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STATEMENT

Statement by the Spokesperson on the progress in the implementation of freedom of movement arrangement

"High Representative Catherine Ashton welcomes Belgrade's decision to further extend the freedom of movement arrangements in the coming days to Belgrade Nikola Tesla International Airport and to an additional five border crossing points in the next two months. This follows previous arrangements already in place at two other border crossing points of Serbia with Hungary and Croatia.

This decision was taken in the context of further progress in the implementation of freedom of movement. These latest developments in the EU-facilitated dialogue for normalisation of relations between Belgrade and Pristina will bring further benefits to the people and will promote the freedom of movement in the region."
