

GOOD GOVERNANCE, RULE OF LAW AND FUNDAMENTAL FREEDOMS

ADVISORY SUPPORT FOR BORDER POLICE DEPARTMENT

4 December. The Long Term Advisors (LTAs) organized the Progress Report Meeting with Border Police Department (BDP) and IOM Representatives dedicated to the activities carried out by them during 2013.

At the event participated the BPD director, Mr. Dorin Purice, the BPD deputy director, Mr. Ianus Erhan, the representatives of the Human Resource Division of the BPD, project coordinator and project assistant (IOM Mission to Moldova representatives).

The International Long Term Advisor presented the main accomplished results, in terms of revision of the laws, drafting the regulations, elaboration of the documents and assertive feedback and improvement of the different specialized documents. Among them, the draft on the Law regarding the public servant with special status, which has been finalized, debated and agreed on with all MIA subdivisions during a working group organized under the aegis of the Human Resources General Directorate within the Minister of Internal Affairs.



In cooperation with TAIEX tool, LTAs attracted international experts and consultants to assist BPD in its reform and in the development of the occupational standards for the BPD.

WORKSHOP ON AIR BORDER FOR BORDER GUARDS AND BORDER POLICE FROM THE EAP COUNTRIES

27-29 January 2014. Officers from the Border Police Department of the Ministry of Internal Affairs of the Republic of Moldova, working at the Chisinau International Airport along with their colleagues from Armenia and Georgia participated in the Workshop on air border.

It took place in Tbilisi, Georgia, on in the framework of the EU-funded project "Eastern Partnership cooperation in the fight against irregular migration -Supporting the implementation of the Prague Process Action Plan" (EaP-SIPPAP). The workshop was conducted by international experts from Latvia and Slovak

Practitioners working in air border control and representatives of the national border guard training institutions exchanged their experiences of using existing practices and Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs). They also shared their views on the initiation of the review, update or development of inter-agency and international SOPs, manuals and guidelines.



During the workshop, special attention was paid to practical aspects of inter-agency and international cooperation at air borders based on the experiences of Latvia, Slovak Republic and participating EaP countries.

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SOCIAL AND HUMAN DEVELOPMENT

FIVE "MOBILE TEAM" SOCIAL SERVICES HAVE RECEIVED CARS FROM EU FUNDS

On December 5, in Chisinau, five cars for "Mobile Team" social services from the rayons of Anenii Noi, Ungheni, Sîngerei, Dubăsari and Fălești were brought into service for representatives of these rayons.

The cars, worth a total of EUR 36630, were purchased from European Union funds, in order to support the work of the recently established Mobile teams in the five rayons. The car keys were handed in by His Excellency Pirkka Tapiola, EU Ambassador in the Republic of Moldova.

The event was organized by Keystone Moldova Association within the framework of the project "Public-Private Partnership for the Sustainable Development of Locally Governed Disability Services: Supporting Decentralization Reform", implemented with the financial support of the European Union. The project, worth EUR 273436, provides the development of the "Mobile Team" social service in five rayons of the country. As well, the



project provides the implementation of actions aimed at changing society's attitude towards people with disabilities and promoting their rights.

Mrs. Valentina Buliga, the Minister of Labor, Social Protection and Family, present at the event, said that capacity building of social services is a joint task of the MLSPF, the Ministry of Finance and local authorities.

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HEALTH PROFESSIONALS FROM TRANSNISTRIA ARE BETTER PREPARED TO ADDRESS EMERGENCIES

UNICEF and the Association of Perinatal Medicine of Moldova organized four trainings for health professionals from the Transnistrian region to strengthen their knowledge and skills in regard to emergency situations. The first trainings were delivered on November 20-22 and 27-29, 2013, and addressed obstetrical emergencies, including preeclampsia, eclampsia, postpartum haemorrhage, adult's resuscitation and shoulder dystocia. Another couple of trainings were focused on neonatal resuscitation and were organized on December 5 and 12, 2013.

The trainings were designed for multi-disciplinary teams composed of obstetricians, anesthesiologists, neonatologists, midwife and nurses. They combined theory with practical exercises made on complex simulation manikins. Based on real-life simulation scenarios, participants were able to check their knowledge and assess effectiveness of life-saving manipulations.



Altogether, 64 health professionals from the maternities of Tiraspol, Bender, Ribnita and Slobozia benefited from these courses organized at the Simulation Centre hosted by the Research Institute of Mother and Child in Chisinau.

