Preamble

Dear Partners,

In addition to being a country of asylum and an important transit country, Turkey hosts more than 4 million persons who seek international protection or are under temporary protection, of whom 3.6 million are Syrians. With the support of its stakeholders in the fields of humanitarian aid and development, Turkey has engaged in significant efforts to provide shelter, protection, health, education, means of livelihood and social assistance to those 4 million people in 2019 as well and has maintained its position as the country that has been hosting the greatest number of “refugees” since 2014. Upon the declaration of 2019 as the “Year of Social Cohesion” by the Ministry of Interior Directorate General of Migration Management, these efforts have also included the works carried out in regards to social inclusion and cohesion and thereby, an important step has been taken towards an “inclusive and integrated” migration management approach.

With our quarter century of experience in the field and the works carried out in the areas of irregular migration, protection, education, health, access to means of livelihood, social cohesion, research, capacity building and awareness raising, we as Association for Solidarity with Asylum Seekers and Migrants (SGDD-ASAM), are grateful for also being able to touch the lives of tens of thousands of people in 2019 by addressing through a holistic approach the needs of millions of persons who come from different geographies, nationalities, cultures and beliefs and who live in Turkey under

different legal statuses. In order to share these experiences in Turkey and the contributions of our valuable partners on international platforms and to disseminate the good practice examples of the experience in Turkey, we have extended our activities together with our representative offices in Athens and Brussels. Furthermore, we are making substantial contributions to 2030 Sustainable Development Goals with the local and national outputs we have obtained.

In this regard, we are pleased to share with you SGDD-ASAM's Activity Report that contains the summary of the works that we have carried out in 2019. By virtue of the trust you have placed in us, as well as our vision, corporate values and staff working with devotion all across the country, we as SGDD-ASAM, are continuing our efforts with the same unwavering belief and determination to ensure that refugees and asylum seekers affected by crises pursue their lives in a manner compatible with human dignity and overcome the hardships encountered.

While sharing with you SGDD-ASAM's 2019 Activity Report, we would like to take this opportunity to extend our heartfelt gratitude to our distinguished partners, who have supported our projects that enabled us to reach out to those in need and who never refrained from providing guidance to ensure that our works were implemented more effectively. Introduction

According to the Global Trends 2018 report published by the United Nations Refugee Agency (UNHCR), the number of migrants in the world has reached 272 million. On the other hand, the global population of forcibly displaced person is 70.8 million. Today, 1 out of every 33 persons in the world is a migrant.

With the conflict and crisis that broke out in Syria in 2011, approximately 5.5 million Syrians have been forced to migrate to neighbouring countries, such as Turkey,

Lebanon and Jordan. Resulting from the mass migration movement that began in 2011, there are 3.585.209 Syrians living in Turkey as of February 2020, based on official records of the Directorate General of Migration Management. In addition to this population, around 400.000 asylum seekers from other nationalities, who are mostly from Iraq, Afghanistan, Iran and Somali, live in Turkey. These numbers make Turkey the country that hosts the greatest number of refugees* and asylum seekers in the world.

Ever since the beginning of the Syrian crisis, Turkey has set an example for the entire world in the area of migration, refugees and humanitarian aid.

Actions to meet the fundamental humanitarian needs of Syrian asylum seekers that were initially carried out by public institutions during the first years of the crisis are currently being conducted on a more comprehensive axis while we have entered the 10th year of the crisis and focuses on development, education, improvement of livelihood opportunities and social cohesion.

Of the 3.6 million Syrians living in Turkey, approximately 1.7 million are children. Of these children, 47.9% are girls, 52.1% are boys. Refugee children have faced many difficulties ever since they have migrated. The trauma of war, financial loss struggles, lack of opportunities that would prevent children to interact with their peers and lack of enrollment to formal education are among the main difficulties experienced by refugee children. While 685.000 children have been included in the education system as of October 2019, around 400.000 children are still out of school.

It is crucial for refugee children to be included in the formal education system to prevent a lost generation and to enable children to build their lives as well equipped, productive and strong individuals by gaining access to the right to education.

By being the oldest and most widespread non-governmental organization established in Turkey for conducting activities in the field of migration, Association for Solidarity with Asylum Seekers and Migrants (SGDD-ASAM) currently offers services to all asylum seekers and refugees in over 40 provinces through more than 70 centers and offices, without making any discrimination based on language, religion, gender, race or political opinion. By opening its first overseas representative office in Athens in 2016 and its second overseas office in Brussels in 2019, SGDD-ASAM has carried its 25 years of experience in the field of migration and refugees to an international level.

* Concepts in national and international legislation vary due to the geographical limitation regarding the definition of refugee. The term "refugee" in this report is used for Temporary Protection or International Protection applicants/status holders under the Law on Foreigners and International Protection.

The projects implemented and the outputs obtained are in conformity with the United Nations 2030 Sustainable Development Goals. In that regard, SGDD-ASAM directly contributes to SDG1-No Poverty, SDG3-Good Health and Well-being, SDG4-Quality Education, SDG5-Gender Equality, SDG8-Decent Work and Economic Growth, SDG10-Reduced Inequality and SDG11-Sustainable Cities and Communities goals through 17 different projects.



