

 bringing together Customs, Police and Gendarmerie and any other drug enforcement agencies in selected international Airports

 Establishment of specialized training: (for JAITF members and other airports officials)
 Two weeks training sessions conduct by Customs and Police trainers

Implementation of an ongoing Mentoring system in sites equipped with a JAITF, to assist the local teams with setting up the Task.

Results

COCAIR2 from 14 to 20 June 2010 seizure of chemical precursors More than 3 tonnes of chemical precursors (Côte d'Ivoire) **Cash seizures:** 2 seizures with a total value of 130 000 US dollars (Cameroon) Seizures of arms and ammunition One seizure of hunting weapen with ammunition in postal freight (Gabon) Seizure of African art objects : Q One statuette whose export is prohibited in (Mali) Seizure of a fake passport In postal freight in (Senegal)

Seizure of 3 tonnes of chemical precursors in Abidjan (destination Benin and Guinea)
