EU-FUNDED PROJECT PRESENTS TWO GUIDES ON STANDARDS & QUALITY INFRASTRUCTURE AND HEALTH AND SAFETY AT WORK

On 30 September the EU-funded project "Support to the Implementation of EU-Moldova Agreements" presented two guides on law approximation of the Republic of Moldova to EU standards in the field of Standards & Quality Infrastructure and in the field of Health and Safety at Work.

The first guide, entitled "Technical Regulation & Quality Infrastructure – Approximation to EU Standards in Moldova" was elaborated by Mr Richard Wheatley and is based on the analysis and assessment of law approximation in the field of Technical Regulations and Quality Infrastructure law and policy. The author underlines, among other, the need to develop enough the Quality Infrastructure to avoid compromising public safety.

The second guide, entitled "Health and Safety at Work – Approximation to EU Standards in Moldova" was elaborated by Dr Bernhard Brueckner and is based on the analysis and assessment of law approximation in the field of Occupational Safety and Health. The author presented six elementary steps to successful approximation with EU standards and made some over-arching recommendations concerning strategic leadership and enforcement to be followed in the coming years.

CROSS-BORDER CO-OPERATION PROGRAMME DECIDES TO INCREASE FUNDING FOR PEOPLE-TO-PEOPLE PROJECTS

On 1 October the EU-funded Romania-Ukraine-Republic of Moldova Cross-border Co-operation Programme held in Suceava the 4th meeting of the Joint Monitoring Committee. The representatives of three countries has approved the list of the projects to be funded under its "People to people co-operation" priority, deciding also to increase the amount allocated to this priority from €5 million to €7.6 million, for a total number of 62 projects. The list will be sent to the European Commission in order to verify any overlap with other programmes and to avoid double funding.

The Joint Monitoring Committee members also debated and agreed on the main features of the guidelines for grant applicants for the Second call for proposals.

The Romania-Ukraine-Republic of Moldova Cross-Border Cooperation Programme aims at creating "bridges" among the three countries involved, in order to help the border areas overcome their similar development challenges, by working together and finding common solutions. The Programme's funding is €126.72 million for the period 2007-2013.

EUROPEAN COMMISSION HOLDS A ROUND TABLE ON THE ETWINNING PROGRAMME

On 4-5 October the European Commission together with the Ministry of Education held in Chisinau an exploratory round table on the eTwinning programme, a very successful EU programme that fosters school collaboration across frontiers taking advantage of information and communication technologies. The programme has a potential to be extended to Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Republic of Moldova, Ukraine and even to Russia.

Through the eTwinning portal, teachers from primary and secondary schools all around Europe meet each other and develop joint pedagogical projects with their pupils and their partners in another country. The eTwinning Internet portal offers them secure Internet spaces and tools for their collaboration. Teachers also get help and training from their national eTwinning agencies.

The eTwinning programme proved to have been very effective in fostering Information Communication Technology skills in the EU. Around 100.000 teachers from the EU Member States are registered in the eTwinning portal and running thousands of joint projects every year. The EU Eastern partnership policy now explores the ways to involve the Eastern partners and Russia in this programme.

NATIONAL CONFERENCE ON THE 20-TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE EU TEMPUS PROGRAMME

On 5 October the National TEMPUS Office organized a conference on the occasion of the 20-th anniversary of launching the EU TEMPUS Programme, which was attended by officials from the Ministry of Education, the EU Delegation to Moldova, the Education, Audiovisual and Culture Executive Agency (EACEA), rectors of Moldovan higher education institutions.

TEMPUS was joined by Moldova in 1994 and represents the largest and longest running programme supporting higher education reform. Both Mr. Leonid Bujor, Minister of Education, and Ms Loretta Handrabura, Deputy Minister of Education, gave a high appreciation to about 60 projects with total budget of around EUR 13.0 million implemented within TEMPUS so far, that contribute to reforming the Moldovan higher education system and its alignment to the Bologna Process.

