Presidential candidate Hicham al-Bastawisi said Egyptians lost confidence in the Islamist trend, expecting that the Parliament would not go on for a long time.

On his part, candidate Abd al-Munim Abu al-Futouh accused the former regime of buying votes.

Al-Ahram conducted an interview with revolutionary presidential candidate Khalid Ali. Ali stressed the importance to realize the social justice in Egypt and asserted that realizing social justice and preserving the dignity of people through equality are keys to solve Egypt's problems.

Ali said that the Muslim Brotherhood's candidate Muhammad Mursi was not the revolution candidate. He also denied what was rumored about his intention to assign Muhamamd al-Baradei as Prime Minister.

## Judges Investigate Involvement of Former NDP Leaders in Creating Security Chaos



Investigative judges, assigned by the Ministry of Justice, examining the case of the Maspero clashes revealed serious facts related to the involvement of nearly 30 former leaders of the dissolved National Democratic Party in spreading violence and creating security chaos in the country.

Judges decided to open an independent investigation into the role played by those former NDP figures. They will be facing charges of incitement to violence in the Mapero, Mohamed Mahmoud St., and cabinet clashes.

Testimonies of eyewitnesses indicated that several former NDP figures were seen in meetings in an expensive hotel in Masr Al-Gedida. Eyewitnesses said those former regime figures raised huge sums of money to hire thugs to attacks protesters and create security chaos after the fall of the Mubarak regime.

### Pro and Anti SCAF Protests

## High Turnout in Voting of Egyptian Expatriates



The Presidential Elections Commission declared that the voter turnout of Egyptian expatriates was unprecedented on the second day of voting in the first presidential elections after the January 25 revolution.

Senior Judge Hatem Bagato, secretary general of the commission, said the turnout was high in the past two days, particularly in Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Bahrain, the US, Italy and Canada. He said no violations were reported so far and the commission did not receive any complaints from voters.

Bagato confirmed that preparations are underway for presidential elections inside Egypt, scheduled on May 23-24, as the commission printed 51.5 million ballot papers and selected 54 polling stations in the 27 governorates of the country.

## A Secret Meeting of the Muslim Brotherhood to Support Abu al-Futouh



Well informed Muslim Brotherhood sources uncovered a secret meeting at the Guidance Office of the Muslim Brotherhood to consider supporting presidential candidate Islamist Abd al-Munim Abu al-Futouh in the presidential elections.

Abu al-Futouh resigned from the group after the Jan 25 revolution before declaring his will to run the presidential elections. At that time the Muslim Brotherhood considered Abu al-Futouh to be a dissident.

News was reported about strong disagreements inside the Brotherhood. Many of the group's members who were against the nomination of Muhammad Mursi wanted to support Abu al-Futouh.

Constitutional expert Dr. Muhammad Kamal Abu al-Majd said the Muslim Brotherhood’s insistence to control the Constituent Assembly was threatening the group and “bringing them close to Tora Prison.”

Abu al-Majd stated that if the Muslim Brotherhood insisted on dominance, they would end up like the dissolved National Democratic Party where people put their headquarters on fire during the Jan 25 revolution. He accused the Muslim Brotherhood of being selfish and of caring for the group’s interest regardless of Egypt’s welfare.

Abu al-Majd said the Brotherhood wanted to dominate the Constituent Assembly and to exclude wide sectors of the Egyptian society; which, in his opinion, threatens of a civil war.

Abu al-Majd referred to Egyptians’ discontentment at the Muslim Brotherhood’s compartments.

Abu al-Majd called for postponing the presidential elections until a constitution is drafted, asserting that the drafting the constitution needed at least 60 days.

## Abu al-Futouh Underestimates Simple People's Reason



Reflecting on Abu al-Futouh's debate with Amr Mussa on Thursday, the author said Abu al-Futouh's promise to provide full health security to all Egyptians was ridiculous; arguing that all the state's income would not be enough to realize this.

The author also said that Abu al-Futouh's statements about the budget and the state's financial issues were unrealistic and aimed to attract public support. He considered Abu al-Futouh's statements to be an underestimation of simple people's reasoning.

## Supreme Administrative Court Permits Shafik to Run in Presidential Race



Egypt's Supreme Administrative Court, headed by Senior Judge Magdi Al-Agati, has put an end to the controversy surrounding the presidential bid of former Prime Minister Ahmed Shafik by issuing its decision to allow him to run for presidency and annul the implementation of the Political Isolation Law. The court also invalidated the decision of the Presidential Elections Commission which referred the Political Isolation Law to the Supreme Constitutional Court, thus putting an end to the controversy related to postponing presidential elections.

The court ordered that presidential elections be held on its scheduled date (May 23-24).

Dr. Shawki El-Sayed, Shafik's lawyer, confirmed that the Political Isolation Law is unconstitutional and it was legislated by the parliament as a "notorious law."

Al-Wasat MP Essam Soltan said the Presidential Elections Commission responded only to Shafik's appeal without giving the same opportunity to other excluded candidates. "The commission accepted Shafik's appeal, issued a decision that the law is unconstitutional and restored him to the presidential race. Thus, the commission played both roles the judge and the rivals," said Soltan.

### Constituent Assembly Crisis to be Resolved



The crisis of the Constituent Assembly’s formation is about to reach a solution after nearly three months of conflict and disagreements.

