A Training Course for the Rayonal Economic Departments delivered within a DCFTA Context

The EU-funded “Technical Assistance for the Implementation of the DCFTA” Project (TA DCFTA Project) in cooperation with the Ministry of Economy of the Republic of Moldova delivered a regional training course for the local authorities from the Northern Rayonal Economic Departments during 24-26 February, 2016.

During 24-26 February, 2016 the EU-funded “Technical Assistance for the Implementation of the DCFTA” Project (TA DCFTA Project) organised the second three-days training course for the Northern Rayonal Economic Departments. The course is part of a comprehensive training programme within a DCFTA context for the Rayonal Economic Departments designed by the Ministry of Economy in close cooperation with the TA DCFTA Project.

The training course was dedicated to the most important aspects of a business start-up including, but not limited to: selection and analysis of the business idea, understanding the importance of business planning, introducing the business plan structure, developing presentation and selling skills, engaging with business support providers, etc. The participants under the guidance of the trainer were encouraged to produce their own business plan using supplied business start-up scenarios.

The Rayonal Economic Departments from the South region of Moldova will benefit from this training course during 2-4 March, 2016.

The training course is delivered by the TA DCFTA Project’s SME Development and Export Promotion International Key-Expert within the framework of the EU-funded Deep and Comprehensive Free Trade Area (DCFTA) Sector Reform Contract (SRC), Component 3 “Capacity-building and Institutional-Strengthening in the field of developing and diversifying Moldova’s internal and external market conditions and opportunities”.

The three-days training course was attended by representatives of economic departments/ divisions/sections of the Rayon Councils from Edinet, Ocnita, Briceni, Soroca, Criuleni, Falesti, Telenesti, Floresti, Rezina, Rascani, Soldanesti, Sangerei and Orhei.
