SHORT-TERM INTERNSHIPS FOR THE STAFF OF THE MOLDOVAN PARLIAMENT SECRETARIAT

On 24–28 October, the EU-funded and Council of Europeimplemented "Democracy Support Programme in Moldova" provided assistance intended to strengthen the institutional capacity of the Moldovan Parliament Secretariat through shortterm internships to European parliaments.



FIRST VILLAGES TO CONNECT THEIR PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS TO THE STRAW-FIRED HEATING SYSTEMS HAVE BEEN SELECTED

The first 17 rural communities from the Republic of Moldova to connect their public institutions to the straw-fired heating systems were selected. All in all, 11 schools, 10 kindergartens and one community centre will be heated during the winter time with locally produced energy. The rural public institutions will be connected to the biomass-based heating systems with the financial support of the Energy and Biomass Project, funded by the European Union and co-funded and implemented by the United Nations Development Programme in Moldova.

More than 13,400 persons, of which almost 5,000 children will increase their heating comfort due to the new thermal equipment for biomass-based energy production. The selected rural communities are located in Stefan Voda, Leova, Cantemir districts and Gagauz Yeri ATU – these

ASSESSMENT VISIT ON THE MECHANISM FOR COORDINATING AND MONITORING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE MOLDOVAN STRATEGY FOR JUSTICE SECTOR REFORM

In the period of 17-20 October, the EU-funded and Council of Europe-implemented "Democracy Support Programme in Moldova" organised an assessment visit on the possibilities for the setup of a mechanism to coordinate and monitor the process of implementation of the Strategy for Justice Sector Reform.

In the framework of this assessment visit, bilateral meetings with representatives of the Justice Sector reform stakeholders as well as representatives of all relevant authorities and organisations have taken place. The assessment mission concluded with a wrap up roundtable where broader discussions on the subject were held. The outcome from the meetings and roundtable served as an opportunity for the CoE



expert to formulate first conclusions and recommendations and exchange them with the Moldovan counterparts. A comprehensive report on the most suitable coordination mechanism for the implementation of the Moldovan Justice Sector reform will be drawn up shortly.

NEWLY ELECTED LOCAL OFFICIALS ARE TRAINED ON HOW TO TRANSFORM THE ELECTORAL PROMISES INTO GOOD GOVERNANCE

The Civic Coalition for Free and Fair Elections launched on 15 October a training campaign for the newly elected local officials in the field of local public administration (LPA) through the National Assistance and Information Center for NGOs CONTACT.

The purpose of the campaign is to enhance the capacity of local governments in the effective management of public affairs and to foster the democratization of public life by promoting good practices in this area and by ensuring the transparency of decision-making at the local level. The trainings are organized with the financial support of the European Union in the framework of the project "Domestic Election Monitoring and Voter Education in Moldova – Strengthening of Capacities and International Networking".



During the campaign at least 500 local counsellors, mayors, officials of municipalities, heads of local public institutions and civil society leaders from selected localities benefit from two-day trainings on the principles of LPA operation, organizing the activity of LPA, management of the local public finances and heritage, involving citizens in decisions making and ensuring transparency of local governments etc.

CONTROLLED DELIVERY IS USEFUL TOOL IN FIGHTING ORGANISED CRIME

The European Union Border Assistance Mission to Moldova and Ukraine (EUBAM) partners from the border guard and customs services of Moldova and Ukraine, the security services of Moldova and Ukraine, the Security services of Moldova and Ukraine, the Moldovan and Ukrainian ministries of internal affairs and the Moldovan Centre for Combating Economic Crime and Corruption on 14 October 2011 completed a five-day training session in controlled delivery – the first time training of this kind has been conducted by the Mission.

Controlled delivery is a tool employed by the criminal prosecution authorities which is indispensable to effectively detect organised crime. Also among the 35 participants were two teachers from the Odessa and Lviv National universities of Internal Affairs.



Experienced officers from the Austrian Federal Ministry of Internal Affairs, SOCA and New Scotland Yard came to Odessa to deliver the training, which aimed to share best practice and knowledge in relevant subjects such as how to plan, organise and conduct controlled delivery, and how to cooperate with other law enforcement agencies.

INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON THE ROLE OF THE CIVIL SOCIETY IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE STRATEGY OF JUSTICE SECTOR REFORM

On 14 October, the EU-funded and Council of Europeimplemented "Democracy Support Programme in Moldova" in co-operation with the Ministry of Justice of the Republic of Moldova and the Moldovan Union of Jurists organised an international conference dedicated to the process of the justice sector reform in Moldova.

The event gathered representatives of all juridical professions, international legal experts, law academics, representatives of the legislative and executive power, civil society etc. with the purpose to present and discuss the degree of involvement of the Moldovan civil society in the process of development of the new Strategy of Justice Sector Reform 2011 – 2016 and its subsequent implementation. The



international experts who were present at the conference shared the experience of their own countries on reformation of the justice sector. The participants welcomed the openness of the Moldovan Government in its collaboration with the civil society acknowledging the importance of the latter's input in the reform process and agreed that a further consolidation of this collaboration is necessary.

EU-FUNDED PROJECT SUPPORTS THE CENTRE FOR HUMAN RIGHTS IN PREVENTION OF ILL-TREATMENTS

The EU-funded and UNDP-implemented "Torture Prevention" project donated on October 12, three cars for the regional offices of the Centre for Human Rights of Moldova, located in Cahul, Balti and Comrat. The project also donated the IT equipment and software for the Intranet System of the Centre for Human Rights, which will be in place by the end of the year, for handling the complaints mechanisms at National Preventive Mechanism and Centre for Human Rights. The total cost of the donation is about 1.5 million MDL. The Centre for Human Rights of Moldova and the National Preventive Mechanism will increase its efficiency and mobility in monitoring places of detention and in handling the complaints.



The Ambassador Dirk Schuebel, Head of the European Union Delegation to Moldova, stated that "regional offices have an extensive role to play in the operations of the ombudsman institution. In light of the nature of its functions, the ombudsman institution must remain close to the people and the human rights problems they encounter in their daily life and in contacts with different authorities. The donated cars and IT equipment will contribute at the developing the institutional capacity of the Centre for Human Rights and its regional offices in exercising its functions focused on human rights protection".

On 12–13 October, the International Global Forum on Migration & Development (GFMD) Policy Seminar "Mainstreaming Migration into Strategic Policy Development" was hosted by the Government of the Republic of Moldova and co-chaired by the Governments of Mali, Jamaica and Bangladesh. The event was carried out with the organizational support of the International Organization for Migration (IOM), Mission to Moldova in partnership with the Global Migration Group (GMG) with the financial support from the EU-funded project "Supporting the implementation of the migration and development component of the EU-Moldova Mobility Partnership" and the Swiss Development Cooperation.

EU-FUNDED PROJECT ENSURED PROPER LEARNING PREMISES FOR THE EMPLOYEES OF PENITENTIARY SYSTEM OF MOLDOVA

The renovated premises of the Training Centre of the Department of Penitentiary Institutions, situated in Goieni, were officially inaugurated on October 11. The Centre was reconstructed with support of about 2 million MDL of "Torture Prevention" project, funded by the European Union and co-financed and implemented by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP).

Being present at the opening ceremony, the Ambassador Dirk Schuebel, Head of the European Union Delegation to Moldova, mentioned that the importance of the Training Centre is crucial in building a learning culture of the penitentiary staff and reducing internal opposition to the reforms. "The Training Centre should be a promoter of the application of the best practices in the field of inmates management, application of progressive



imprisonment schemes and prevention of ill-treatment and torture in prisons; it should be supporter of the reforms of the penitentiary system by educating the staff on the important role penitentiaries play in the process of rehabilitation and reintegration of detainees and on system's place in the larger justice chain", remarked the Ambassador Dirk Schuebel.

AWARENESS CAMPAIGN PROMOTING JOURNALISTIC ETHICS AND MEDIA ACCOUNTABILITY

On 6 October, the Press Council of Moldova launched an awareness campaign promoting journalistic ethics and accountability of media to the public. The campaign is financially supported by the Joint Programme between the Council of Europe and the European Union "Democracy Support in Moldova".

