

The **Asia-Europe Meeting (ASEM)** is a unique, informal platform for dialogue and cooperation between Asia and Europe on the big challenges of a fast-changing world, such as connectivity, trade and investment, climate change, but also broad security challenges such as counter-terrorism, migration, maritime security and cyber issues. Bringing together 53 partners from across Europe and Asia, ASEM is the main multilateral platform linking Europe and Asia with significant global weight: ASEM partners represent 60% of global GDP, 60% of global population and 60% of global trade. For more than 20 years, ASEM has been the most comprehensive partnership between Asia and Europe, crossing hands across continents.

ASEM's main purpose is to provide a platform to foster political dialogue, strengthen economic cooperation and tackle global challenges together. In many respects, recent developments in the international landscape have increased the value of ASEM as a key building block for an open, cooperative and rules-based international system.

ASEM is conducted as an informal and flexible process on the basis of equal partnership, mutual respect and mutual benefit. It aims to promote the exchange of ideas and best practices and thus act as a breeding ground for new policy ideas. In short, ASEM is the most influential comprehensive partnership between Asia and Europe, boosting connectivity in all its dimensions between the two regions.

The ASEM Family ASEM Partners

The Asia-Europe Foundation (ASEF),

based in Singapore, is an international, not-for-profit foundation, and acts as the only permanent Institution of ASEM. ASEF is charged with promoting cultural, intellectual and people-topeople contacts between the two regions.

- The Asia-Europe Parliamentary Partnership (ASEP) promotes cooperation between parliaments in Europe and Asia and offers parliamentarians an opportunity to influence the ASEM process.
- The Asia-Europe Peoples' Forum (AEPF) is the 'grass roots' level of ASEM and serves as an interregional network of civil society and societal movements across Asia and Europe.
- The Asia-Europe Business Forum (AEBF) aims to enhance businessto-business dialogue and cooperation between the two regions and to provide opportunity for interaction between business and political leaders.

The initial ASEM partnership which was inaugurated in Bangkok, Thailand on 1-2 March 1996 consisted of just 15 EU member states and 7 ASEAN member states plus China, Japan, Korea and the European Commission.

Today ASEM comprises 51 partner countries and two institutional partners: the European Union and the ASEAN Secretariat.

Funding to support the EU's engagement in ASEM comes from the European Union's Partnership Instrument (PI), under which the EU cooperates with partners around the world to advance the Union's strategic interests and tackle global challenges. The PI is funding activities that carry the EU's agendas with partner countries forward, translating political commitments into concrete measures. Specific PI funding is made available to ASEM through the project "Advancing the EU's role in multilateral fora in Asia"', which aims to promote EU security, political and economic interests by strengthening the EU's engagement in different multilateral fora in Asia. These objectives are pursued by sensitising ASEAN, ASEM and ARF to EU goals and contributions to multilateral fora in Asia.

Ministerial Meetings Economic,

Finance, Environment, Culture, Transport, Labour and Employment, Education, Science and Technology, ICT, Small and Medium Enterprises ministers meet on a regular basis to discuss issues of mutual concern. Additional ministerial conferences are held irregularly on specific issues and areas that are not covered by the main ministerial meetings.

Senior Officials' Meetings bring together high-level civil servants from the Foreign Ministries of all ASEM partners for the overall coordination of the ASEM process. Sectoral SOMs are also held in preparation of the various Ministerial meetings.

ASEM provides a platform for meetings not only of Heads of State and Government, ministers and senior officials, but also puts a strong focus on fostering peopleto-people contacts among all in the representatives and youth.

ASEM has no secretariat. Foreign ministers and their senior officials have an overall coordinating role within the ASEM process. They are assisted by an informal group of coordinators (two from the Asian side - representing the ASEAN and non-ASEAN (NESA) groups - and two from the European side - the European External Action Service (EEAS) as the permanent coordinator and the rotating EU Presidency).

In a globalised world, working together across these three pillars makes ASEM an important platform for dialogue and communication, and for promoting a common vision of peace, prosperity and sustainable development in both regions.



ASEM SUMMIT



1994

Singapore and France propose that an EU-Asia summit meeting be held, to consider how to build a new partnership between the two regions.

1996

The first ASEM Summit is held in Bangkok in March 1996, with 15 EU member states and 10 Asian countries participating, as well as the European Commission. Since then, the ASEM family has continued to grow through successive rounds of enlargement to 53 ASEM Partners today.



2006

ASEM celebrates its 10th anniversary by adopting the 'Helsinki Declaration on the Future of ASEM', reasserting ASEM's role as a catalyst in EU-Asia relations.

2016

ASEM marks its 20th anniversary Summit in Mongolia, looking forward to the challenges of the 21st century.
