Regional Office for Central Asia

- One of the biggest UNODC regional offices
- Gradual expansion of regional coverage (5 CA states and Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia)
- Volume of programme activities grown up from \$26 million in 2004 over \$90 mln. in 2013.



I. Intelligence Analysis and Sharing



- Develop the capacity of national drug intelligence units of each country into a full national criminal intelligence resource.
- Build systems and/or strengthen the capacities of each country in information/intelligence/data collection, collating, processing, analysis and exchange, at national and regional level.



Intelligence Analysis and Sharing (cont.)

- Create and maintain databases in drug trafficking and other related forms of organized crime.
- Establish CARICC as the regional focal point for communication, analysis and exchange of 'real time' operational information on cross-border crime, as well as a centre for the organization and coordination of joint operations.



II. Border Liaison Offices

- Identify the most important and high-risk border areas (checkpoints) to be strengthened through an analysis of seizures and other information/ intelligence;
- Conduct National Commander Seminars for drug law enforcement agencies situated in the selected high risk border areas in order to raise awareness of the background and objectives of BLOs;
- Identify ways of improving existing cross-border cooperation and improving skills and knowledge in the areas of risk assessment, profiling and selection of people, vehicles and cargo.





III. Securing Green Borders - Mobile Interdiction Teams

- Identify the most important and high-risk border areas (green) to be strengthened and where MOBITs can be established through an analysis of seizures and other information/ intelligence including satellite imagery;
- Establish Standard Operating Procedures for MOBITs;
- Provide training and equipment to each team;
- Develop mentoring systems to monitor teams' operational capacity and performance;
- Improve intelligence collection mechanism using advanced technology including GPS, video and still cameras; and
- Provide parent agencies provided with more extensive information database

- Container Control Programme (CCP) Central Asian Segment
- Paris Pact Initiative, Phase III- A Partnership to counter the trafficking and consumption of opiates originating in Afghanistan
- Regional Programme for Afghanistan and neighboring countries

- Strengthening control along the Tajik/Afghan border
- Tajikistan Drug Control Agency (DCA)
- Strengthening drug and related crime control measures in the selected checkpoints in Kazakhstan



<u>Strengthening Border Control &</u> <u>Cross-Border Cooperation</u> (Regional projects)

- Computer based drug law enforcement training in the member countries of the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)
- Countering the trafficking of Afghan opiates via the northern route by enhancing the capacity of key border crossings points (BCPs) and through the establishment of Border Liaison Offices (BLOs)
- Pilot project on counter-narcotics training of Central Asian and Afghan law enforcement personnel


Component - 1 Uzbekistan – Tajikistan






Components 2-3 Tajikistan – Kyrgyzstan-Uzbekistan




BLO Mechanism in South East Asia












CARICC could be used as a real-time information sharing center













Effective Responses for Drug Abuse and HIV/AIDS Prevention, Treatment and Care

- Prevention of drug use, HIV/AIDS and crime among young people through family skills training programmes in lowand middle-income countries
- Partnership for Action on Comprehensive Treatment (PACT) - Treating drug dependence and its health consequences / OFID-UNODC Joint Programme to prevent HIV/AIDS through Treatment Phase II
- Effective HIV/AIDS prevention and care among vulnerable populations in Central Asia and Azerbaijan



Effective Responses for Drug Abuse and HIV/AIDS Prevention, Treatment and Care

- Capacity building for a more effective HIV/AIDS prevention among vulnerable populations in Eastern Europe (Azerbaijan, Moldova, Ukraine) and Central Asia (Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan)
- Support of national drug abuse prevention measures in Kazakhstan



<u>Strengthening National Capacities in Countering</u> <u>Transnational Organized Crime, Corruption, Money</u> <u>Laundering & Terrorism</u>
