### Political Players Reject a Freedom and Justice Suggestion



The Freedom and Justice Party’s suggestions about the constituent commission were faced by a barrage of criticism. Different political players in Egypt rejected the Freedom and Justice Party’s rejection to the form the constituent commission from 40 MPs, 30 other members chosen by the Parliament and 30 members chosen by the different syndicates, unions and the Azhar.

### The Trap of Foreign Funds



Al-Ahram published a lengthy full page report on what it called the “trap of NGOs.”

## Symbolic Stand by April 6 Movement to Demand Release of Ramzi



Tens of April 6 activists organized a symbolic stand in front of the High Court of Justice to demand the release of George Ramzi, political activist and member of the movement, who was arrested and imprisoned pending investigations.

Hassan Al-Dahan, coordinator of the movement in Cairo, said Ramzi was arrested when he was trying to put an end to the clashes that took place between security forces and revolutionaries near the Ministry of Interior.

According to Al-Dahan, Ramzi was arrested during these events and is now facing charges of destroying public properties, attacking policemen and attempts to break into the MOI headquarters.

## Former Regime Supporters Incite People to Use Violence against Revolutionary Figures



Supporters of the ousted Mubarak’s regime continue to threaten revolutionary figures and writers.

One of them known as “Ahmed Spider” sent a recorded message to Mohamed Fathi, a novelist, accusing him of spreading ideas of sabotage and chaos. Fathi said the message included a threat to kill him and that Spider called on Egyptians to hand him in to the army whenever they see him on the streets.

## Amr Moussa: New President will Come to Power through Egyptian Votes



Amr Moussa, potential presidential candidates, expressed his concerns over the gradual loss of the revolution's achievements. He said he hopes that Egypt regains its leading position in the Arab world. He accused figures of the former regime of falling short from taking the right action in major events the country has faced, such as the Gaza siege and Arab divisions.

In a press conference held in Sharm Al-Sheikh, Moussa confirmed that the new president will come to power through votes of Egyptians. Presidency will not be a privilege for the new president, but he will work hard to rebuild the country, he said.

### MB: Attacks against Public Figures are Planned



Head of the Freedom and Justice Party Dr. Mohamed Morsi, political wing of the Muslim Brotherhood, said the attacks against Dr. Abdel Moneim Aboul Fotouh and Dr. Hassan Al-Brins prove that there is a security failure, which can lead the country to fall into violence.

Thus, according to him, the process of purging the Ministry of Interior from corrupt figures must be carried out as soon as possible. It must be restructured in order to restore security to the Egyptian street.

Morsi blamed the security apparatus for the two accidents. He also requested that the Minister of Interior initiates a purge of his ministry and relies on decent policemen to reform the security apparatus.

MP Mohamed El-Beltagi confirmed that the Ministry of Interior is responsible for the armed attacks against Aboul Fotouh and Al-Brins, whether they had a criminal or political nature. "Thugs have gained more power and are becoming active amid the negativity of the security forces, which sometimes cover up for them," Al-Beltagi said.

Dr. Essam Al-Erian, Deputy Head of the FJP, said the continuous attacks against political figures indicate there are attempts made by some to hinder real change and power handover in the country.

### **Sufis Reach Reconciliation, Demand to be Involved in Drafting Constitution**



Sheikhs of Sufi orders held a general assembly yesterday, headed by Dr. Abd Al-Hadi Al-Qasabi, current Sheikh of the Supreme Sufi Council, at the headquarters of the council. They resolved the disagreements and decided to waive lawsuits they previously filed against each other. Sheikhs who were opposing Al-Qasabi decided to end their sit-in, which lasted for 10 months in the headquarters of the Supreme Sufi Council.

Sheikh Abu Al-Azayem, head of the Azmeya order and head of the Sufi Reform Front, announced that he will waive all the lawsuits he filed against Al-Aqasabi to put an end to the disagreements between Sufi orders.

Al-Azayem said the future of Sufi orders faces serious dangers after the emergence of Islamist forces, which are against Sufism and which dominate the politics of the country now.

Al-Qasabi confirmed that the general assembly agreed to send a request to the Supreme Council of Armed Forces to demand participating in the Constituent Assembly, which will draft the new constitution, in order to represent 15 million Sufis.

### **100-Member Committee Endorses Aboul-Fotouh**

A committee that includes 100 public figures starts its meetings today to agree over one presidential candidate to endorse.

Shorouk maintains that the committee plans on choosing Abd El-Moneim Aboul-Fotouh to endorse as a presidential candidate for revolutionary and national forces. The committee might even try convincing Hamdeen El-Sabahy to run as his vice president.

The committee includes 100 outspoken opposers of the previous regime. It includes Former MB Spokesperson, Kamal El-Helbawy, Mohamed Ghonim, Political Sciences Professor Seif Abd El-Fattah and political activist Sameer Eleish amongst other.

In case El-Sabahy agreed to run as vice president, the committee would try discouraging other potential candidates from running for presidency, in order not to fragment votes.

### Judicial Commission Discusses Expatriate Voting



Sources in the Supreme Judicial Elections Commission assured that any amendments to the Presidential Elections Law to be approved by the People's Assembly should be referred to the Supreme Constitutional Court to be revised.

The Commission shall continue working according to the current law until amending Articles 30, 38. The Commission added that amending any article other than article 28 would change the voting procedures but would not affect the date.

Within hours, the commission will hold a meeting with the Judge Farouk Sultan, head of the Supreme Constitutional Court to discuss the dates of expatriate voting and the vote counting process.

### Advisory Council Approves Article 28

وقد دعا المجلس الاستشاري خلال اجتماعه اليوم إلى توفير المادة 28 من الإعلان الدستوري والخامسة بقرارات لجنة التعديلات الرئاسية العليا وتحسينها من الطعن على قراراتها، وذلك لأن اللجنة مشكلة من شيوخ وكبار الأعضاء برئاسة رئيس المحكمة الدستورية العليا، وذلك خوفا من أن يؤدي ذلك إلى التخليط في الوسط القضائي إذ تم الطعن على القرارات أمام قضاة أصغر منهم، رفضت بعد البرضى محامى المتهمين بإسقاط تسمية القضية «التمويل الأجنبي»، حيث لم يثبت التمويل على منظمات المجتمع المدني.

## HEC Announces Final Results of Shura Council Elections



The High Elections Commission (HEC) announced the final results of the Shura Council elections as follow:

The Freedom and Justice Party (FJP): 105 seats. (58.3%)

Al-Nour: 45 seats. (25%)

Al-Wafd Party: 14 seats. (7.7%)

The Egyptian Bloc: 8 seats. (4.44%)

Independent candidates: 4 seats. (2.2%)

The Freedom Party: 3 seats. (1.6%)

The Democratic Peace Party: 1 seat. (0.55%)

HEC Chairman Abdel-Moez Ibrahim said 6,446,689 votes were cast during the polls or 12.9% of the voters.
