



The EU eases entry checks for Indian curry

New Delhi, 25 June 2014: Following sufficient proof by Indian producers and exporters that curry (chilli products) imported from India meet EU phytosanitary standards, as well as reports from EU Member States to confirm compliance, import controls for this product will be eased.

Indian curry exports to the EU will be removed from the list of feed and food of non-animal origin that are subject to an increased level of inspections by the national competent authorities of EU Member States. The amendments are expected to enter into force on 1 July 2014.
