaulted one of the polling station employees.

The NGOs’ reports pointed out a positive improvement in the organization and measures taken in the elections.

Violations related to campaigning during the elections were also reported.

Islamists seem to be leading in South Cairo. The Muslim Brotherhood accused the High Judicial Elections Commission of misleading the voters by changing the name of their candidate in South Cairo constituency from Tareq Sayyid to Tare al-Saeid.

### Coptic Leaders Call for Establishing Political Party



Coptic leaders have called for unifying all Egyptian Copts under one political party.

Speaking at a conference by the General Coptic Organization (GCO), Coptic activists urged Pope Shenouda to interrogate bishops who have allegedly called on Copts to vote for the Egyptian Bloc during the People’s Assembly elections.

They expressed anger over the five Coptic MPs in the new parliament, saying they do not represent the Coptic population, especially after rumors spread that a Papal official intervened to have them in the parliament.

The conditions of Copts after the revolution remain unchanged, said GCO President Sherif Dos.

So far, no one was brought to justice regarding the crimes committed against Copts and not a single church was built after the revolution, Dos said.



### Adli's Defense Provides Acquittal Causes to Court



Essam el-Batawi, the lawyer of former interior minister Habib el-Adli, presented the court 15 reasons allegedly to acquit his client from charges pertaining to killing protesters during the January revolution.

Among the reasons was the illegality of procedural measures taken by the public prosecution when it presented the remaining of its investigations to the court, although court proceedings have started.

Adli should not be held accountable for the police officers, who disobeyed his orders regarding his plan to secure the protests, Batawi said.

There is no evidence that Adli has ordered or incited police officers to or was even involved in killing the protesters, the defense lawyer said.

Batawi presented a newspaper, in which it reported that four people were arrested for impersonating as military men. Weapons were found in possession of the four, the paper said.

The lawyer said that on January 28, shops selling military uniform were stormed as well as police stations, where arms were stolen from. These moves were meant to convey a message to protesters that police and military personnel are attacking them, the lawyer argued.

The burning of police stations on January 28 proves that policemen have committed to orders of self-restraint, he said.

### Low Turnout in Shura Council Elections



The first round of the elections of the Shura Council, upper house of parliament, kicked off in 13 governorates on Sunday with a low voter turnout.

The first phase of the Shura Council elections commenced in 13 governorates at 8am Sunday morning, the start of the work week.

About 25 million Egyptians are expected to cast their vote, choosing from among 90 candidates.

The council will have 270 seats of whom 180 would be elected directly while the remaining 90 would be appointed by the head of state for a period of six years.

Shura Council elections will be held in two stages, with the first on 29/30 January and the second on 14/15 February. First-stage runoffs will be held on 7 February and second-stage run-offs on 22 February.

Shura Council elections: Conducted over two stages. Run-off elections are held a week later between front-runners in constituencies where none of the candidates has secured at least 50 per cent of the total vote.

Polling dates: Shura council elections begin on 29 January and end on 22 February.



### MPs: Egyptian Nuclear Program Irreplaceable



Members of the People’s Assembly expressed their full support for the national Egyptian nuclear program and its planned location in Dabaa area, north of Cairo.

During a symposium on Sunday, the MPs underlined the importance of nuclear energy in generating electricity and other peaceful uses on the Egyptian economy.

Experts at the meeting denounced calls to change the location of the planned nuclear establishment from Dabaa to any other area after nearby residents attacked the site.

## Calls to SCAF to Hand over Power



23 political parties and revolutionary coalitions signed on a communiqué in which they denounced referring thousands of political activists to military courts.

They declared that it was dangerous to draft a new constitution under the military rule. It is also dangerous, as they believe, to hold presidential elections supervised by SCAF who is, already, defaming, through the misleading state media, some of the candidates and advocating others.

The signed communiqué addressed the People's Assembly with some demands. On the top of the demands was to form a judicial commission to investigate and lead the trials in the cases related to killing demonstrators since January 2011 until now. There was also a demand to form a commission that will be responsible for all the measures and affairs of the presidential elections. They called for starting the official nominations to the presidential elections on February 11, and holding presidential elections in a maximum time of 60 days, starting the first day of nominations.

