Fact sheet - EU Cooperation Programmes in Malawi

- Overall strategy: Malawi and EU signed in May 2015 the new national indicative programme up to 2020 for an amount of EUR 560m which includes EUR 250 m for Agriculture, Food Security and Nutrition, EUR 160m for Secondary, Technical and Vocational Education and EUR 120m for Governance.
- Water: Over last 5 years, access to safe drinking water for 1 million Malawians. By 2017 a further 500,000 Malawians will be added.
- Sanitation: 5,701 villages triggered through Community Led Total Sanitation on Open Defecation Free (ODF) campaign, 1,095 villages ODF verified, and 5 Traditional Authorities certified as ODF. In addition, over 109,200 pupils from 182 schools have been provided with improved sanitation and hand wash facilities.
- Rural roads: between 2012 and 2015, rehabilitation of about **2450 km of rural roads** and **217 bridges**. Providing over **40,000 jobs**. Under the new Rural Roads Improvement Programme (RRImP), 1,200km will be rehabilitated in 12 selected districts (2017-2020)
- Secondary Education: 21 Community Day Secondary Schools will be rehabilitated, teachers trained/upgraded, and provided with equipment, teaching and learning materials. 33 technical workshops will be rehabilitated and equipped.
- Technical and vocational training: The Polytechnic, 3 trade testing centres, 4 technical colleges, 10 community colleges and 10 community skills development centres will be rehabilitated and equipped, instructors trained and sector management improved.
- **Irrigation:** EU supports the **Green Belt Initiative** with the development of medium and large scale irrigation schemes for a total of 1,800 ha by early 2019 which will benefit 45,000 people.
- Sugar: EU facilitated development of 1,300ha of smallholder irrigated sugarcane. Average level of net income of smallholder farmer has doubled in 5 years to reach MWK 840,000.
- Social protection: ongoing EU Social cash transfers benefits more than 65,000 extremely poor households (over 269,000 people) in 7 districts.
- **Gender:** 376 Village Savings and Loan (VSL) Groups targeting 23,898 members (3,823 males and 20,075 females) have been established across in target 13 districts to provide members with start-up capital for establishment of small scale businesses;
- **Gender**: The programme has supported the functionality of **mother groups** in 13 targeted districts where approximately **2,500** school drop-out girls have since been mobilized and go back to school.
- Nutrition: the EU school meals programme benefited more than 200,000 children in 2014.
- **Resilience to Climate Change:** EU ongoing support benefits **43,000 vulnerable people** (7,200 households) in 4 districts in the south.
- Forestry: EU support has resulted so far in protection of 35,000 hectares of forests.

- Civic education: EU supports National Initiative for Civic Education which is reaching out to communities in all districts of Malawi.
- Access to Justice: EU supports the Judiciary and the Directorate on Public Prosecution with a Case Management System to improve access to justice
- Over 26,000 cases resolved in villages through the EU supported Village Mediation Programme implemented by Paralegal Advisory Services Institute thereby reducing the workload of the Police and the Courts.
- EU Constructed a new Annex Building of the Law Faculty at the Chancellor College to enable the country train more lawyers. These lawyers help the society at large in entrenching democratic principles.
- **Prison conditions**: EU installed **80 electric cooking pots** in **17 prison centres** to improve living conditions in prisons and at the same time reduce environmental degradation.
- **Business enabling environment**: with EU support, the NSO's Trade Map and MITC's Information Trade Portal were launched in November 2015, allowing for informed business decisions and trade policy making. The **Malawi Bureau of Standards** has also been supported with new equipment and infrastructures.
- **Mining**: A countrywide EU-WB supported **airborne geophysical survey** of areas with mining potential has been completed, promoting the sector to future investors.
