Speaking after the caravan had ended, Ambassador Clarke commended efforts by UWABA describing is as a prime example of a community based organisation working on an entirely volunteer basis.

UWABA's members contribute their time to advocate for better conditions for cyclists, educate cyclists on cycle safety and organise community events such as the cycle caravan.

"Everyone can make a difference. Volunteering your time, volunteering your energy and vitality, volunteering your skills and knowledge. Giving this for free, to help others - there can be no nobler cause," Ambassador Clarke said.

In his speech, UWABA's Chairman, Mejah Mbuya, called upon the government to take measures against people and businesses that have encroached on road reserves and special lanes for cyclists and pedestrians.

Responding to the call Minister Magufuli urged urban authorities to enforce laws without fear or favour. In an amazing tribute to UWABA's efforts, he promised to see to it that all roads to be constructed in the country provide space for cyclists and other road users for their safety.

ON Sunday May 8, 2011 major highways in Dar es Salaam were coloured in orange. Over 400 cyclists including the disabled turned up for a special cycle caravan that was organised by the Dar es Salaam Cyclists Organisation (UWABA) to promote road safety. UWABA is run entirely by volunteers.

This was part of celebrations to mark European Union Week and the European Year of Volunteer-



ing-2011.

The cyclists were dressed in orange reflector jackets with messages-Volunteer: Make a Difference.

Tanzania's Minister for Works, Dr. John Magufuli, French Ambassador to Tanzania, Jacques Champagne de Labriolle alongside the EU Ambassador to Tanzania, Tim Clarke and staff from the Delegation of the EU and EU Missions in Tanzania also participated in the caravan.

The caravan started and ended at the famous Mnazi Mmoja Grounds near the city centre and passed through the city's main roads i.e. Bibi Titi Mohammed Road, Ali Hassan Mwinyi Road, Kawawa Road and Uhuru Street.

Volunteering for Road Safety in Zanzibar

ON Wednesday May 11 European Union Ambassador to Tanzania, Tim Clarke and the Zanzibar Deputy Minister for Infrastructure and Communications, Issa Haji Ussi, launched the Decade of Action for Road Safety in the isles as part of celebrations to mark Europe Week and European Year of Volunteering.

The launch was preceded by a procession by school children, parents and members of the public from Lumumba Primary School to Malindi Grounds near Stone Town. Ambassador Clarke, and his wife Anne joined the march which was led by a Brass Band from Zanzibar Police.

Deputy Minister Ussi received the procession at Malindi grounds. In his speech, he said that the event was part of a global launch of the United Nations' Decade of Action for Road Safety that aims to reduce road accidents by 50 percent by 2020.

Zanzibar Traffic Officer Makame Ali Makame said that several efforts were made to reduce accidents on the roads in the Isles.

He mentioned a special programme-*Usalama Wetu Kwanza* (Our Safety First) by the Police Force through which school children



are taught about their safety while at school or during going and returning from school including road safety. The programme is done by police officers on voluntary basis.

Ambassador Clarke commended efforts by the Police Force and all other stakeholders in reducing road accidents and promised full support from EU in the drive.

The launch was organised by an international NGO advocating for road safety-AMEND in collaboration with the Zanzibar Police Force, Ministry of Infrastructure and Communication with support from EU.