By establishing long-term and integrative collaborations with public institutions, local administrations, European Union, United Nations Agencies, international organizations, universities and non-governmental organizations that provide services related to migration management and refugees, SGDD-ASAM continues its works on needs analysis and humanitarian aid, irregular migration, protection, education, health, livelihood opportunities, social cohesion, research, capacity building and awareness raising.

As SGDD-ASAM, we are pleased to for being able to reach out to thousands

of persons, touching their lives and enabling them to make changes through our ongoing projects or new projects beginning in 2019, our traditional events and awareness raising activities. Furthermore, based on the necessity to convey practice to theory related to migration, SGDD-ASAM, with its experience in the field for almost a quarter century, has established the Academy on Migration in 2019. The SGDD-ASAM Academy on Migration aims to contribute to the generation of knowledge, dissemination of information and unification and transformation of practical and theoretical information by utilizing the knowledge and experience acquired in the field over years.

Our Partners



SGDD-ASAM with Numbers in 2019

Asylum seekers from 16 different countries, particularly from Syria, Afghanistan, Iran, Iraq, Somali, Libya, Pakistan, Sudan and Egypt, have applied to SGDD-ASAM centers in 2019. SGDD-ASAM has provided services **1.486.189** times to **454.791** persons. These services include protection assessment, counselling, vocational trainings, skills development and language courses, referral to relevant institutions and interpreter assistance when required and one-time cash and financial assistance.

Out of those persons coming to SGDD-ASAM offices and centers in 2019, **172.377** have benefitted from the services offered for the first time. Of these beneficiaries, 79% are Syrian, 9% are Afghan, 8% are Iraqi and the remaining 4% are of different nationalities. In terms of age disaggregation of those coming to offices for the first time in 2019, 25-59 year old is the most common age group.

Gender ● Gender unspecified ● Male ● Female



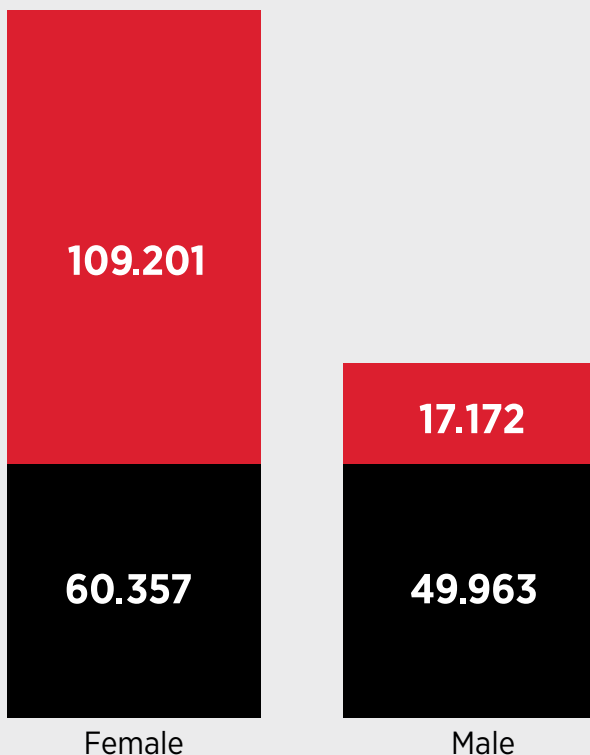
Of the beneficiaries having benefitted from counselling services at SGDD-ASAM centers in 2019, **55.34% are women and girls, 44.54% are men and boys.** Our centers provide counselling

in the fields of education, health and nutrition, legal information and psychosocial support services. The age group to whom the most counselling services have been provided is the 25-59 age group. ■

A total of 236.693 persons have participated in 7.664 activities organized at SGDD-ASAM centers in 2019.

Of the activities held at SGDD-ASAM centers in 2019, 43% are awareness raising activities, 34% are psychosocial support activities, 19% are social cohesion activities, 3% are non-certified educational activities and around 1% are focus group discussions. While the number of girls and boys participating in the activities are close, the number of adult females is 6 times more than the number of adult males. ■

Protection

Case management, which is one of the most important services provided at SGDD-ASAM centers in scope of protection, ensures the registration of beneficiaries at Provincial Directorates of Migration Management and obtaining an identity card following counselling and referrals. In that regard, **3.819** persons have obtained identity cards in 2019 through SGDD-ASAM centers. ■

During counselling provided at SGDD-ASAM centers in 2019, 26.747 out-of-school children have been identified.

Child Protection

Of these out-of-school children, **42.56%** are girls, **57.44%** are boys. Various steps have been taken for these identified children, including social counselling, protection assessment, participation in certified courses and activities. In order to perform the necessary registration procedures to include these out-of-school children in the education system, **2.635** children have been referred to Provincial Directorates of Migration Management. In addition, in order for children to benefit from formal and non-formal education programs, **3.221** children have been referred to the Ministry of National Education of the Republic of Turkey or Provincial Directorates of National Education, **5.921** children have been referred to Public Education Centers, and **5.136** to formal educational institutions. In order to meet the needs of children following these referrals in terms of education, **1.247** children have been referred to Social Assistance and Solidarity Foundations (SYDV) to benefit from the Conditional Cash Transfer for Education Programme supported by the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF).

