I think that the presentations that were held this morning gave you a good overview of what has been achieved so far. I believe that the results of this first year, the awareness raising on the very concept of IBM, IBM gaps and needs analysis, the training needs assessment, the equipment needs assessment and the action plans that derive from each of these - provide a

solid foundation on which we can all build our respective efforts to contribute to a better and more coordinated management of Lebanon's borders.

improved framework to facilitate legal migration flows, trade, and help fight against cross-border crime.