The trainings of health professionals from Transnistrian region were carried out in the framework of the "Support to Confidence Building Measures" Programme, funded by European Union (9.5 million Euro), Swiss Development Cooperation Agency (1.1 million Euro) and UNDP (1.1 million Euro), and implemented by UNDP, UNICEF and WHO.

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MORE THAN 3,000 MOLDOVANS HAVE ACCESSED THE FIRST ONLINE FAIR "JOBS IN MOLDOVA"

During 5-11 December 2013, under the generic "Jobs in Moldova", was held the first online jobs fair in Moldova, organized by the National Agency for Employment in conjunction with the EU project "Strengthening migration management capacities in the Republic of Moldova", and implemented by the Swedish Public Employment Service. Employers have met with the future employees on a single platform, www.e-angajare.md.

The first electronic fair employment was intended for Moldovans abroad, but at the same time, he has not been restricted to Moldovans living in the country. Thus, in real time, over 3,000 Moldovans from any corner of the world, have visited the fair "Jobs in Moldova", by accessing the website www.e-angajare. md or www.angajat.md, and have viewed more than 200 job vacancies with attractive working conditions.



"We live in an era of advanced technologies. This is why we have decided to

support the development of the electronic platform for online fairs of workplaces in Moldova. This experience is already widely used by countries of the European Union and, I hope, the Moldovans will fully benefit from this innovation." mentioned Per Lindberg, director of the EU project.

Online job fairs will help to improve transparency on the labor market in Moldova, as well as to correlate better the demand and supply.

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DEVELOPMENT OF THE POLICE ACADEMY'S TRAINING CAPACITY

12 December 2013. The MIGRECO (Strengthening Migration Management and Cooperation on Readmission in Eastern Europe) Project assisted the Border Police section of the Police Academy in developing training curricula on Migration Management, course readers for future Border Officers and provided supporting equipment for the training process such as an interactive smart board, three laptop computers, a flipchart, a screen, a video recorder and a printer/scanner (circa 15,000 Euro).

The dean of the Socio-Humanitarian Sciences, Mr Stefan Belecciu, and the professor of the National College of the Border Police, Constantin Culicovschi, stressed that the support of the MIGRECO project will facilitate the process through better teaching-learning interaction between professor and students. Mr. Belecciu made a demonstration of the equipment by presenting relevant video materials for BP training.



The IOM project coordinator, Simion Terzioglo, appreciated the Police Academy's good cooperation for the successful accomplishment of an essential project objective which constituted an important start for further development of the Academy's training capacity as implicit contribution to the improvement of migration and border management in the country in line with EU standards and best practice.

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


NATIONAL WORKSHOP ON AMBULATORY CARE SENSITIVE CONDITIONS

On 17-19 December in Chisinau was conducted a national workshop on Ambulatory Care Sensitive Conditions (ACSCs) for national stakeholders and key primary health care specialists 2013 with WHO and EU support.

During the workshop by the national stakeholders presented the reforms that past the primary health care system, what are the current needs and development prospects; there were selected a limited number of ACSCs that are relevant for the country using pre-defined criteria and was discussed how the system needs strengthening in order to successfully treat them in a primary health care settings.

The workshop was organized in the framework of a policy study on ACSCs that has been initiated by WHO Regional Office for Europe, using a standardized tool and being piloted in 5 countries of the region - Republic of Moldova, Germany, Greece, Ukraine, and Kazakhstan. The study aims to contribute to strengthening primary health care settings by identifying challenges and



contextualized and actionable policy recommendations for health service delivery transformation.

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NEXUS MOVES TOWARDS BUILDING THE PLATFORM OF SERVICES FOR MIGRANTS

During December 2013, NEXUS Moldova completed the initial stage of introductory meetings with private sector and civil society organizations (CSOs). This was part of the intensive process of creating the comprehensive platform of services for migrants and their families. NEXUS platform is a place, both physical (local services centers), and virtual (internet portal), where service providers meet migrants to respond to their specific needs for information, consultancy and services in all migration phases.

The NEXUS intro meetings had two objectives: to present in detail the NEXUS approach based on major findings of the Moldovan migrants research conducted in 2013; and to raise the interest of businesses and NGOs in cooperating on the NEXUS platform. Representatives from five private sector areas - transport, construction, recruitment, banking and microfinance - as



well as from CSOs, attended the meetings and showed real interest in NEXUS. For CSOs NEXUS represents a unique platform for developing and providing social services for migrants' families, especially for elderly and children.