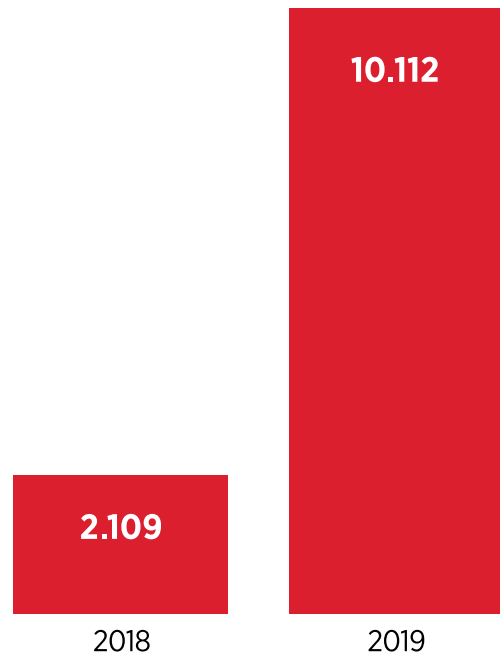


In 2019, **9.241** children engaged in child labor have been identified by SGDD-ASAM. Of these children, **18.76%** are girls, **81.24%** are boys. Protection assessment, counselling and various activities have been organized for these children identified as child laborers. From these children, **2.848** have been referred to Public Education Centers, **1.043** to formal educational institutions, **1.038** to the Turkish Ministry of National Education or Provincial Directorates of National Education, **894** to health institutions and **592** to Provincial Directorates of Migration Management. A total of **6.415** referrals have been made to the relevant institutions, including the ones mentioned above.

Access to Livelihood Opportunities

The activities carried out by SGDD-ASAM in 2019 related to skills building, language and vocational courses have increased greatly compared to the previous year. In that regard, while the number of persons participating in skills building, language and vocational courses in 2018 was **2.109**, this number has increased nearly by **379.5%** and reached **10.112** in 2019. **8.376** persons have successfully completed **311** Turkish language courses offered at SGDD-ASAM centers, while **1.899** persons have completed **87** vocational courses. Furthermore, vocational counselling has been offered to **2.796** persons in 2019, while **1.936** persons have been referred for employment opportunities.

Health ■

78.308 vulnerabilities have been identified in **65.044** persons during the case management processes carried out in 2019. These vulnerabilities consist of addictions, chronic diseases, physical disabilities, visual, hearing and speech impairments, mental disability, malnutrition, mental diseases, difficult pregnancy and disabilities caused by ill-treatment. A beneficiary may have more than one vulnerability. ■

In regards of the vulnerabilities identified, **64.058** persons have been offered **20.607** disability counselling, **17.654** nutrition counselling, and **139.341** health counselling.

One fourth of counselling provided at SGDD-ASAM in 2019 are related to health.

In addition to these, transportation assistance has been provided **2.865** times through office vehicles to beneficiaries requiring transportation assistance to health institutions.

Interpretation assistance is provided during health services based on needs analysis and SGDD-ASAM has provided interpretation assistance **17.923** times to **9.519** persons in 2019 while accessing health services.

SGDD-ASAM Projects Beginning in 2019 ■

The phenomenon of migration brings along many difficulties and vulnerabilities. Protection interventions, developed to mitigate and eliminate the vulnerabilities of refugees with special needs, mainly children, women, persons with disabilities and the elderly, are at the center of SGDD-ASAM's works. While SGDD-ASAM has continued its protection based

projects in 2019, it has also launched new projects that focus on education, access to means of livelihood and social cohesion, based on the importance of addressing other sectoral interventions of the protection component in an integrative manner to produce durable solutions. A summary of the recent projects launched in 2019 is provided below.

Strong Women Strong Future Project ■

The “Strong Women Strong Future Project”, carried out in collaboration with the Refugee Support Center (RSC-MUDEM) under the GAP P.A.C.E. (Personal Advancement & Career Enhancement) program, aims to empower women by improving the career development and social skills of refugee woman. Trainings are organized for beneficiaries at 26 SGDD-ASAM offices located across 18 provinces, particularly Ankara, Gaziantep, Izmir and Istanbul.

Following the capacity building trainings provided to SGDD-ASAM and RSC-MUDEM's employees, 3.600 refugee

women have been included in a 45-hour personal development and career development training module.

The GAP P.A.C.E. program, initially implemented in 2013 for woman employees, developed over time through collaboration with various institutions and international organizations to extend worldwide to include all women. With the Project, being implemented in Turkey since April 2019 with the collaboration of SGDD-ASAM and RSC-MUDEM and in which 300.000 women from 18 countries have been included, it is aimed to reach 1 million women by the end of 2022.

Through the trainings that consist of 5 modules on communication, time and stress management, problem-solving and decision making, water-sanitation and hygiene, and financial literacy, it is aimed to assist women to make a difference in their lives.

