Presidential Candidates' Demands Discussed Today

Headed by Judge Farouq Sulatan, the High Presidential Elections Commission called the 13 presidential candidates for a meeting today to inform them about all the procedures and preparations that the commission had taken to hold the presidential elections on time and also to listen to their suggestions and solve any potential problems they might face and realize their demands in the measures of possible.

Judge Hatim Bagato, general secretary of the commission declared that expatriate Egyptians would start voting on Friday for seven days. The elections will be by the national number and a secret code.

Bagato said the number of eligible expatriate voters was 565 thousands and 87 voters. 355 thousands of them had already been registered for the parliamentary elections.

Bagato also said vote counting would be done on the polling stations to guarantee transparency. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs will hand the results to the High Presidential Elections Commission to count it with the elections results in Egypt.

In a related context, Head of the Judge Club Ahmad al-Zind said the club would form an operation room to observe the elections and deal with any problems that might face the observing judges. He added that 15 thousand judges, spread on all polling stations, would monitor the elections.

Meanwhile, Presidential Candidate Abd al-Munim Abu al-Futouh attacked the Muslim Brotherhood, stating that it was not a legal entity. Abu al-Futouh called to separate between the Muslim Brotherhood and its political wing the Freedom and Justice Party.

Another presidential candidate, Amr Mussa, stressed in a press conference Egypt's compelling need to resist all the attempts to spread disorder and sow sedition to create disorder in the country.

Suggested Standards for the Constituent Assembly



The legislative committee at the People's Assembly is working on setting the standards of choosing the members of the Constituent Assembly that would draft the constitution.

The final discussions resulted in an agreement to choose 37 members from the political parties and players and 53 members from the different social sectors. However, ten members will be constitutional experts.

Dr. Imad Jad, member of the parliamentary committee who met SCAF's Field Marshal Muhammad Hussein Tantawi and Sami Anan said that voting in the Constituent Assembly would depend on thirds [Majority would be two thirds], and in case of a disagreement, the decision would be taken if 57% of the members agreed.

Jad said it was agreed that the Muslim Brotherhood's Freedom and Justice would have 16 members in the Constituent Assembly while al-Nour Party would have 9 members and al-Wafd party would have 4 members. However, each of the Democratic Egyptian Party, Free Egyptian Party, al-Wasat Party and al-Bina wa al-Tanmiyah Party will have two members in the Constituent Assembly.

The remaining 37 members will be chosen from the different social institutions.

The Azhar Rejects Amendments to its Law

The Azhar rejected a draft law suggested by Salafist al-Nour Party MP Ali Qatamish.

Khalid Ali against the Public Delegation to Saudi Arabia



A public and Parliamentary delegation headed by Speaker of the People's Assembly Saad al-Katatni went to Saudi Arabia last week to resolve the "Gizawi" crisis between Egypt and KSA and to stress the strong ties between the two countries.

Supreme Administrative Court: Constituent Assembly to be formed from Outside Parliament



The department examining appeals in the Supreme Administrative Court, headed by Senior Judge Magdi Al-Agati, refused the appeal filed by Deputy Head of the Parliament's Constitutional and Legislative Affairs Committee Mohamed Al-Omda. The appeal demanded the court to overrule its previous decision which invalidated 50% of the Constituent Assembly's members who were selected from inside the parliament.

The court's decision had obliged the People's Assembly and the Shoura Council to select all the members of the Constituent Assembly from outside the parliament. The court referred the appeal to the State Commissioners Authority to prepare a detailed legal report on the subject.

Al-Omda appealed to the court to suspend its decision and allow the previously-formed Constituent Assembly to undertake its tasks and finish drafting the new constitution before the end of the transitional period.

People’s Assembly Approves Amendments to Presidential Elections Law



During its session yesterday, the People’s Assembly approved the amendments proposed to some of the provisions of the Presidential Elections Law.

Members of the Parliament said those amendments will “ensure there will be no fraud” in the upcoming presidential elections. They agreed that the results of each polling sub-station will be announced in its place before being transferred to the main polling stations. They also agreed that every presidential candidate shall receive a stamped copy of the vote counting results in polling sub-stations and main stations across the country.

However, MPs refused proposal presented by MP Sameh Makram Ebeid which demanded the right to appeal the decisions of the Presidential Elections Commission before the Administrative Court.

100 Free Egyptian Members Resign

Religious scholars from Al-Azhar University criticized Sheikh Yousef Al-Qaradawi's attack on opponents of the Muslim Brotherhood. Al-Qaradawi said MB's opponents are similar to "the disbelievers of Prophet Lot."

Dr. Abdel Mo'ti Bayoumi, former dean of the Faculty of Fundamentals of Religion in Al-Azhar University, said if Al-Qaradawi actually said those statements, then he is tarnishing the image of all the Muslim Brotherhood's political opponents. Bayoumi said Al-Qaradawi should reconsider his use of the Holy Qur'an verses because it is a mistake to use Qur'an in this sense.

Another professor, Dr. Ahmed Kariema, said that the Muslim Brotherhood believe they are the true representatives of Islam, thus they do not accept criticism and they consider any statements against them to be an attack on the religion itself.

Nine civilians were killed in the Abbasiya clashes in addition to an Armed Forces corporal, official reports said.

The deaths occurred due to gunshots, birdshots and cold weapons wounds, said head of the Forensic Medicine Authority Ashraf el-Refai.

One body is still unidentified, Refai said.

Military Police Did Not Storm Mosque in Abbasiya



Head of the Military Police Major General Hamdi Badeen denied that Armed Forces soldiers have stormed Al-Nour Mosque in Abbasiya district or destroyed its contents.

These are just vicious rumors aiming to drive a wedge between the Armed Forces and the people, Badeen said.

Armed Forces men would never do such thing as attacking a mosque or a church, he added.

He also refuted reports that head of the popular resistance of Suez Hafez Salama was assaulted.

❖ **Al-Akhbar: Egyptian state-owned semi-official daily newspaper**

It was founded in May [1952](#) as a part of [Akhbar El Yom](#).

❖ **Al-Gomhoria: Egyptian state-owned daily newspaper**

An influential state-owned [Egyptian Arabic language](#) daily [newspaper](#). It was established in 1954.

❖ **Al-Shorouk: Egyptian daily independent newspaper**

Is a prominent Arabic newspaper published in Egypt [\[1\]](#) and several other Arabic nations It is a daily independent newspaper, covering mainly politics, militant affairs and sport.

❖ **Al-Masry al-Yom: Independent daily newspaper**

On 7 June 2004, it published its first edition. The paper initially circulated primarily amongst Cairo's intellectual elite, providing objective news coverage in the belief that good news would beat sensationalist reporting found in other Egyptian print media.