The parties also call for forming a commission of NGOs to participate in monitoring the reelections.

## Thousands of Protesters Join Maspero Sit-in



Protesters in the Maspero sit-in were attacked yesterday by dozens of thugs who came from Boulak Abo El-Ela district. Thugs threw glass bottles, rocks and Molotov Cocktails at protesters, which led to the injury of tens of young people. They also smashed some of the cars amid complete absence of police and army forces.

In the afternoon, a group of thugs came from Wekalet El-Balah area and began the attack against protesters. Another group of thugs attacked them again when they reached Abdel Moneim Riyad Square.

Protesters told Al-Tahrir newspaper that their sit-in began on Friday and it was completely peaceful. Eyewitnesses said none of the protesters used violence in any way and thugs attacked them in large numbers and brought down their tents.

When news spread about the attack against Maspero protesters, thousands of protesters rushed to the place to support them and prevent another attack from happening.

Maspero protesters insisted on continuing their sit-in until their demands are achieved, which include; immediate handover of power to civilians, holding presidential elections before drafting the new constitution, and a purge of state media from corrupt figures of the former regime.

### March to the Parliament to Demand Revolutionary Trials



Tahrir Square was calm yesterday after 24 political parties and movements, including April 6 and Youth for Justice and Freedom, announced suspending their sit-in and removed their stages from the square.

Only tens of protesters continued their sit-in in Tahrir Square from the families of martyrs and victims of the revolution.

Hundreds of protesters still appear in the square during the day to confirm the continuance of protests and revive the "Revolution Continues" week.

Hundreds of activists marched from Tahrir Square to the Public Prosecutor's office to demand freeing political activist Ahmed Douma who is accused of acts of violence in the cabinet headquarters clashes. Young protesters confirmed that the imprisonment of Ahmed Douma is evidence that SCAF does not want to make any concessions by freeing political prisoners.

Young revolutionary movements disseminated a statement in Tahrir Square calling for opening the door for presidential elections on February 11; the day in which Mubarak was overthrown last year. The statement demanded forming a committee from the People's Assembly to oversee presidential elections in addition to civil society organizations and youth movements.

Kefaya movement said they will participate in the calls for protests on Tuesday and they will march to the People's Assembly to demand the MPs to issue legislations that allow special revolutionary trials for former regime figures.

## Shoura Council Elections



In the Shoura Council elections, judges, ballot boxes and phosphorous ink appeared while voters did not appear.

Parties and independent candidates are competing for 12 seats in Cairo out of 260 seats of the Shoura Council. Most polling stations started late amid heavy security presence. The first constituency in Cairo witnessed a low voter turnout. Coptic Christians refrained from voting due to the withdrawal of the Egyptian Bloc from the elections while supporters of the FJP and Al-Nour appeared in front of polling stations.

In other governorates, polling stations were completely calm as few numbers of voters appeared on the first day of the first phase of the Shoura Council elections. Supporters of the FJP tried to urge people to vote by disseminating campaign flyers for their candidates.

The High Elections Commission decided to suspend elections in Al-Menoufia governorate and hold re-runs on February 6-7 as a response to the Administrative Court's decision to include the list of Egypt's National Party.

Senior Judge Hisham Abd Al-Aziz, member of the technical office of the HEC, said it is early to say that voter turnout was low in all districts. "We still have more than 17 hours to evaluate voter turnout," he said.

Informed sources told Al-Tahrir newspaper that voter turnout in the Shoura Council elections will not exceed 40%. This is due to the fact that voters focus on People's Assembly more than the Shoura Council, in addition to the wave of protests that distracted them from participating in the elections.

**Maikel Nabil: My Position from Israel is Similar to Sadat's**



Maikel Nabil, political activist and the first political prisoner since the January 25 revolution, said he is eager, along with all the revolutionaries, to put an end to the July military regime ruling the country. He said protesters demand an end to military trials for civilians and abolishing laws that restrict freedom of speech and opinion.

“Prison is a harsh experience. I did not wish to go to prison and no one will benefit from imprisonment and violation of his freedom. I am an atheist and no one can force me to adopt any belief. Beliefs and religions are a personal matter and it is up for each person to decide what to adopt or follow,” Nabil said.