Social Cohesion of Refugees Project

With the “Social Cohesion of Refugees Project”, **which is funded by the European Union** and has been launched in March 2019, it is aimed to improve the participation of refugees in social life, to facilitate their access to rights and services, and to develop social cohesion between the host community and refugees. Furthermore, it aims to improve the service capacities of local authorities towards refugees. In scope of the Project, works are carried out at SGDD-ASAM Multi-Service Support Centers located in Denizli, Manisa, Samsun, Çorum, Çankırı, Nevşehir, Konya, Eskişehir and Mardin, Sustainable Living Centers in Karabük, Ordu and Yalova, and the Field Office in Kırıkkale.

Through social cohesion activities, awareness raising sessions and peer information activities provided at SGDD-

ASAM Multi-Service Support Centers and in the provinces where these centers are located, beneficiaries are provided with the necessary information for accessing areas of education, health and employment.

Turkish courses, Foreign Student Examination (YÖS) and courses for developing refugees’ basic life skills are organized in scope of the protocol signed between SGDD-ASAM and the Directorate General of Lifelong Learning of the Republic of Turkey Ministry of National Education. Social cohesion activities are conducted with the participation of the local community and refugees in scope of the Project that has been developed in collaboration with municipalities, Provincial Directorates of the Republic of Turkey Ministry of Family, Labor and Social Services, social assistance and solidarity foundations and universities.

Enabling refugees to learn Turkish so that they could participate in social life in Turkey are among the important objectives of the Project.



Promotion of Economic Prospects for Syrians Under Temporary Protection and Host Community in Turkey Project

With the “Promotion of Economic Prospects for Syrians Under Temporary Protection and Host Community in Turkey Project”, on behalf of **the Republic of Turkey Ministry of National Education Directorate General of Lifelong Learning (MoNE – DG LLL) and German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) implemented in collaboration with the German Agency for International Cooperation (GIZ)**, it is aimed to embark on initiatives for improving vocational and language skills of Turkish and Syrian beneficiaries and providing employment opportunities.

Aiming to reach out to a total of 1.600 beneficiaries, of which 800 are Turkish and 800 are Syrians under Temporary Protection, the Project is being run at 18 Public Education Centers (PECs) affiliated with Republic of Turkey Ministry of National Education that are located in Adıyaman, Denizli, Diyarbakır, Istanbul and Tekirdağ provinces. Increasing women’s employment,

which is vital for development, is also an important element of the Project. In this regard, women beneficiaries are given priority when identifying beneficiaries and it is aimed to ensure that at least 30% of the beneficiaries are women.

Within the scope of the employment-oriented project, upon receiving the Turkish language training, Syrian beneficiaries, together with Turkish beneficiaries, are provided with vocational trainings designed in line with the demands of the labor market and are provided with incentives throughout the trainings. The Project offers 3-month employment incentives to employers in order to support short-term employment of the beneficiaries who have completed their trainings.

Simultaneously with the trainings, seminars on occupational health and safety, work ethics, culture and conditions, and work permits in Turkey are organized for the Project beneficiaries.

With the Project, which is an important step in providing the beneficiaries with the knowledge, skills and implementing competencies required by a particular profession in line with the needs of the labor market and national plans and programmes, it is also aimed to create a qualified labor force that will contribute to sustainable economic development.

As providing information on work permit procedures and relative legislation for asylum seekers and refugees through seminars are among the Project's important objectives, seminars, in which incentive opportunities planned for private sector representatives and goals related to the employment process are explained, are carried out with the support of local authorities, including chambers of industry and commerce. ■

Workshops related to starting a business in Turkey with the support from the Small and Medium Enterprises Development Organization of Turkey (KOSGEB) are also among the Project activities. Furthermore, counselling services are offered in order for the beneficiaries seeking a job to be registered to ISKUR (Turkey Labor Institution) and other job search databases.

In the Project, which includes nearly

50 vocational trainings within the scope of more than 10 fields of professional expertise ranging from clothing manufacturing to information technologies, Labor Market Reports are also drawn up that analyzes the labor market dynamics, needs and opportunity areas in five implementation provinces. Accordingly, it is aimed to contribute to devising development-oriented projects in Turkey in the medium and long run.



Strengthening Social Cohesion and Inclusion Through Sports Among Refugee and Turkish Youth Project

The “Strengthening Social Cohesion and Inclusion Through Sports Among Refugee and Turkish Youth Project”, funded by the **Olympic Refuge Foundation (ORF)**, is implemented with the partnership of **the Republic of Turkey Ministry of Youth and Sports, United Nations Refugee Agency (UNHCR), Turkish National Olympic Committee (TNOC) and SGDD-ASAM.**

With the Project, which is implemented in the provinces of Ankara, Bursa, Mersin, Samsun and Şanlıurfa, it is aimed to strengthen the social cohesion of children under temporary and international protection and children of the host community through sports and to identify children under risk and refer them to the relevant institutions.

Awareness raising activities on issues such as “nutrition, hygiene, personal development, children’s rights and child development” are organized the families and social circles of children who will attend the courses and it is planned to reach more than ten thousand persons through these activities.



Sports courses in different branches are offered to 8-18 year old children and youth in scope of the Project. It is aimed to reach out to 3.600 children each year through courses intended for strengthening social cohesion.

It is planned to invite successful sportspersons and artists to festivals that will be held at the end of the course period and to organize various cultural and social activities. Including children, who have assumed a leading role and have highly participated in the courses, in the “Volunteer Leaders Camp” that is located in the camp centers of the Republic of Turkey Ministry of Youth and Sports is also among the opportunities of the project provided to children.

