NGOs and Clashes between the Government and Civil Society



Amidst the current crisis of NGOs in Egypt the American Administration expressed its hopes to achieve a soon solution for the problem of the American nationals involved in NGOs illegal activities in Egypt.

In a related context, the Advisory Council discussed yesterday Dr. Abd al-Aziz Hijazi's report about the NGOs. He stressed the importance of legalizing the NGOs activities and prohibiting suspicious funds even if that indicated dispensing with the US AID.

MP Amr Hamzawi, member of the Human Rights Committee at the People's Assembly uncovered a dominating tendency to reject the draft law of NGOs that had been presented by the government because it allegedly restricted the freedom of NGOs. Hamzawi said the Human rights Committee would present a new draft law that would guarantee the freedom and reduce the government's authority that can restrict the freedom of NGOs. The law will also demand NGOs to work legally and clearly and uncover the sources of their funds. NGOs will also be demanded to proclaim their activities and separate between the social and political activities.

On the American part, US Secretary of State Hilary Clinton expressed her hope to find a soon solution for the problem between Cairo and Washington concerning the trial of the American nationals who are facing charges of practicing illegal activities in Egypt through NGOs.

Senator John McCain had earlier expressed the United States' adherence to the strategic partnership with Egypt.

Egypt's Former Ambassador to the United States Nabil Fahmi said the problem with the United States preceded the Jan 25 revolution, adding that there was a blunt American indifference towards the Egyptian laws by supporting the illegal functions of NGOs in a way that violates the agreement signed between the two countries in this response in 2005.

PA Legislative Affairs Committee Discusses Presidential Elections Law



Article 28 of the constitutional declaration continues to raise controversy. The Article gives immunity to all decisions issued by the Judicial Committee and prevents challenging them.

The PA's Legislative and Constitutional Affairs Committee approved amendments presented by MPs Mohamed El-Omda, Gamal Hanafy, and Hatem Azzam on articles 30 and 38 of the Presidential Elections Law.

Article 30, after amendments, states that the vote counting process and announcing results should take place immediately inside substations with the presence of representative of candidate and civil society organizations. The results are to be handed to the head of the polling station with a letter signed by the substation head.

The Committee's meeting witnessed heated altercations while discussing Article 28, as a number of MPs believed this article should be amended rather than the Presidential Elections Law.

University Students' March



Yesterday, hundreds of Cairo university students staged a march from Cairo University to the People’s Assembly headquarters marking the National Student Day. They were protesting SCAF rule and called for an immediate end to the Military rule.

The National Student Day marks the terrible Abbas bridge incident when hundreds of students were protesting British occupation on the moveable bridge and Mahmoud Fahmy, then Interior Minister, ordered to open the bridge causing the death of 23 university students.

A number of student political movements participated in the march in addition to socialist students. Some students held symbolic red cards for the Military Council with banners that read “Return to Your Barracks.” They also held pictures of Port Said victims.

Ain Shams university students also held a protest inside the university campus then joined the Cairo University march.

Protestors were against drafting the constitution and holding presidential elections under military rule. Participants in the march had a number of demands that included the immediate release of university student detainees and a student representative inside the Constituent Assembly.

McCain Meets Khairat Al-Shater



US Senator John McCain, Chairman of the International Republican Institute, has met with the strong man of the Muslim Brotherhood Khairat Al-Shater, MB Deputy Supreme Guide. The visit lasted nearly an hour at Al-Shater's office and it coincided with the Public Prosecutor's decision to end the reservation on his funds.

McCain showed interest in this meeting and wrote on Twitter: "I had a thoughtful conversation this afternoon with Khairat Al-Shater, a key leader in the Muslim Brotherhood."

"I held a meeting with Head of the Supreme Council of Armed Forces Mohamed Hussein Tantawi, Speaker of the People's Assembly Saad El-Katatni, and newly-elected Members of the Parliament, and invited them to visit the Congress soon."

Informed sources in the Muslim Brotherhood said McCain reassured Al-Shater and told him that Republicans were mistaken in the way they dealt with Islamists during the Mubarak regime. McCain confirmed that Republicans will re-consider their view of Islamist groups and parties, sources said.

According to these sources, Al-Shater told McCain that the MB will remain committed to the international treaties and they consider the relations with US important. "The Muslim Brotherhood is not a scarecrow and we are reaching out to the international community," Al-Shater said.

Court Decision Threatens Parliament’s Validity



Al-Tahrir knew from senior judicial sources that the Supreme Administrative Court has sent the case file to the Supreme Constitutional Court to reach a final decision regarding the invalidation of the results of parliamentary elections.

The source, who preferred not to be named, said that despite of the fact that the Supreme Administrative Court’s decision is not final, the court, headed by Senior Judge Abdallah Abu El-Ezz, treated the decision as final and postponed the implementation of the decision until the Supreme Administrative Court issues a binding decision, which cannot be appealed.

Reactions of legal experts varied on this issue. Senior Judge Mohamed Amin Al-Mahdi, former head of State Council, explained that the Administrative Court’s decision relied on legal principles established by the decisions issued by the Supreme Constitutional Court in 1990 and 1995 that invalidated single-member constituencies because they violate the principle of equal opportunities. He explained that if the Supreme Constitutional Court supported the Supreme Administrative Court’s decision, then the parliament would be dissolved and new elections will be held based on the party-lists system. The other alternative would be to cancel the results of two-thirds of the parliament, who were elected according to the system of single-member constituencies, and hold re-elections in these constituencies.

Senior Judge Adel Farghali, Head of the Administrative Judicial Courts, confirmed that it is impossible, realistically speaking, to invalidate the entire parliament but the Supreme Constitutional Court can adjourn the case for two years or more and avoid taking a final decision.

