#### Organisation: European Federation for Intercultural Learning (EFIL)

Project: “Intercultural Understanding through EU-Japan Youth Exchanges”

The project aims to increase the quality and quantity of youth exchanges between EU and Japan by developing the competencies of volunteer youth workers through the practical experience of an exchange. Youth workers from the EU and Japan specialised in intercultural exchanges will be invited to spend one month in either the EU or in Japan to receive training in helping young people to appreciate and

understand the culture of the other partner.

### **Organisation: Tapisserie et Arts du Tissue (Belgium)**

**Project: “Fascinating Japanese Textiles” 5ème Triennale Internationale des Arts du Tissue de Tournai**

The Triennale (4 June to 11 September 2005) is a major international exhibition of contemporary art on textiles. Japan is the theme of the Triennale in 2005. 15 Japanese artists will be exhibited. ### **Organisation: Filminitiative Dresden (Germany)**

**Project: “Film Exchange Japan - Europe”**

Initiative for a long term film exchange between Europe and Japan through the presentation of European short, digital and long feature films in Japan and through the introduction of animations, short and long feature film from Japan in Europe. With talks between filmmakers and audiences, the emphasis is on encouraging a dialogue to raise awareness of the respective cultures.

### **Organisation : D 4 Communication and Video (Italy)**

**Project: Lifestyle, Art, Culture. EU-Japan Face to Face”**

The project aims to promote better mutual understanding between the EU and Japan, through three main actions: a television film about traditional and contemporary Japan; a bilateral workshop dealing with urban culture; and an event-forum with Japanese and European artists.

### **Organisation: Fondation Royaumont (France)**

**Project: Sources and creation in dance and music in today’s Japan**

This cultural centre hosts Japanese dancers and composers for residencies and public performances of their creations, as well as public performances of traditional Kagura dances choreographed by a European artist.

### **Organisation: Natural History Museum of Latvia (NHML)**

**Project: Inspirations from Japan: Conversations between Nature, Art and Science**

Project comprises exhibitions, films and lectures introducing Japanese culture to Latvians, built around the themes of Japanese temples, shrines and gardens; Japan seen by Latvian photographers and the life and work of the Japanese physicist Ukichiro Nakaya.

## **Organisation: European Policy Centre, Brussels**

### **Project: Japan-EU Think Tank Roundtables - next steps in global governance**

Thinktank roundtables between the EU and Japan on Global Governance, bringing together analysts and researchers to discuss the prospects for more effective multilateralism. Complemented by public forums and the envisioned research and inter-regional academic exchange will lead to recommendations for EU and Japanese policymakers.

## **Organisation: Public Institution Pazaislis Music Festival (Lithuania)**

### **Project: JAPANotion**

JAPANotion is aimed at young musicians and general music lovers: it comprises Master Classes and concerts of young musicians; lectures on Japanese music and performances of new commissioned pieces by the young composer H.Kozakura and concerts and piano master classes of Mitsuko Uchida, as well as concerts of the Tokyo String Quartet.