Nabil also said he does not defend any violations committed by Israel nor the Israeli occupation; however, he supports peaceful coexistence between all the peoples and a peaceful resolution of the conflict. “The Egyptian people voted during the parliamentary elections for political parties that agree on peaceful accords with Israel (MBs and Salafis) and reassured Carter of their support to the Egypt-Israel Peace Treaty, so why do they accuse me of treason?” Nabil added.

### The January 25 Missing



Many of the families of young people who were missing during the January 25 revolution are still looking for answers to put an end for their suffering.

“Are all the ministries, military institutions and security apparatuses unable to give me answers and put an end for the suffering in which I am living since my son disappeared?” said Om Moussa, one of the mothers of the missing young people.

Many Egyptian families condemn the complete negligence of responsible authorities for their pursuits to find their children. “Why did the Ministry of Health remove 75 unknown dead bodies from the lists of the revolution’s martyrs? Why did the Ministry of Interior steal ID cards from martyrs who died in Tahrir Square?” asked members of the families of those missing.

### Voters Apathetic As Shura Elections Begins



Shura elections started yesterday in 13 governorates. Substation Heads closed the polling stations yesterday at 7pm. The first day of the polling witnessed a very low turnout compared to the turnout of People’s Assembly elections.

There were publicity violations in front of the stations. The same violations of PA polling continued in the Shura elections. However, the HEC received a limited number of complaints regarding opening the stations late. In some governorates, the stations were opened two hours late.

The HEC decided yesterday to suspend polling in the multi-member constituencies in Qena and Menfouia. Reruns should be held on February 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup>. This was after the Administrative Court ruling that Freedom Party slate should be added to Qena slates and National Egypt Party slate should be added to Menoufia slates.

In Alexandria, a number of candidates filed complaints against the HEC after the commission changed their numbers and electoral characteristics in the ballot papers. This jeopardizes the elections.

The Parliamentary committee of Wafd party has decided to enter the elections for the Specialized Committees in the People’s Assembly in coordination with the political forces inside the parliament.

28 diplomatic pouches arrived to Cairo’s Airport yesterday from a number of Egyptian embassies and consulates abroad in the first phase of the Shura elections.

There is a widespread video of protestors in front of Maspero building cursing at Military Police soldiers to provoke them. This behavior is totally unacceptable. Such behaviors force the people to hate our demonstrations. We should all focus on peaceful and legitimate protesting.

The Egyptian Association for National Responsibility evaluated the first parliamentary session. This Association was established by the number of Parties like Al-Nour, Al-Wasat, Free Egyptians, Construction and Development, and Reformation and Development, in addition to a number of independent PA members like Amr Hamzawy, Judge Mahmoud El-Khodeiry, Mostafa El-Naggar and Mostafa Hegazy. The evaluation result was only 55% positive.

We asked our members yesterday if they have any means of communication with their PA representatives. 81% have no way to communicate with them.

What does democracy mean? It means that when 14million Egyptians approve that the president be elected before the constitution, and he must choose a vice president within 60 years of elections, then this is what should happen. It is unacceptable that 19 only (the SCAF members) change the roadmap of the transitional period then we should protest.

### Egyptian Cabinet

Compensating revolution martyrs families will end within the next 48 hours then will start to rehabilitate the injured and appoint them at jobs.

### ❖ **Al-Akhbar: Egyptian state-owned semi-official daily newspaper**

It was founded in May [1952](#) as a part of [Akhbar El Yom](#).

### ❖ **Al-Gomhoria: Egyptian state-owned daily newspaper**

An influential state-owned [Egyptian Arabic language](#) daily [newspaper](#). It was established in 1954.

### ❖ **Al-Shorouk: Egyptian daily independent newspaper**

Is a prominent Arabic newspaper published in Egypt [\[1\]](#) and several other Arabic nations It is a daily independent newspaper, covering mainly politics, militant affairs and sport.

### ❖ **Al-Masry al-Yom: Independent daily newspaper**

On 7 June 2004, it published its first edition. The paper initially circulated primarily amongst Cairo's intellectual elite, providing objective news coverage in the belief that good news would beat sensationalist reporting found in other Egyptian print media. After 3 years, it was challenging *Al-Ahram* for the status of being the national paper of record. Though