Identifying youth above age 18 who

are part of the social circles of children attending the courses and who have an ability and interest in sports is also among the project objectives. It is aimed to organize trainings for these persons and to grant them occupational certificates. Within the Project, protection activities for disadvantaged beneficiaries and those under risk are also planned; vulnerable beneficiaries who have been identified are referred to SGDD-ASAM offices and concerning institutions in the relevant provinces.

Support for School Enrolment Programme ■

The “Support for School Enrolment Programme”, run with the financial support of the European Union and collaboration with the United Nations Children’s Fund (UNICEF), contributes to raising schooling rates of Syrian children and improving their access to formal and non-formal education opportunities.

In the programme, where the identification, assessment and follow-up of 5-17 year old boy and girls are performed, it is aimed to include children in formal or non-formal education programs that are suitable for their age. It is also aimed to reduce school dropout rates by providing information

and referral to families. Fieldworks are conducted throughout the programme in Adana, Bursa, Gaziantep, Istanbul, Izmir, Konya, Mersin and Şanlıurfa for around 30.000 asylum seeker and refugee children who are out-of-school, cannot continue school or carry the risk of dropping out of school.

In the programme, implemented in collaboration with relevant institutions and organizations, namely the Republic of Turkey Ministry of National Education and Republic of Turkey Ministry of Youth and Sports, works are conducted together with mobile teams to enable out-of-school children or children carrying the risk of not continuing school to be included in education.

Mobile teams, who carry out field surveys to identify out-of-school children and children carrying the risk of not continuing school, assess children according to their levels of risk and inform their families about education opportunities and other available social aid. Therefore, support is provided to enable children to access education without any difficulties through the “Accelerated Learning Programme” and referrals to Turkish courses.

In addition, awareness raising activities are organized for children and their families

regarding issues like access to education opportunities. Briefing meetings are organized for local institutions and organizations in the project provinces of the programme.

Communication for Development-C4D activities are also among the important components of the Programme. In that regard, briefing meetings for caregivers/parents, role model meetings with children, caregivers and parents, and structured activities for adolescents are organized.

Social and Economic Stabilization of Syrian Women and Adolescent Girls Project

The Project, which is funded by the Japanese Government and is run by the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UN WOMEN) under the partnership of SGDD-ASAM and Southeastern Anatolia Project Regional Development Administration, is being implemented in the province of Şanlıurfa.

The main objectives of the Project include increasing the access of Syrian and Turkish women and girls to livelihood opportunities, ensuring their self-sufficiency and increasing their resilience. Within the scope of the Project, digital skills trainings are offered in Şanlıurfa in order to enable women to have access to long-term income generating jobs, to develop

their creative design skills and to have access to the labor market. Also, the speaking skills of refugee women and girls develop through the speaking clubs at the Multi-Purpose Community Centers (ÇATOM) under the Southeastern Anatolia Project.

In regards to gender equality-based social cohesion activities, awareness raising activities are being organized about women's rights, gender equality, and sexual and gender-based violence. As part of the Project, psychosocial support services are offered in addition to house visits that are conducted with a view to ensuring that women have access to fundamental rights and services, as well as protection mechanisms.

The trainings and counselling services provided under the Project are carried out at the Multi-Purpose Community Centers (ÇATOM) and Youth and Culture Houses that are affiliated to the Southeastern Anatolia Project Regional Development Administration.

Strengthening Economic Opportunities for Syrians under Temporary Protection and Turkish Citizens in Selected Localities Project

“Strengthening Economic Opportunities for Syrians under Temporary Protection and Turkish Citizens in Selected Localities Project”, as a component of an integrated project that is run by the **World Bank with the financial support of the European Union, is being implemented under the partnership of Ankara Chamber of Commerce (ACC), ACC IDEA, Altındağ Municipality, Joon Social Design, Istasyon TEDU and SGDD-ASAM.** With the project, it is aimed to facilitate Turkish and Syrian women’s adaptation to the business world by enhancing their entrepreneurship and professional skills and to draw up sustainable

business models by way of establishing business partnerships in order to improve economic competence of beneficiaries. Within the scope of the Project that targets women living in Ankara, trainings are organized to transform traditional handicrafts into commercial products that are innovative, original and high in added-value.

Under the Project, SGDD-ASAM’s Ankara Community Center conducts activities for ensuring social cohesion. Publishing e-learning materials on the ACC IDEA e-Learning Platform is among the objectives of the Project, which will serve with an innovative and tailored curriculum.

With the establishment of a social enterprise, company or cooperative based on a realistic market analysis and a business idea compatible with market targets, it is aimed to ensure Syrian and Turkish women’s collective access to new sources of income.

Supporting Asylum Seekers and Refugees in Labor Market with Language Trainings Out Of Working Hours Project ■

With the Turkish language courses organized on weekends and after working hours during the week, it is aimed to develop the language skills of refugees and promote their social cohesion in the working environment. A1 and A2 level Turkish language courses that beneficiaries will complete in 6 months are promoted with social cohesion activities, speaking

clubs, translation projects and activities enabling them to acquire a professional language.