The final formation of the Constituent Assembly will be complete during this week, following long deliberations among political forces to reach a consensus.

A law will be enacted to specify the criteria of forming the Constituent Assembly.

MP Dr. Wahid Abdel Megid told Al-Tahrir newspaper that deliberations are still underway between the Freedom and Justice Party, which has a parliamentary majority, and other political parties to reach a final decision on the matter. The law will then be referred to the Parliament’s Constitutional and Legislative Affairs Committee to issue its legislation.

## The Brotherhood Threatens of Withdrawing the Confidence from the Government

The Muslim Brotherhood's Freedom and Justice Party (FJP) returned to its threats to withdraw confidence from the Ganzouri's government.

18 MPs presented three interrogations against the government; one of them was an interrogation of the Minister of Civil about preventing hostesses from wearing the veil. he second interrogation was about the government abstention from withdrawing the Egyptian citizenship from Egyptian nationals who got the Israeli nationality. The third interrogation is about the relationship between the Waili police station and the thugs who attacked the protesters in Abbasiya incidents.

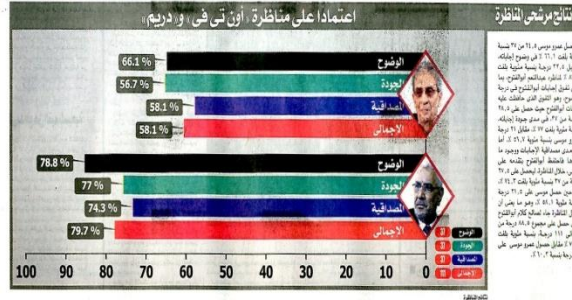
The three interrogations revive the crisis between the government and the parliament and the FJP alluded again to withdrawing the confidence from the government.

Sources told al-Shurouq about an alleged Katatni intention to suspend the Parliament sessions until the end of the presidential elections so that the Muslim Brotherhood's MPs can have time to support the group's presidential candidate Muhammad Mursi in his presidential campaign.

### Mussa and Abu al-Futouh Following the TV Debate



Reflecting on the presidential candidates’ statements in the media, political researcher Muhammad al-Ajati said Hamadain Sabbahi was number one in honesty, while Khalid Ali was the cleverer and Ahmad Shafiq came in the last position.

Al-Ajati’s evaluation was based on every candidate’s clarity and ability to express his ideas. Candidates were also evaluated according to their accurate and updated information and how close each of them is to reality.

Khalid Ali came first with 82% degree, Hamadain Sabbahi came second with 81.3% and Abd al-Munim Abu al-Furouh came third with 79.7%. Amr Mussa followed with 60.3%, preceding Muhammad Mursi who got 56.7% and Abu al-Izz al-Hariri who got 55.3 % before Ahmad Shafiq who was on the end of the list with 46.7%.

As for the TV debate that was broadcasted last Thursday between Amr Mussa and Abd al-Muinim Abu al-Futouh on On TV and Dream 2 TV, al-Shurouq provided a graph showing each of the two candidates’ percentage in clarity, quality and authenticity.

In clarity Mussa got 66.1% and Abu al-Futouh 78.8%. In quality, Mussa got 56.7 % while Abu al-Futouh got 77%. In authenticity, Mussa got 58.1% and Abu al-Futouh 74.3%.

The total result was 79.7% for Abd al-Munim Abu al-Futouh and 58.1% for Amr Mussa.

Applying the same criteria on all presidential candidates’ media testimonials, Khalid Ali came first with 82% followed by Hamadain Sabbahi with 81% followed by Ahmad Shafiq. Muhammad Mursi came third with 56.7% followed by Abu al-Izz al-Hariri with 55.3% before Ahamd Shafiq who came last with 46.7%.

## Swiss Court Issues Decision to Allow Egypt to Pursue Mubarak's Entourage in Money Laundering Case



The Federal Criminal Court in Switzerland has confirmed the right of Egypt to be a plaintiff in the criminal case against the Mubarak family and nine of his cronies for money laundering.

Head of the Illicit Gains Authority Senior Judge Assem Al-Gohari said the Swiss court declined the contestation filed by the defendants, including Alaa and Gamal Mubarak, who requested that Egypt do not legally pursue them in the case of money laundering.

Switzerland had frozen SFr410 million which belong a number of figures of the Mubarak regime, and accused nine of them of smuggling money outside Egypt and subjecting these stolen funds to money laundering.

### Egypt Stolen Money will be Returned

Switzerland issued a verdict that acknowledged Egypt’s right to get back all the stolen money. The verdict also stated that ousted President Mubarak, his siblings and 10 businessmen had made money laundry for an amount of 410 million Franks that have been frozen in Swiss bank accounts since February 2011.

Judge Assem al-Gohary, head of the Judicial Committee assigned to restore Egypt’s stolen money said the documents demanded by Spain will be signed and sent within hours.

These documents will allow Spain to submit businessman Hussein Salem and his siblings to any trial in any case.

An influential state-owned [Egyptian Arabic language](#) daily [newspaper](#). It was established in 1954.

### ❖ **Al-Shorouk: Egyptian daily independent newspaper**

Is a prominent Arabic newspaper published in Egypt [U](#) and several other Arabic nations It is a daily independent newspaper, covering mainly politics, militant affairs and sport.
