ARISE+ supports ASEAN economic integration and trade connectivity in the areas of trade facilitation, customs and transport, quality standards in food safety and pharmaceuticals, civil aviation, intellectual property rights, economic and trade statistics and integration monitoring (€90 million).

The European Investment Bank supports the ASEAN Catalytic Green Finance Facility (ACGF), with €150 million, aiming at accelerating the development of green infrastructure and attracting more private investment in the sector. The EIB has provided financing of €1.8bn for over 30 projects in the region, mobilising investments of up to €10.7bn in key sectors including rural development, transport, energy and renewable energy, water and waste management, as well as support to Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs).



HORIZON2020 EU and ASEAN collaborate on research projects in areas including health, food, ICT, environment and nano-technologies.



ERASMUS + Since 2014 over 10,500 students and staff from ASEAN universities have received scholarships and almost 5,700 European students and staff have studied or taught in ASEAN countries.



SHARE enhances the quality, competitiveness, harmonisation and internationalisation of ASEAN higher education, institutions and students, strengthening regional cooperation (€15 million).