With the project, it is also aimed to organize social cohesion and peer support activities for participants from the refugee and host community. Supporting gender equality is also among the project objectives.

With the “Supporting Asylum Seekers and Refugees in Labor Market with Language Trainings Out Of Working Hours Project”, supported by the International Organization for Migration (IOM), it is aimed to facilitate the access of refugees, who work in Izmir and Istanbul, to Turkish language courses.

SGDD-ASAM's Awareness Raising Activities

Non-governmental organizations play a significant role in sharing the humanitarian dimensions of migration with the public and informing the community on false facts concerning refugees. Ever since its establishment, SGDD-ASAM has been conducting awareness raising activities in order to eliminate any prejudices that might emerge in relation to refugees within the community.

While including elements like culture, art, sports and music that

unite communities in awareness raising activities to ensure social cohesion, SGDD-ASAM also organizes awareness raising activities for media representatives in order to support accurate reporting of news on refugees.

It also conducts awareness activities on gender-based violence, children's rights, and problems experienced by persons with disabilities. Information on the activities organized for that purpose in 2019 are provided below.

12th Traditional Cappadocia Women's Gathering

9 March 2019, Cappadocia/Nevşehir

SGDD-ASAM's 12th Traditional Cappadocia Women's Gathering, organized on the occasion of March 8 International Women's Day, was held in Nevşehir with the participation of over 2.000 Turkish and refugee women. With the event, it was aimed to draw attention to similar problems experienced by women coming from different geographies, strengthen the solidarity among women and contribute to social cohesion between the local community and refugee women.





Another purpose of the event, organized with the slogan "Women are Stronger Together!" and aims to bring together women on a common platform, was to acquaint Turkish and refugee women with the unique beauties of Cappadocia. A culture tour to historical places like Üç Güzeller (Three Beauties), Çavuşin Church, Göreme, Üç Hisar (Uchisar) Castle and Paşabağları (Monks) Valley was organized for the women

accompanied by the Balkan Orchestra.

The "Neighboring Women's Patchwork" prepared under the leadership of SGDD-ASAM Ankara Community Center by hundreds of women coming from different provinces, was also displayed at the event. This special day, to which numerous press members attended and which was celebrated with great joy, was broadcasted live by CNN Türk and Haber Global.



3rd Children's Festival

26 April 2019, Ankara



Refugee children living in Turkey were not forgotten on April 23. More than 6 thousand children attended the Children's Festival, held on the occasion of 23 April National Sovereignty and Children's Day for the third time at Ahlatlıbel Atatürk Park by SGDD-ASAM with the collaboration of UNICEF and support of Çankaya Municipality.

Turkish and refugee children attending the event celebrated April 23 with balloons, pantomime, music and stage performances, accompanied by clowns and story heroes. While children had

an entertaining time with the Balkan Orchestra's songs, the best three groups of the SGDD-ASAM Al Farah Choir and Young Musicians Competition performed their songs. Representatives from public institutions and international organizations, United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) Turkey Representative Philippe Duamelle in particular, also attended the 3rd Children's Festival. Since 2019 was also the 30th anniversary of the Convention on the Rights of the Child, the Children's Festival was celebrated with greater enthusiasm.



Media and Refugees Press Meetings

The 'Media and Refugees Press Meetings', launched by SGDD-ASAM in 2016, commenced with five workshops, which became the first of its kind in Turkey, to which hundreds of journalists came together in 2016 and 2017 in Ankara, İstanbul, Antalya, Gaziantep and Adana provinces and discussed the role of the media in relation to migration and refugees. The Media and Refugees Press Meetings, which continued with five separate meetings in 2018, were held again as a series of meetings for the fourth time in 2019.

With this event, which was organized with the financial support of the European Union and the collaboration of RSC-MUDEM in Ankara, Izmir and Van respectively, and then in Ankara again as a closing meeting, more than 2.500 members of the local and national media have been reached in seven different provinces up till now.

Furthermore, in the course of the Press Meetings, prominent figures of the media world such as photographer and documentary producer Coşkun Aral, NTV News Director Mete Çubukçu, Kanal D Ankara Representative Ercan Gürses, Haber Global Ankara Representative Faruk Demirel, TRT News Presenter Ahmet Görmez, Reuters Chief Photographer Murad Sezer and News Photographer Ümit Bektaş, Chairman of Photojournalists Association of Turkey Rıza Özel and President of the Turkish News Cameramen Association Aytekin Polatel shared their journalistic experiences in the area of migration.

SGDD-ASAM Opened its Second Foreign Representative Office in Brussels

January 2019, Brussels



Based on the vision of introducing its a quarter century experience in the field of migration and refugees on international platforms and developing collaboration, SGDD-ASAM opened its first representative office in Athens in October 2016 and its second representative office in Brussels in January 2019. Through SGDD-ASAM Brussels Representative Office, established to extend its communication and collaboration network with other stakeholders in Europe, mainly with institutions and organizations affiliated to the European Union, various activities will be conducted to introduce the experiences and works of Turkey and SGDD-ASAM in regards to migration management and practices on a global scale.

