Support to the WHO
(€20 million) for

Grant funding for NGOs (€6 million) to support the government to tackle the health emergency and mitigate economic, social and health impacts. Support to economic recovery, while enhancing social protection mechanisms through immediate impact measures, such as scaling up cash transfers, insurance, and food security
