Presidential Race Begins Today amid Fears of 'Hidden Plots'

سباق الرئاسة يبدأ اليوم وسط مخاوف المرشحين من « مؤامرات خفية »

The Presidential Elections Commission, headed by Senior Judge Farouk Soltan, announced today that it will receive candidacy applications starting from today until April . The last few hours that preceded the announcement of the commission was full of statements reflecting the concerns of some potential presidential candidate over the course of elections. Some candidates expressed their concern over the possibility of "hidden plots" designed to cripple presidential elections. They also referred to possible pressures exerted on some politicians or deals between SCAF and political parties to support a certain presidential candidate.

Disagreements mounted among members of Al-Wafd Party after the decision of the party's supreme board to support Mansour Hassan, head of the military's Advisory Council. Senior Judge Bahei Al-Din Abou Shouka, deputy head of Al-Wafd Party, denied receiving any calls from Lieutenant General Sami Anan, Chief of Staff and Deputy Head of SCAF, asking the party to back a certain candidate.

The people responsible for the campaign demanding Omar Suleiman, former chief of General Intelligence, to run for presidency said that Suleiman might officially announce his decision to run for presidency within the coming hours.

The Presidential Elections Commission decided the maximum limit set for presidential campaigns will be EGP10 million from the candidate's personal assets or the donations of a party or groups. The commission banned receiving money for campaigns from any external institution or international organization.



Ministry of Foreign Affairs called on Egyptian expatriates to register their names until April 4 to be able to vote during the coming elections. Amr Roshdi, spokesman for the ministry, said that nearly 20.000 citizens have registered themselves within the past few days, in addition to 356.000 who already registered during the parliamentary elections.

Disagreements among Judges over the NGOs Case



Disagreements appeared again among judges on organizing protests in front of courthouses to demand revealing judicial procedures taken in the NGOs case and the decision to allow US suspects to return to their country before their trial is complete.

Some judges stressed the importance of organizing these protests, while others refused because they harm the image of the judicial authority.

A number of judges organized a silent stand in Alexandria in front of their Judges' Club condemning what they described as an "interference with the course of justice."

Meanwhile, dozens of protesters demonstrated in front of the US embassy in Cairo demanding the expulsion of US ambassador. They heavily condemned the decision to allow US suspects, facing charges in the NGOs case, to travel back to their country.



Split between MB Youth over Support Given to Presidential Candidates

فجرت الأنباء التي توردت مؤخراً عن دعم جماعة الإخوان المسلمين ترشح منصور حسن بوزار الشقاق بين شباب الجماعة، فيما أكد حزب الحرية والعدالة، التزاه السياسي للجماعة، عدم استقرارها حتى الآن على دعم أي مرشح محتمل.

قالت مصادر من داخل الإخوان إنه تم تكليف فريق مشترك من الجماعة وحزب الحرية والعدالة للتحرك السريع والتفكير لاحتواء أي الشقاق في صفوف الجماعة، عقب ما تردد عن تأييدها ترشح «حسن» وأضحت أن هناك إشارات واضحة رسمتها الجماعة حول وجود انشقاقات بين الشباب الذين يؤيدون ترشح الدكتور عبدالمنعم أبو الفتوح، وأن الجماعة تتخوف من تعميق هذه الخلافات، خاصة قبل

إعلان موقفها من المرشحين المحتملين بشكل رسمي.

وتابعت المصادر أن الجماعة تستخدم موقفاً على ضوء قياس مختلف الجهات الشارع المصري حول المرشحين لكن منصور حسن هو الأقرب إلى تأييدها، في ظل ميل عدة قيادات داخل الإخوان إلى ترشيح «حسن» والاعتد أن الفريق الذي يعيّل إلى دعم «حسن» يستند إلى عدة اعتبارات منها شخصيته التي تحظى بالاحترام والتوازن والسواء الأفق فضلاً عن استقلاليتيه وخبرته وعدم ارتطابه بنظام الحكم السابق، وكثفت المصادر عن أن الفريق المكلف باحتواء الانشقاق يضم أعضاء بارزين في البرلمان، في مقدمتهم الدكتور أسامة ياسين، رئيس لجنة الشباب بمجلس الشعب، والدكتور ياسر علي وأخرون.

من جانبه، قال حزب الحرية والعدالة إنه سيجدد موقفه من المرشحين للرئاسة عقب انتهاء الترشيدات، وبعد استعراض أسامة

وموافق ويراجع جميع المرشحين في القائمة النهائية.

في السبيل نفسه، اقترح المهندس حسن الشيبوشي، عضو الأمانة العامة للحزب القيادي بالجماعة، إجراء انتخابات داخل الإخوان حول المرشح الذي ستصنعه الجماعة.

وقال الشيبوشي، في المسرى اليوم، إنه سيتم اليوم اقتراحاً إلى الأمانة العامة للحزب يتضمن إجراء الانتخابات داخل لجان بلديات قروية، ويحت إشراف مراقبين لضمان إجراء الانتخابات داخل لجان بلديات بعيداً عن التلاعب على حد قوله، وأضاف أنه بحسب الاقتراح الذي وافق عليه عدد من قيادات الجماعة والحزب ستبقى الانتخابات الداخلية تحت الرقابة المحلية وبمقتضى النزاهة، حتى يتحقق الغرض منها وهو إختيار المرشحين وفق رغبة الأعضاء، حتى تكون النتيجة عمرة أعماماً عن مواقفهم من المرشحين.

News spread about a possible decision of the Muslim Brotherhood to support Mansour Hassan, head of the military's Advisory Council, for presidency. Signs of a possible split between MB youth started to appear, while the Freedom and Justice Party confirmed that they have not yet reached a decision on their preferred presidential candidate.