A story of solidarity and success from the hands of women: SADA Women's Cooperative

March 2019, Gaziantep

SADA Women's Cooperative, formed by 50 Syrian, Turkish and Afghan women in scope of the "Strengthening the Resilience of Syrian Women and Girls and Host Communities Project" that is implemented under the leadership of the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UN Women) and the partnership of Gaziantep Metropolitan Municipality, International Labour Organization (ILO) and SGDD-ASAM, was established in March 2019. Within the Cooperative, productions are made in areas of shoemaking, textile and regional food.



The cooperative that produces handicraft products through women's solidarity has become known worldwide in a very short time. By being included within the top 100 applications from among nearly 1000 applications, SADA Women's Cooperative was able to attend the Paris Peace Forum held in France in November. SADA Women's Cooperative Project turned into a story of success that they created, produced and won together. Furthermore, SADA Women's Cooperative succeeded in being chosen by the jury among the top 10 projects at the closing of the Forum and was invited to the Forum again for the next year. The Paris adventure of this peace project, launched in a small classroom by Gaziantep women who joined hands with Syrian and Afghan women, will also continue the following year.

Apart from the SADA Women's Cooperative, gender equality based protection activities are being conducted and the capacity of women for coping with difficulties are being enhanced; their access to fundamental rights and services is supported by providing legal and social counselling, health counselling and psychosocial support at the SADA Women Development and Solidarity Center that has been established in Gaziantep in scope of the Project. A1-A2 level Turkish language courses and speaking clubs are also organized at this Center, in addition to necessary referrals being made to ensure

that women have access to the labor market. Through the child-friendly space set up within SADA Women Development and Solidarity Center, childcare support is provided. The children of those women participating in courses and trainings are able to benefit from the nursery service.

Apart from Turkish and refugee women and girls, men and boys are also included in the social cohesion activities conducted in scope of the Project. By attending "Father-Child Kitchen Workshops", men hold discussions on gender roles and also contribute to gender equality by participating in male attended activities.

The SADA Women Development and Solidarity Center is hosting the "Tomorrow's Women Committee" that continues to actively carry out its works. With the awareness raising sessions organized each week, the Committee aims to strengthen the capacity of all women and girls. Being a part of international platforms such as "Grand Bargain", "Global Compact" and "International Municipal Forum: From Emergency to Resilience and Development", the Committee continues to organize activities related to women's rights. SADA Women's Choir, formed at the Center by Syrian, Turkish and Afghan women, comes together each week to experience women's solidarity with the uniting power of music.

Conference on Pathways to Social Cohesion

10-11 April 2019, Ankara

The Conference on Pathways to Social Cohesion was organized at Hacettepe University on 10-11 April 2019 with the partnership of Migration and Politics Research Center of Hacettepe University (HUGO) and SGDD-ASAM in scope of the “Education Programme for Syrian Refugees and Host Communities”, which is supported by the German International Cooperation Agency (GIZ), has aimed to identify areas of dialogue regarding social cohesion between Turkish citizens and Syrian population and to provide a platform for different actors from government, private and civil society sectors to exchange information.

Since the majority of Syrians under Temporary Protection are below the age 30, the importance of activities for strengthening communication between Syrian and Turkish youth has been emphasized. The Conference has been attended by representatives of government institutions and local administrations in Turkey and Germany, representatives of the Syrian community, international organizations, representatives from non-governmental organizations, youth, academicians, and university students.

During the Conference, BILSY-GİZ Director Joachim Scheurer, Hacettepe University Rector Prof. Dr. A. Haluk Özen, Ambassador of Germany Martin Erdmann, Deputy Minister of the Ministry of Youth and Sports İhsan Selim Baydaş and Deputy Minister of National Education Reha Denemeç delivered their opening speeches, respectively. GİZ Turkey Country Director Rubeena Esmail-Arndt, General Director of Ministry of Interior Directorate General of Migration Management Abdullah Ayaz, SGDD-ASAM General Coordinator İbrahim Vurgun Kavlak and Deputy Secretary General of Gaziantep Metropolitan Municipality Dr. Abdullah Aksoy addressed refugee policies, integration of refugees who are expected to remain as permanent residents, repatriation of asylum seekers who have been rejected, access to education, language courses, labor market and combatting the main reasons of (forced) migration. Folk dances, concerts, exhibitions, poetry slam, drama and dialogue activities have been organized by the Project partners in the fair area during the two-day conference.



Meetings on Access of Refugees and Asylum Seekers to the Labor Market

2 May 2019, Adana
17 September 2019, İstanbul



In scope of the “Education Campus” Project, being implemented in Adana and İstanbul since November 2016, two separate meetings were held with the participation of business circles for the purpose of providing information on the Access of Refugees and Asylum Seekers to the Labor Market and sharing experiences. The first of these briefing meetings were held on 2 May 2019 in Adana, while the second was held on 17 September 2019 in İstanbul, where information was provided on application procedures for work permits, incentives for employers,

and vocational trainings, and on-the-job trainings and experiences of refugees in the labor market were shared.

Throughout the meetings, the works carried out towards refugees by the Directorate General of International Labor Force, Turkish Employment Agency (İŞKUR), Social Security Institution (SGK), Ministry of National Education Directorate General of Lifelong Learning, employer representatives and international organizations such as ILO, UNHCR, GİZ, and IOM were explained.