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MOLDOVAN LABOUR MARKET FORECAST 2014

January 2014. It is the sixth year in a row the EU funded project "Consolidation of migration management capacities in the Republic of Moldova" supports the elaboration and launch of the Moldovan labour market forecast.

The labor market forecast 2014 is the result of an excellent work done by the employees of the National Employment Agency with the support of Swedish and Lithuanian experts. The main donor of the labour market forecast 2014 is the Ministry of Justice of Sweden. It facilitates the matching of labour market needs with education supply, sets the trends in occupations for the coming year and makes the labor market more transparent.

In the case of Moldova this can be explained through internal mobility of graduates from one occupation to another, not enough supply from education field, poor qualification of graduates (impedes the employment



process). Nevertheless the decisive factor remains to be migration of labour force abroad. Missing a recognition of occupations and professional experience in the receiving countries (mainly EU), Moldova faces a severe brain waste and brain drain. This situation determines the involved parties to take action since migration cannot be stopped, but it can and should be managed better.

On 4 January, 2014, in Chisinau, 33 young Moldovans studying abroad have been awarded at the Gala of Students originating from the Republic of Moldova, 2014 edition.

205 students and graduates from 21 countries of the world applied for the competition. In total, 11 first prizes were awarded, 21 awards for the 4 regions (Central and Eastern Europe, Western Europe, US and Canada, other continents), as well as the prize for the best Moldovan Student in the categories: "Arts", "Organizing Team Sympathy" and "Special Prize of the Prime Minister of the Republic of Moldova".

The winners got diplomas of the organizing team: I, II and III degree diplomas on behalf of the Prime Minister of Moldova, as well as 18 Olympus cameras, 11 lap tops Asus Nexus, 4 Kindles and one Canon camera.



Gala of Students originating from the Republic of Moldova was organized under the auspices of the Prime Minister of the Republic of Moldova, Mr Iurie Leancă, at the initiative of a group of young people from Diaspora and the Bureau for Diaspora Relations. The event was organized with the support of the EU Project "Consolidation of Migration Management Capacities in the Republic of Moldova".

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NATIONAL HUMAN RESOURCES FOR HEALTH MANAGEMENT AND GOVERNANCE TRAINING COURSE

The national trainings in the Human Resources for Health Management and Governance course, with the support of the Ministry of Health and WHO Country Office, is being organized by the School of Public Health Management, started on the 20th of January, 2014.

Over 180 managers and heads of HR of the national health institutions will attend the training in the period of January-April 2014, with 9 study groups being organized.

The aim of the training course is to build capacity and offer new tools to enable health-care managers to deal with shortage of health personnel, motivational mechanisms and health workforce planning. The training topics included the global and regional policies in human recourses in health, relevance of the WHO Global Code of Practice on the International Recruitment of Health Personnel, medical education, mobility of health personnel, data base, recruitment and selection, retention policies, etc.



The ongoing process of strengthening the capacity of the Republic of Moldova to manage the migration of Moldovan health professionals is related to the EU-funded project "Better Managing the Mobility of the Health Professionals in the Republic of Moldova".

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SECOND LOCAL STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING OF THE MIGRECO PROJECT

23 January 2014. The International Organization for Migration (IOM), Mission in Moldova, held the Second Steering Committee Meeting of the Moldovan component of the EU funded project "Strengthening Migration Management and Cooperation on Readmission in Eastern Europe (MIGRECO)".

The event gathered about 35 representatives from ministries, international organizations and civil society. The Steering Committee focused on the progressive report of the Moldovan component of this regional EU-funded project under the EC Thematic Programme on Migration and Asylum 2012, which is coordinated regionally by the IOM office in Kiev.

Dorin Purice, the Director of the Border Police Department, welcomed participants to the meeting in the conference room of the Border Police Department of the MIA. He stressed the highly important assistance to the institution the MIGRECO project provides through the development of the



human resource concept, advisory mission and Migration Management curricula for the border-security students.

Andrei Vrabie, Project Manager, Justice and Home Affairs within European Union Delegation to Republic of Moldova, congratulated the participants for the accomplished results of the MIGRECO project and reiterated the EU commitment to provide further assistance to Moldova for the next period in three main areas: border management, migration management, security and public order.

