European affairs are too important to be left only to politicians!

For the European Union to be a continued success European citizens need to be involved and feel part of this very dynamic process of development and change. The reforms and changes that come with being a candidate country are not just a paper exercise but will have a real impact on all aspects of everyday life.

I warmly congratulate the European Movement on their sustained efforts in promoting European values in the country. Together with all other civil society organisations, they contribute to the strengthening of the strong European spirit which exists here. We will continue to work with you and the authorities in partnership to maintain Europe at the top of our agendas.

The Delegation of the European Union celebrates Europe Day in close collaboration with the European Movement. I am personally delighted that we are able to work with you to organise public debates and various other events that stimulate discussion of EU topics.
