## STATEMENT

## by EU High Representative Catherine Ashton on the election of a new Head of State of the Transition in the Central African Republic

The High Representative of the European Union for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy and Vice President of the Commission issued the following statement today:

"On 20 January the members of the National Transition Council in the Central African Republic elected Ms Catherine Samba-Panza as Head of State of the Transition. I commend the National Transition Council for its compliance with the provisions of the Constitutional Charter during the vote and I extend my congratulations to Ms Samba-Panza, wishing her every success.

This election is a significant first step towards restoring Central African authorities, responsible for completing the transition process. I call upon Ms Samba-Panza to proceed as soon as possible to appoint a new Prime Minister and government able to dedicate themselves to meeting the complex challenges facing the country.

The European Union is willing to work with the new government to restore order, rebuild the State and provide humanitarian assistance to the people."