Workshop on Refugees' Access to Higher Education in Turkey

18-19 November 2019, Ankara



The “Workshop on Refugees’ Access to Higher Education in Turkey” was held on 18-19 November 2019 in Ankara with the collaboration of SGDD-ASAM and the Academic and Scientific Cooperation Project of Turkey (TABİP), which is a project that is implemented by Yunus Emre Institute under the auspices of the Presidency of the Republic of Turkey and aims at enhancing academic and scientific studies in Turkey.

In the Workshop, all components related to Syrian youth at higher education age (19-24 years of age) and approximately 270 thousand higher education candidate students aged 15-18 being included in the higher education system in Turkey have been addressed in depth. The problems experienced in being included in the higher education system, the preparation and registration phase, access to the labor market following higher education, vulnerable groups and students with special needs, support

mechanisms and their functioning, expectations and suggestions were discussed during the Workshop. Furthermore, relevant government institutions such as the Ministry of National Education in particular, universities, international organizations and non-governmental organizations as well as adolescents from many different nationalities, including Syrian and Afghan students and graduates, participated in the Workshop to share their experiences.

Assoc. Prof. Dr. Başak Yavçan and Assoc. Prof. Dr. Ayselin Yıldız were part of the Advisory Board, which was formed in the preparation and planning stage of the Workshop that was developed under the partnership of TABİP and SGDD-ASAM. It is planned for the Workshop outputs to be outlined in a final report in 2020 and for a conference to be held on Refugees’ Access to Higher Education.



While Migrating (Göç'erken) Theater



Following the drama training that members of the Youth of the Future Committee received in scope of the 'Theater for Friendship' project, which was launched in 2018 with the support of UNHCR, the 'While Migrating (Göç'erken)' theater play was staged for the first time in Gaziantep with the participation of Turkish, Syrian and Iraqi youth. Thereafter, the play went on a Turkey tour.

New members joined the theater team and by being performed in the provinces of Kahramanmaraş (4 August 2019), Malatya (1 September 2019), Adana (15 September 2019), Osmaniye (22 September 2019), Hatay (3 November 2019), Şanlıurfa (17 November 2019), Ankara (24 November 2019) and Mardin (15 December 2019), 'While Migrating'

has reached an audience of over 1.500 persons.

While Migrating, staged bilingually with the motto "A Theater Play for Friendship", aims to strengthen communication and cultural interaction between ethnic and social groups. Through the play put on stage by refugee and Turkish youth, messages have been delivered regarding peaceful coexistence and contribution has been made to social cohesion and breaking down of prejudices and public perceptions towards refugees. While also helping to empower youth and promote their self-reliance through art, it has been observed that the youth present throughout the project has gained experience in project management, acting with a sense of responsibility, developing empathy and planning.

Migration from Practice to Theory: SGDD-ASAM Academy on Migration

22 December 2019, Ankara



Based on the necessity of transferring practice to theory related to the issue of migration that continues to gain significance each day, SGDD-ASAM, with its experience in the field for almost a quarter century, has established the Academy on Migration on 22 December 2019, which is its foundation anniversary. This Academy, established in Ankara, aims to contribute to the generation of knowledge, dissemination of information and unification and transformation of practice and theoretical information by utilizing the knowledge and experience acquired by SGDD-ASAM in the field over the years.

SGDD-ASAM Academy on Migration aspires to form an effective platform of dialogue among universities, policymakers, international organizations and civil society actors, to contribute to literature in Turkey and throughout the world related to migration, to promote sharing of academic information and to support qualitative studies and students and young researchers interested in the area of migration. Based on these aims, it is planned for various activities to be conducted within the scope of SGDD-ASAM Academy on Migration, including peer-reviewed journal, seminar programs, migration library, research scholarships, panels and conferences.



Cooperation Protocols Signed in 2019

While carrying out works and projects, SGDD-ASAM attaches great importance to establishing cooperation with national and local institutions and organizations, either due to legislation or for generating effective, integrative and durable solutions. In that regard, in order to conduct joint works, SGDD-ASAM has signed cooperation protocols in 2019 on education, health, protection, access to means of livelihood, and social cohesion with government institutions such as Ministry of National Education Directorate General of Lifelong Learning, Ministry of Youth and Sports Directorate General of International Organizations and Foreign Relations, Ministry of Industry and Technology Presidency of GAP Regional Development Administration and with non-governmental organizations such as Association of Child and Future (ÇOGEL), Health and Social Services at Home Association (EVSAD) and Refugee Support Center (RSC-MUDEM).

Furthermore, protocols have been signed with Hacettepe University Faculty of Dentistry, concerning activities to be conducted for asylum seekers and refugees in Turkey on raising awareness on the mouth and dental health, and with Hacettepe University Faculty of Communication, concerning activities for promoting social cohesion in scope of traditional food culture. A “Cooperative Education Cooperation Document” for organizing cooperative trainings with SGDD-ASAM for 3 terms for undergraduate students has also been signed with TOBB University of Economics and Technology.

It is aimed to continue existing collaborations and to establish new partnerships in 2020 as well.

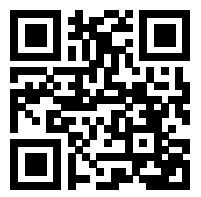