Dr. Mohamed Hassan, Vice President of State Council, said, “If the Supreme Constitutional Court supported the decision, then the People’s Assembly will be dissolved and new elections will be held as if the assembly was not formed. Additionally, all legislations and decisions taken by the People’s Assembly will be considered as invalid.”

FJP Criticizes El-Ganzouri's Government, Refuses IMF Loans

SCAF Will Not Take Legal Action against MP



The Supreme Council of the Armed Forces (SCAF) sent a letter to the People’s Assembly notifying it that it would not pursue legal action against MP Ziyad el-Alimi.

Alimi, who was taking part in a march in Port Said on Friday, told a crowd that the recent incidents in Egypt were masterminded by someone who wants to divide the country. Those events add to the long list of crimes perpetrated by SCAF, Alimi said.

To add insult to injury, Alimi said “I don’t understand why are we standing idle against the criminal, why are we leaving the ‘donkey’ do whatever he wants and focus instead on his ‘saddle’”. He went on wittily “and we all know who that donkey is.”

In the letter, SCAF said it would await the results of the parliament’s measures taken against the MP.

Arabi Supporters to Stage Rally Next Week



Arab League Secretary General Nabil el-Arabi has denied news reports that he was planning to contend in the coming presidential elections. However, a group of youths will organize a rally outside the Arab League premises next week to urge Arabi to reconsider his position.

The coordinator of “Arabi for president” campaign on Facebook, Wael Eweiss, said he, along of other youths, had met Arabi two times in the latter’s office.

The first, held in August, Arabi vehemently rejected the idea of running for president. He, however, seemed more inclined in the second meeting that took place in September on condition that they make sure he was popular among the populace, Eweiss.

Eweiss said he contacted several parties, including Al-Wafd, and Freedom and Justice, and they seemed fine with the notion of Arabi’s nomination.

Arabi was then enraged by the criticism heaped against him after rumors surfaced about his presidential nomination and rejected to have meetings with Eweiss.

Freedom and Justice Party Presses Egypt to Submit Draft UN Resolution to Stop Bashar Massacres against Syrian People

The Freedom and Justice Party hailed the Egyptian Foreign Ministry response to its call for withdrawal of the Egyptian Ambassador from Damascus after the brutal massacres committed by the Assad regime against the great Syrian people.



The FJP asserted that, "This step is great; but it takes bigger strides to stop this bloody aggression against the unarmed Syrian people, through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs presenting a draft resolution to the General Assembly of the United Nations to take definite action to stop these massacres, impose sanctions on the Syrian regime, not the Syrian people, and double all pressure options to prevent the continuous bloodshed against innocent and defenseless citizens".

In its 'Views & Reviews' on Monday, the FJP called on the Egyptian Foreign Ministry to work through the international environment to mobilize and extend the circle of support for the struggle of the Syrian people and to counter any actions by countries supporting the bloody Syrian regime under any pretext, banner or justification.

The FJP urged countries of the world, particularly China and Russia, to shoulder their human and moral responsibilities towards the ongoing murder of innocent civilians under the nose of the international community which does not want the Arab peoples to get rid of their tyrannical dictatorships.

Freedom and Justice Party Rejects Gaza Blockade; Demands Protection for Muslim, Christian Holy Sites in Jerusalem

The Freedom and Justice Party denounced continued injustice, siege and atrocities committed against the people of the Gaza Strip, despite the ousting of the oppressive previous regime, including the unjust blockade which tells the world that Egypt's foreign policies have not changed.

The FJP urged competent authorities for immediate action to end the blockade and to provide the requirements for the return of electricity to the people of Gaza.

Further, the FJP expressed concern about international silence towards the continued Zionist attacks and attempts to deface Al-Aqsa Mosque, and the expansion of projects aimed at doubling settlements in the Holy City of Jerusalem with the purpose of Judaizing the city and obliterating its Arab and Islamic identity.

The FJP also condemned the racist decision of the Israeli Knesset to conduct a plebiscite before any withdrawal from Jerusalem, as well as the systematic violations of rights of Jerusalem Arabs, by demolishing their houses, deporting them and seizing their lands.

Furthermore, the FJP demanded that the international community, in particular the UNESCO, to take urgent action to stop these attacks and violations, and to put an end to the Judaization of Jerusalem.

The party also urged Arab and Muslim governments to work in earnest for the protection



of Muslim and Christian holy places in the occupied territories.

It also called for the Arab peoples to support Al-Aqsa Mosque in all available ways, in defense of the first Qiblah and the third most important of Islam's Holy Mosques.

Founded in 1875, is the most widely circulating Egyptian daily newspaper, and the second oldest after al-Waqa'i`al-Masriya (English: The Egyptian Events, founded 1828). It is majority owned by the Egyptian government.

❖ **Al-Akhbar: Egyptian state-owned semi-official daily newspaper**

It was founded in May 1952 as a part of Akhbar El Yom.

❖ **Al-Gomhoria: Egyptian state-owned daily newspaper**

An influential state-owned Egyptian Arabic language daily newspaper. It was established in 1954.

❖ **Al-Shorouk: Egyptian daily independent newspaper**

Is a prominent Arabic newspaper published in Egypt U and several other Arabic nations It is a daily independent newspaper, covering mainly politics, militant affairs and sport.

❖ **Al-Masry al-Yom: Independent daily newspaper**

On 7 June 2004, it published its first edition. The paper initially circulated primarily amongst Cairo's intellectual elite, providing objective news coverage in the belief that good news would beat sensationalist reporting found in other Egyptian print media.
