Fifth meeting of the EU-Ukraine Cooperation Committee

The f if the meeting of -Unitarine EU Cooperation Committee was held on 27 November in Brussels. The Cooperation Committee ssists the Wantisterial level Cooperation Council, which has been established under the EU Traine Partnership & Cooperation Agreement (PCA) supervise the implementation to the Agreement

The EU side was chaired by MMM garelli, Director, DG Ex ternal Relation whereas the Ukrainian delegation was headed Manyster Shlapak from the Manistony Economy and European Integration

During the meeting of the Cooperation Committee Ukrainian and European representatives discussed current questions of the cooperation between the EU and hUkrainmaentowork of the PCAThe parties discussed the impact of EU enlargement on Ukraine, the New Neighbours Initiative and Ukrain European choice Folioup Further points were:

- Approx imation of Ukrainian legislation to standsdards
- Trade and Investment
- Justice and Home Af f airs
- Energy and Nuclear Sector
- Environment
- Transport
- Science and Technology

All issues were discussed in a constructive mannihorth sides underlined the importance continuing proviorities the processof approx imatifolderainian legislation to the Community legislation In this context he, role of the EU Tacis funded arinian-European Policy and Legal Advice Centre (UEPLAC) was reconfirmed

On Trade and Investment teh EU side recalled the need for a stable legal framework, transparent modification to tax ation system, simplified administrative procedures and effective handling of problems related to, muslen coessarby welements for improving the overall investment dimate Topical issues, such as the trainian legislation for automobiles sector, VAT refunds, Intellectual Property Rights legislation trade in steel products were raised. The Ukrainian side raise four issues: EU support for Ukraine's WAO accession, and in particular signature of the bilateral protocol; changes to the EUs cereals import regime;

Ukraine's request for Market Economy Status in relation to trade defence instruments; and trade impactofEU enlargement.

On Justice and-home Af fairs (JHA) the EU welcomed intensif-implemention with Ukraine on the basis of the JHA action Applanal priorities were already endorsed by the 11 November EU Troika-Ukraine meeting atministerial level, these being: readmission and migration issues, border management, and combating money laundering, trafficking in human beings, drugs and corruption. Ukraine shared the generally positive assessment of -goline go mork in this sector, and highlighteds the need to continue discussion on visa issues.

Positive cooperation was also noted in the areas of Transport, Science and Technology, Environment and Customs. Both sides agreed that further discussions and structural reforms are needed in the Energy section duding on tinue oprivatisation.

Of shared concern was the improvement of coalmineinsal Meeting. The European Commission is of finger technical assistance in support.

Nuclear safety was stressed as a continued joint priority and the bilateral Agreement for Cooperation between the European Atomic Energy Community and the Cabinet of Winisters of Ukraine in the Peaceful Uses of Winisters initialed.

Ukrainian and European representatives on firmed the importance of the Partnership & Cooperation Agreement as a viable instrument for substantial damod-copy dranticen. The assessment of the PCA will be continued in order to finalise a joint report by the time next Coperation Councidue to take place in first half of 2008