Sources within the Muslim Brotherhood mentioned that a joint committee was formed from the members of the MB and the FJP in order to contain any possible splits in the two bodies.

Clear signs of split started to appear among the MB youth, who largely support Abd Al-Moneim Aboul Fotouh, over the decision to support a certain presidential candidate.

Sources confirmed that the MB will soon determine the choice of their preferred presidential candidate, however, Mansour Hassan is the most likely to receive MB leaders' support.

Hundreds Denounce Release of US Suspects



A few hundred protesters came to Tahrir Square to participate in the demonstrations titled "Imposing General Will." Protesters chanted slogans against the decision to release US suspects facing charges in the case of NGOs, which receive foreign funds, while holding tens of Egyptians in prison pending investigations.

Protesters also condemned placing dozens of political activists in prison over opinion-related case at a time in which Mubarak and his cronies have not received any deterring sentence for a trial which lasted more than 11 months.

Sheikh Goma Mohamed Ali, Friday preacher, called on protesters to unite under the newly-formed Revolutionary Command Council because unity is critical for the continuation of the revolution.

Tawfik Okasha, a TV presenter, almost caused a new catastrophe near Tahrir Square. He gathered around 2000 of his supporters in a demonstration in front of the US embassy to demand the expulsion of US ambassador. Clashes erupted between Tahrir protesters and Okasha's supporters for over an hour and army troops were able to gain control over the area and provide an exit to Okasha's supporters. Okasha repeatedly accused Tahrir protesters of being foreign agents and of receiving funds from Zionist organizations.

Media Figures Demand Constitutional Guarantees to Ensure Freedom of Information



Political forces and movements, syndicates and civil society organizations demanded adding an article in the coming constitution that guarantees freedom of information and prevents referring civilians to military prosecution.

These calls appeared after a fierce attack against media and political figures supporting the revolution took place. Around 12 of them were referred to military prosecution after hundreds of complaints were filed against them.

These groups also rejected the possibility of a single political faction monopolizing the political scene and the drafting of the new constitution. They expressed their concern over the desire of Islamists to restrain freedom of expression and opinion. They also demanded that media figures participate in drafting the constitution to ensure the provisions related to the freedom of information and expression.

Al-Zend: Anyone against SCAF is a Traitor



A conference was held yesterday at the Judges' Club in Cairo to discuss the circumstances and conditions which surrounded the NGOs case and the illegal decision to lift the travel ban imposed on US suspects. The meeting also discussed the representation of judges in the Constituent Assembly and ways to prevent the interference of executive authority in the work of the judicial system.

The meeting was closed and all media representatives were not allowed to attend, based on the orders of the Head of the Judges Club Senior Judge Ahmed Al-Zend.

Al-Zend described all those who criticize the Supreme Council of Armed Forces of being traitors because SCAF represents "the shield that protects the country from disintegration."

Al-Zend explained that he fully supports the January 25 revolution, however, "there are members in the April 6 and Kefaya movements who insult and undermine judges and those are the ones who should be considered traitors."

He denied any connections with the former political regime and confirmed that he gained his position as a result of his personal achievements and success.

Akef: MB Do Not Have the Right to Cancel Camp David Accord



Mohamed Mahdi Akef, former supreme guide of the Muslim Brotherhood, confirmed that the Freedom and Justice Party rejects the terms of the Camp David Accord with Israel; however, the MB does not have the right to cancel the accord now.

He stressed that international accords should be examined by the People's Assembly and this legislative body is the only authority with powers to alter or cancel treaties with other countries. He also confirmed that Egypt respects all signed treaties and accords and that the Muslim Brotherhood does not have the right to unilaterally reject them.

"The term Israel does not exist in the Muslim Brotherhood's dictionary. The MB views Israelis as a group of thugs who seized Arab lands. The only way to confront them is by resistance until they leave our lands. When the Palestinian state exists, they can live as part of it," said Akef.

Majority Reconsiders Decision to Withdraw Confidence from El-Ganzouri's Government



The Freedom and Justice Party, political wing of the Muslim Brotherhood, backed down from their decision to withdraw confidence from Dr. Kamal El-Ganzouri's government.

"Appointing a new government which enjoys the support of the majority of the parliament is now an urgent matter. It should give a message of hope to all those who wish to see our country advance," said a statement issued by the FJP on Thursday. The statement also confirmed that the FJP is willing to cooperate with political forces to form a coalition government.

Sources close to the MB said that extensive talks took place during the past two days to contain the proposal of withdrawing confidence from El-Ganzouri's government. Sources suggest that the change of positions is due to pressures by SCAF. MB leaders have received telephone calls from SCAF generals asking them to wait before taking actual measures to withdraw confidence from government, sources suggest.

FJP Deputy Head Dr. Essam Al-Erian confirmed there is no contradiction in the positions of his party before and after the meeting of the party's executive committee. He said that the party's official position is fully explained in the statement.

It was founded in May [1952](#) as a part of [Akhbar El Yom](#).

❖ **Al-Gomhoria: Egyptian state-owned daily newspaper**

An influential state-owned [Egyptian Arabic language](#) daily [newspaper](#). It was established in 1954.

❖ **Al-Shorouk: Egyptian daily independent newspaper**

Is a prominent Arabic newspaper published in Egypt [\[1\]](#) and several other Arabic nations It is a daily independent newspaper, covering mainly politics, militant affairs and sport.

❖ **Al-Masry al-Yom: Independent daily newspaper**

On 7 June 2004, it published its first edition. The paper initially circulated primarily amongst Cairo's intellectual elite, providing objective news coverage in the belief that good news would beat sensationalist reporting found in other Egyptian print media.