During the month of October and November 2011, an awareness campaign will deliver the message that the professional media should be objective and responsible, and in cases when media fails to observe the ethical norms, foreseen in the Code of Ethics of Journalists, citizens can send complaints to the Press Council. A number of communication channels are used: "light-boxes"-type street banners posted in Chisinau, audio spots in Moldovan state language and Russian language will be broadcasted on radio and promotional banners will be published on web portals and in national and local newspapers.

ENHANCING THE TRAINING SKILLS AND CAPACITIES OF JUDGES AND PROSECUTORS

On 3-14 October, the EU-funded and Council of Europeimplemented "Democracy Support Programme in Moldova" in co-operation with the National Institute of Justice organised two one-week seminars on methodology for judges and prosecutors.

Two Council of Europe experts delivered training to a group of 40 prosecutors and judges in developing and delivering effective seminars in law reform and practices. The participants got acknowledged with different learning styles and training techniques in order to develop understanding of the range of ways in which people learn and enhance the skills in delivering qualitative trainings to their peers on specific subject matters.





BELGIAN SERVICES SHARE STRATEGIC-PLANNING TIPS WITH UKRAINIAN/MOLDOVAN OFFICERS

The Belgian police and customs services have hosted a delegation of 12 border-guard and customs officers from Moldova and Ukraine for a week-long study visit dedicated to sharing knowledge and experience of the organisational strategic planning process.

The 12 officers, accompanied in Brussels from 2-8 October by EUBAM's Strategy, Planning and Performance Office, are all directly or indirectly involved in the monitoring and evaluation of results in their own services. The study visit afforded them an opportunity to examine the strategic-planning best practices of the Belgian services. Among the topics covered during the visit were: the process of elaborating a strategy for the police/customs service; the planning process; the monitoring and evaluation of



planned actions; integrated reporting systems. Those topics are essential parts of the management cycle in every civil service.

MOLDOVAN LOCAL OFFICIALS VISIT SWEDEN TO LEARN GOOD PRACTICES OF ALTERNATIVE ENERGY USAGE AND PRODUCTION TECHNOLOGIES

The EU-funded Renewable Energy project organized a study visit to Sweden for districts' chairmen and representatives of the local and central Governments, NGO sector and Moldova Social Investment Fund (MSIF) staff, during 25 September-1 October.

The Moldovan delegation visited many big thermal and electricity energy production municipality plants from these localities, as well as the Boras Energy Sobacken plant, specialized in managerial waste processing and production of biogas. The EUR 2 million Renewable Energy Project aims to promote sustainable development strategies in the renewable energy technologies sector through piloting of demonstration subprojects based on usage of solar energy and agricultural wastes.



72 facilities (schools, kindergarten, social and health care centres) from rural and urban area will be provided with boilers working based on biomass burning and/or complete solar heating water systems.

PROJECT SYNERGIES TOWARDS COMMUNITY FOREST DEVELOPMENT IN MOLDOVA

Two ongoing projects in Moldova, the EU-funded ENPI FLEG programme in cooperation with a Japanese Grant project, have joined forces to conduct management planning in community forestlands in order to ensure that local communities will preserve forest ecosystems and have community forests able to provide both benefits and habitat for biodiversity.

The NGO Eco-Spectru (under ENPI FLEG) and Forest Research and Management Institute (under Japanese Grant) are jointly undertaking management planning work over 3611,87 ha of community forestlands within 26 village communities throughout the country. Engineer staff the NGO in cooperation with Agency Moldsilva and Forest Research and Management Institute assisted local authorities' personnel (cadastral



specialist or staff responsible for forestland management, if it the case) in developing management plans and project activities to be undertaken.

The products to be delivered to the final beneficiaries, i.e. local public authorities managing forestland, are forest (stand) maps and inventory book of forest resources that will include detailed description of forest/stand composition and structure, type of habitat, harvesting and/or conservation activities, long-term activities likely to be applied, other technical information.