In his speech, Ambassador Dirk Schuebel, Head of the EU Delegation to Moldova, announced that other 5 projects with Moldovan participation were selected after the latest (third) Call for Proposals within the TEMPUS IV Programme. All these projects strengthen the links between Moldovan and EU universities and contribute to building the European Higher Education Area.

EU-FUNDED PROJECT HOLDS A WORKSHOP ON DOCUMENT SECURITY FOR MOLDOVAN OFFICIALS

On 5-7 October the EU-funded project "Strengthening Capacities and Cooperation in the Identification of Forged and Falsified Travel Documents at the Moldova-Romania Border" held a workshop for a working group consisting of representatives from Moldovan Border Guard Service, Ministry of Internal Affairs, Ministry of Informational Technologies and Communication, Ministry of Foreign Affairs and European Integration and Ministry of Justice.

The participants identified and discussed the working mechanism of information exchange, provision of the EDISON database, its installation and utilisation, fine-tuned the distance learning training tool on document security and finalised the draft of the Inter-agency Agreement on information exchange in the field of document security.

NEW LARGE-SCALE EU-FUNDED PROJECT ON REHABILITATION OF THE WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM IN NISPORENI

On 6 October the European Union and the Austrian Development Agency (ADA) signed in Chisinau an agreement expressing European and Austrian commitment to the Republic of Moldova, supporting the country's European integration and development. The sides agree to co-finance the rehabilitation of the water supply system in the rayon of Nisporeni to ensure high quality of drinking water for the inhabitants of three municipalities in the rayon with a potential enlargement of the system in the future.

This intervention shall contribute to reduce chronic diseases, early mortality and improve the life of the citizens of the region. EU and ADA are committed to improve the infrastructure in the region, a precondition for development and economic investment. The Project will permit sustainable access to sufficient and safe drinking water for the local population, thereby improving their quality of life and public health. ADA will lead the project providing €3.5 million, EU co-finances the project with €5 million, and Moldovan local, regional and central authorities will provide other appr. €2 million. The duration of the Project has been calculated for a period of 4.5 years.

EU-FUNDED PROGRAMME REVIEWS ACHIEVEMENTS AT ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING

On 8 October the EU-funded programme "Improving Forest Law Enforcement and Governance (FLEG) in the European Neighbourhood Policy East Countries and Russia" held in Chisinau the meeting of the National Programme Advisory Committee (NPAC) composed from representatives of the EU Delegation, Agency "Moldsilva" and its subdivisions, other central public authorities, local authorities with ownership of forests, NGOs, international organisations.

NPAC held its meeting to review Programme implementation progress reports for the preceding year of 2009-2010 and to discuss implementation of the "National Action Plan to combat illegal logging and other forest related violations for the period of 2009-2011" (NAP) as well as other current issues.

Further discussion focused on pressing problems in the national forestry sector, in particular financial and economic issues related to the communities dependent on forest resources, ways to improve a dialogue between the governmental forestry authority (holder of the 90% of the national forest fund) and the general public.

EUBAM REVIEWS ACHIEVEMENTS AT ADVISORY BOARD MEETING

On 11 October the EU Border Assistance Mission to Moldova and Ukraine (EUBAM) at its 15th meeting of the Advisory Board in Chisinau reviewed the Mission's achievements supporting the development of EU standards in border management with the Moldovan and Ukrainian border guard and customs services, law enforcement agencies and government institutions.

The Advisory Board took note of the EUBAM Activity Report from 1 June to 30 September 2010 and highlighted the good cooperation between EUBAM and the partner services in a number of areas. The Board drew attention to the success of the 7th Joint Border Control Operation 'TYRA 2010' that was completed on 15 September, particularly regarding the extent of the seizures that resulted from the Operation.

The Advisory Board was chaired by the Head of the EU Delegation to Ukraine, Ambassador Pinto Teixeira, and was composed of high-level representatives of the Moldovan and Ukrainian border control and law enforcement agencies, the European Union, the EU Special Representative for Moldova, the United Nations Development Programme as well as the Organisation for Security and Co-operation in Europe.