LAUNCHING OF A NEW EU PROJECT ON STRENGTHENING THE MOLDOVAN TRANSPLANT AGENCY

On 29 January 2014, was officially launched the Twinning Project "Strengthening the Transplant Agency of the Republic of Moldova and Support in Legal Approximation in the Area of Quality and Safety of Substances of Human Origin". This is the first Twinning Project in Republic of Moldova that activates in the health sector and will have a duration of 2 years.

The overall objective of the Project is to contribute to a better quality and safety of transplantations of human organs, tissues, and cells in the Republic of Moldova. The benchmarks are: positive European Commission opinion on the progress made in the transplant management area; the transplant system of the Republic of Moldova fulfills the norms and quality and safety standards of the EU.

Making his opening remarks, His Excellency, Mr Pirkka Tapiola, the Head of the

Delegation of the European Union to the R. Moldova commented: "I am very confident that the team of this project will work together for the success of the upgrade of the Transplant system, for the good of all patients currently waiting for transplants and also for all the potential donors that would accept to help someone else or even to save that someone else's life"

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TRADE AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

JOURNALISTS AND COMMUNICATORS FROM REPUBLIC OF MOLDOVA DISCOVER THE AUSTRIAN **EXPERIENCE IN RECOVERING ENERGY FROM BIOMASS**

19 December 2013 - A group of journalists and communicators from Republic of Moldova have met the experience of Austria in using the renewable energy. In the period of 16-21 December, 13 journalists and communicators visited locations/projects that a using and producing energy from biomass, and also met the mass media institutions, NGO's active in this particular sector, as well as Austrian Energy Agency representatives.

The objective of the study visit was to learn the Austrian experience in using biomass energy and other renewable energy sources, and also get acquainted with Mass-media in promoting the topics on renewable sources, its impact on public opinion and decision makers.

During 5 days the journalists visited enterprises that produce solid biofuel, companies that produce biomass boilers, and localities that are using at a large scale the energy from renewable sources.



The Study visit was financed by EU-UNDP Project "Energy and Biomass" and co-financed by the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO) and Global Energy Fund (GEF).

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GREEN ENERGY CREATES NEW OPPORTUNITIES FOR WOMEN

24 December 2013 - Ludmila Abramciuc from the town of Balti in Moldova, leaves everyone in awe when she announces that since 2008 she is managing a biomass briquette production company.

The woman confessed that there were many difficulties, but she managed to address them gracefully. It has been a challenge to demonstrate to her business partners that besides excelling in the kitchen, she can successfully lead of a company - "Ecobricheta" LLC, that operates in a field primarily dominated by men - the energy efficiency sector.

"At the beginning, my business partners, and even my employees, regarded me somewhat suspiciously. They probably doubted whether I could 'make it' in the energy field, where one encounters mostly men than women. In spite of this, their doubts vanished the moment they realized they are talking to a professional. In fact, having many years of hands-on experience in the recycling



industry has helped me a great deal in managing the present company. Moreover, I am pleased with the fact that I managed to create 15 new jobs", proudly states Ludmila Abramciuc.

2012 ECONOMIC STIMULATION IN RURAL AREA BUDGET SUPPORT PROGRAMME (ESRA BSP) PAYMENT TRANCHE TRANSFERRED IN FULL TO MOLDOVAN TREASURY

24 December, 2014 in the premises of the Moldovan Ministry of Economy, HE Valeriu Lazar, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Economy of the Republic of Moldova and HE Pirkka Tapiola, Head of the European Union Delegation to the Republic of Moldova, announced that the European Commission transferred the amount of 13 mln Euro to the Government of Moldova's treasury account during the second half of October, 2013. This amount represents a full disbursement of the 2012 Economic Stimulation in Rural Area Budget Support Programme (ESRA BSP) payment tranche.

According to HE Pirkka Tapiola, Head of the European Union Delegation in Chisinau, this full payment transfer "is a major success for all involved and clearly demonstrates that a constructive and effective partnership between the European Union and the Government of Moldova does have a real impact on the working and living conditions of ordinary citizens living in the rural areas of the



 $Republic of Moldova\ by\ creating\ new\ small\ and\ medium\ sized\ businesses, generating\ well-paid\ jobs\ and\ improving\ rural\ infrastructure".$

The total EU financial support to the ESRA BSP programme during 2010-2013 has been 59 mn Euro.

