The security dimension of climate change is topical and of relevance on both sides of the Atlantic. They would establish a regular forum in which the transatlantic community of expertise on climate change would collectively think through feasible solutions to problems raised with an emphasis on the implications of climate change for security. Events will be 2 major conferences structured around panel sessions (with participation of China, India and Brazil), and 3 workshops for a more focused discussion on the implications of climate change with regard to the 3 drivers identified: water, energy and migration.
