The EU Delegation and Embassies of the EU Member-States held education fairs in Almaty and Astana

On 12 November in Almaty and on 15 November in Astana, the EU Delegation to the Republic of Kazakhstan together with the Embassies of the EU Member-States held education fairs "Study in Europe". Education fairs have been conducted in Kazakhstan for the third year in a row to provide Kazakhstani students and faculty members with information about opportunities to study at higher educational establishments in Europe. In the framework of these fairs, 14 EU Member-States (Czech Republic, Germany, France, Poland, Hungary, Italy, the Netherlands, Romania, Spain, Slovakia, Finland, Latvia, Lithuania and the United Kingdom) through their embassies jointly with the EU Delegation in Kazakhstan presented a variety of education-related informational materials. Autumn economic forecast 2011-13: Growth at a standstill

Brussels, 10 November 2011 - The recovery of the EU economy has stopped. Sharply deteriorated confidence is affecting investment and consumption, weakening global growth is holding back exports, and urgent fiscal consolidation is weighing on domestic demand. GDP in the EU is now projected to stagnate until well into 2012. Growth for the whole of 2012 is forecast at about $\frac{1}{2}$ %. By 2013, a return to slow growth of about $\frac{11}{2}$ % is expected. No real improvements are projected for labour markets, and unemployment is forecast to remain at the current high level of around $\frac{91}{2}$ %. Inflation is set to return below 2% over the coming quarters. Fiscal consolidation is forecast to progress with public deficits set to decline to just above 3% by 2013 under an assumption of unchanged policies. Full text

Libya: additional EU support for humanitarian mine clearance actions

In view of the increased need for the rapid clearance of unexploded ordnances and booby traps in battleground areas in Libya, the European Commission has announced that it is to provide additional funding of \in 500,000.

Kristalina Georgieva, Commissioner for International Cooperation, Humanitarian Aid and Crisis Response stated: "One of the major threats to civilians remains the residues of war. Despite the cessation of the fighting, unexploded ammunition and mines are still claiming victims, especially children. This additional funding will assist the Libyan people to reduce the risk of fatalities and injury". <u>Press-release</u>

EU High Representative Catherine Ashton visits Tripoli and opens European Union Delegation

Catherine Ashton, EU High Representative for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy/Commission Vice-President, will visit Tripoli today, to officially inaugurate the new Delegation of the European Union in Libya. She will meet the Chairman of the National Transitional Council, Mustafa Abdul Jalil, newly appointed Prime Minister, Abdurrahim al-Keib, and Ian Martin, the head of the United Nations Support Mission in Libya. She will also speak at the first Libyan Women's Rights Forum.

"I am delighted to visit Tripoli to express the EU's continued support to the Libyan people's efforts to build a new Libya based on the rule of law, democracy and human rights," Catherine Ashton said. "Opening a fully fledged EU Delegation in Tripoli underlines the EU's commitment to our close relationship with the Libyan people, both during the political transition and in the long term. I will meet representatives of civil society organisations at the Women's Rights Forum. The EU is already supporting civil society in Libya, in particular women and young people, who have a major role to play in shaping Libya's future." Press-release