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EU PROJECTS HELPS THE USE OF REMITTANCES FOR NEW BUSINESSES AND JOBS CREATION

January 2014. In the framework of the "Support the use of remittances for new businesses and jobs creation" EU Project, monitoring visits have been organized and held in Dubasari and Ialoveni Districts.

During visits were monitored 5 new established businesses for who were elaborated business plans, consultancy starting from the registration of enterprise till its startup.

In January, the Coordinators after implementing last year objectives and activities made a review of each 150 new established businesses especially for the best ones who will be published in the Success Stories Brochures for 30 enterprises, brochure that will be disseminated in February-March 2014.

Also in January an individual post creation visit was made for a new established cow farm in Anenii Noi. At the visit the local coordinator explained the accounting procedures and conversion to ecologic products. The enthusiasm



of making ecologic products came after the visit that was made in October in Romania to a similar cow farm having already 2 year in ecological circuit.

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MOLDOVA ECO-ENERGETICA CONTEST HAS GOT AN OPTIMISED REGULATION

8 February 2014 - New rules for participating in and conducting Moldova Eco-Energetica Contest have been developed following the analysis of all Contest phases and review of results collected from the post-event opinion poll. Also, the Moldova Eco-Energetica Coordination Board members, gathered at a meeting on 7 February 2014, set up that the Contest Awarding Ceremony would take place annually, on the first Friday of December.

Deputy Prime Minister Valeriu Lazar, who chaired the Board Meeting, stressed that the Contest proved it paramount importance over time, and had become a milestone for the remarkable achievements in the area of energy efficiency and renewables. The participating Projects stem from success stories and serve as examples and incentives for other people, having inspired them.

In order to offer enough time to those interested to participate in Moldova Eco-Energetica Contest, the Fourth Edition, it has been decided to extend the file submission period.

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THE BETTER BUSINESS OF CLEAN ENERGY

17 January 2013 - Moldova's move towards renewable energy supplies has brought a boom in the biomass fuel business. Since the fuel is relatively clean and inexpensive, it's a triple win for consumers, businesses and the environment.

Entrepreneur Oleg Donoaga set up one of the country's first companies to transform plant debris into biomass briquettes and pellets, which can be burned in special furnaces for heat. In just two years, AgroBioBrichet has grown from a start-up enterprise to one of Moldova's major producers, manufacturing enough fuel each year to heat 30 public buildings.

"We took a risk in an underdeveloped market," Mr Donoaga recalls with pride, surveying a thriving factory where workers shovel piles of straw and agricultural waste into machines that compress them into log-like briquettes. These are easy to handle and transport, and burn efficiently. Every tonne replaces about 800 kilogrammes of coal.



Mr Donoaga credits a partnership between the European Union and UNDP with helping his business get off the ground—part of a whole new industry that takes Moldova closer to a future of sustainable energy use. The partnership stands behind the largest renewable energy project in the country. It takes a two-pronged supply and demand approach.

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
PROJECT HOLDS 5TH PROJECT STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING

January 2014. Journalists from Moldova (including Transnistrian region), Russia and Ukraine are partnering by posting various information on an interactive regional news portal http://infomost.org/.

The portal was created within the project "Building bridges between NGOs, business associations and media from Moldova, Ukraine and Russia for conflict prevention in Transnistria", implemented by East Europe Foundation – Moldova (EEF-M) from the financial resources of the European Union. The Swedish Government and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Denmark are co-financing the project.

Since the launch of the project journalists working in local and national media from the mentioned countries benefited of training sessions that helped them gain new knowledge on the distribution of information on community development, refraining from geopolitical or politicized perspectives.



Now the participants of the trainings have the opportunity to apply the gained knowledge by delivering materials to be published on the regional news portal.

GRANTS COMPETITION "BUILDING BRIDGES, FACING CHALLENGES"

January 2014. East Europe Foundation – Moldova with the financial support of European Union, Swedish Government and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Denmark, finalized the registration of applications within the announced Grants Competition "Building Bridges, Facing Challenges".

More than 30 applications were received by EEF-M by the indicated deadline, having as applicants more than 60 organizations from both banks of the Nistru River . The Grants Competition is part of the project "Building bridges between NGOs, business associations and media from Moldova, Ukraine and Russia for conflict prevention in Transnistria".

The aim of the grant scheme is to develop a culture of programmatic cooperation between civil society actors from Moldova, including the Transnistrian region, involving local stakeholders, such as businesses, business associations, local administration, media etc. The increased cooperation and the accompa-
