BACKGROUND

Since 2002, ECHO has funded **humanitarian aid projects in Zimbabwe** for a total of nearly <u>€181</u> <u>million</u> addressing **emergency and recovery needs** in the fields of health, nutrition, water and sanitation and food security.

ECHO is currently implementing a Financial Decision of <u>5 million Euros</u> addressing the **transition** between humanitarian needs and development.

Areas of ECHO intervention

- ECHO's funding to humanitarian activities remains one of the largest contributions in Zimbabwe.
- Through the NGO and UN partners and in close collaboration with government institutions ECHO addresses emergency needs mainly in the fields of health, water and sanitation and food security.
- Over the years, ECHO's contributions have evolved from an emergency response to a more targeted assistance focusing in the most vulnerable groups and aiming at improving the population's resilience.
- **Health**: ECHO has been actively involved in supporting the Zimbabwean health structures and drug supply chain at central and local level, particularly during epidemic outbreaks. Since 2011,

significant investments were made in disease surveillance and early warning systems as well as in emergency treatment facilities to be used during outbreaks.

- Water&Sanitation: Through its support to NGOs, UNICEF and city councils, ECHO has financed
 the improvement of urban and rural water supply facilities of areas more at risk of epidemic
 outbreaks. Most of the assistance has now shifted to support communities and enhance local
 capacities.
- **Food Security**: ECHO's contributions have evolved from emergency food assistance to food security interventions aiming at improving diet diversity and additional sources of income for the most vulnerable segments of the population, including urban population.
- ECHO's partners have also addressed the needs of refugees, deportees and other mobile vulnerable populations.