EU-FUNDED PROJECT DISCUSSES THE NEW MEDIA MONITORING METHODOLOGY

On 12 October the EU-funded and Council of Europe-implemented "Democracy Support Programme in Moldova" held a roundtable for the national and local broadcasters and civil society representatives to discuss the new media monitoring methodology for the Coordination Council of Audiovisual (CCA).

The methodology was elaborated in August 2010 by international experts and was designed in accordance with the European standards and Moldovan legislation. It lays down different approaches to media monitoring, since the various legal obligations of broadcasters require different types of monitoring.

The meeting participants were unanimous accessing the methodology as "perfect" and urged the CCA to follow the methodology's spirit and the letter in their everyday work. The roundtable was attended by circa 30 representatives of the TV and radio channels, media NGOs etc.

MOLDOVAN DIASPORA OUTLINE STEPS TO STRENGTHEN RELATIONSHIP WITH HOME COUNTRY

On 12 -14 October, the IV Moldovan Diaspora Congress ended in Chisinau, with a resolution identifying concrete steps that would strengthen relationships between Moldovan migrants and their country of origin and which would build a more prosperous Moldova. The Congress, organized by the Bureau of Inter-Ethnic Relations in partnership with IOM, brought together 110 Moldovans living in 31 countries, government ministers, Moldovan President Mihai Ghimpu and Prime Minister Vlad Filat.

The resolution identified measures such as the creation of a specialized state agency on diaspora and a diaspora council with a consultative role for Moldovan government; the involvement of diaspora leaders in Moldovan official delegations; supporting the creation of Moldovan Cultural Centres in cities with large number of Moldovan migrants and promoting policies which would better involve the Moldovan diaspora in the social, economic and political affairs of their home country.

ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSIONS OF THE NEW CODE OF ETHICS FOR JOURNALISTS

On 12-14 October the EU-funded and Council of Europe-implemented "Democracy Support Programme in Moldova" held, in co-operation with the Press Council and the Journalists' Union, organised three round tables in Chisinau, Balti and Comrat to discuss the proposed changes and updates of the Code of Ethics for journalists. The media organisations say that the Code no longer corresponds to the journalistic practices that evolved over the last 11 years when the initial version of the Code was elaborated.

Around 90 journalists from all over the country were involved in the debates on the Code of Ethics. In the next weeks, the Press Council and Journalists' Union should put together a final draft of the Code of Ethics based on the comments and proposals gathered from journalistic community. The document then will be sent for a final round of comments to all the newsrooms across the country. It is expected that the final document will be signed and agreed upon by all media community when it is presented at the National media conference later in the year.

About 24 police officers participated at this training seminar. Expert police trainers from the Netherlands, Spain and the United Kingdom gave an overview of the rights of police officers and ethics, the international best practices in preventive measures. Also the experts and the audience discussed issues concerning handling detainees, briefing, use of special techniques in crowd communication, negotiation etc.

EU-FUNDED PROJECT ORGANISES TRAINING-OF-TRAINERS FOR JUDGES AND PROSECUTORS

On 18-22 October the EU-funded and Council of Europe-implemented "Democracy Support Programme in Moldova" organised in co-operation with the National Institute of Justice a training-of-trainers on the use of alternatives to pre-trial detention and imprisonment. A five-day event brought together 20 judges and prosecutors to be trained on the use of alternatives to pre-trial detention and imprisonment for the purpose of providing cascade seminars to their peers throughout the country.

The use of alternatives to pre-trial detention and imprisonment – national and international context, the national legislation relating to pre-trial detention and alternatives – were the main topics discussed during the training sessions. This training session is an essential component of the Joint Programme's efforts in safeguarding pre-trial guarantees and promoting human rights awareness in Moldova. The training was conducted by an international expert Mr. David Perry and a national expert Mr. Igor Dolea.

