## OPENING REMARKS

## by HRVP at the 3rd European Union-League of Arab States Ministerial meeting

"Dear Ministers, dear Secretary General, dear Ambassadors,

The first meeting that was called in Malta in 2008 before I was in office responded to the need to forge a structured relationship between the European Union and the League of Arab States. I think that has been strengthened considerably, especially when we have seen some of the great changes that have taken place in the region. And at the meeting that I was privileged to be at in Cairo in 2012, we worked to further reinforce our links.

So I believe that this is an opportunity to strengthen and deepen the relationship after two more years and to lay the ground for greater cooperation in the future.

So for the purposes of this morning, in consultation with my co-chairs, colleagues, we propose that we cover two broad areas of discussion. The first is the bilateral relations and co-operation that we have together, so that we can look for ways that we can deepen and strengthen our bilateral cooperation.

And secondly, geopolitical issues that we are most concerned about.

We are considering the call of our colleagues from Libya, the situation in Iraq, and of course Syria which is not too far from our thoughts, along with other issues that I know colleagues wish to raise.

So again in welcoming you here, can I thank all of you and all the staff who worked so hard, especially to get to the point where we are in our declaration together, but to express again the strong commitment to deal with the challenges we face.

I want now to hand the floor to my colleague and dear friend Nabil Elaraby to thank him for his incredible work on behalf of the League of Arab States."