EU-FUNDED PROJECT SUPPORT THE DEVELOPMENT OF SMES IN TRANSNISTRIAN REGION

On 22 October the EU-funded and UNDP-implemented project "Support to Confidence Building Measures" opened in Bender the branch of the Business School of the Chamber of Commerce and Industry from Transnistrian region and launched the training course on "The Basis of Own Business". The project for creation of the Business School is part of a network of 3 business schools – in Bender, Tiraspol and Rabnita.

The Head of the EU Delegation, Ambassador Dirk Schuebel, said at the opening ceremony that the EU attaches great importance to promote fruitful dialogue and cooperation between Moldovan and Transnistrian authorities. The EU is therefore involved on the political stage, but also at a technical level with very concrete initiatives such as the opening of a Business school in Bender.

The Business School in Bender will offer to the managers of small and medium-sized enterprises training courses on establishment and development of business, accounting and juridical assistance, support for fiscal administration etc.

EU-FUNDED PROJECT PROMOTES THE RETURN OF YOUNG MOLDOVAN OVERSEAS GRADUATES

On 25 October the EU-funded project "Supporting the implementation of the migration and development component of the EU-Moldova Mobility Partnership" announced the launch of a pilot programme for promoting and facilitating the temporary and permanent return and professional reintegration of 30 Moldovan overseas graduates for experience sharing and usage of their skills obtained abroad.

The programme is addressed to young Moldovan overseas graduates who wish to come back to Moldova and be employed in the public or private sector. The project will offer support for the overseas graduates in the identification of employers, logistical and administrative assistance, financial support in covering transportation costs and monthly living allowance to the participants for a period of up to six months.

EU-FUNDED PROJECT PROVIDES ENGLISH LANGUAGE COURSES FOR THE PARLIAMENT OF MOLDOVA

In October the EU-funded and Council of Europe-implemented "Democracy Support Programme in Moldova" started providing free of charge English language courses for the staff and members of Moldovan Parliament. It is a new phase after the commencement of the second module of studies which will last through the end of December 2010.

The purpose of this EU-funded activity is to increase the capacities of staff and MPs and to facilitate their international contacts, provide quicker access to all types of information the Moldovan Parliament may benefit from, and speed up professional knowledge sharing and learning. A total number of 53 students, including high-level officials, staff and consultants divided in small groups based on the level of their language skills regularly attend classes organised by the International Language Training Centre. The fourth, and last, module will end in early June 2011.

EU-FUNDED PROJECT PROMOTES THE TEMPORARY RETURN OF REPRESENTATIVES FROM MOLDOVAN SCIENTIFIC DIASPORA

In October the EU-funded project "Supporting the implementation of the migration and development component of the EU-Moldova Mobility Partnership" announced in partnership with the Academy of Sciences a competition to support on a competitive basis 30 researchers – members of Moldovan Scientific Diaspora (MSD) – willing to return to Moldova for a short-term visit of 7–11 days in order to perform research activities and share their experience at one of R&D institutions or universities of Moldova.

EU-FUNDED PROJECT PROVIDES EXPERT SUPPORT TO CCA

On 27 October–3 November the EU-funded and Council of Europe-implemented "Democracy Support Programme in Moldova" provides advise and assist the Coordinating Council of Audiovisual (CCA) in drafting media monitoring reports on the Early Parliamentary Elections. The assistance is provided by Mr. Marek Mracka, programme coordinator of Europe's leading media monitoring organisation MEMO98.

The Slovak expert advise the staff members of the Monitoring Unit of CCA how to carry out the media monitoring to some specific and more problematic aspects of a media monitoring (e.g. how to eliminate potential subjectiveness and/or bias of media monitors, how to deal with the advantage of incumbency etc.).

The expert participates at the daily and weekly meetings of CCA and presents his observations on strength and weaknesses of the media monitoring activities and corresponding recommendations. He also assists the Head of the Monitoring Unit in elaboration of media monitoring reports and of the draft decisions in accordance with the European standards and helps CCA to examine the complains regarding the media coverage of the Early Parliamentary Elections.
