INSTITUTIONS

· EU helps to promote better access to justice for citizens and businesses, via legal aid, alternative dispute resolution and fight against corruption. Since 2018, more than 6,700 vulnerable persons received free legal aid in Baku and the regions.

COVID-19 RESPONSE



The EU reacted fast and responded to the urgent needs of Azerbaijan and its citizens during the COVID-19 pandemic. As part of Team Europe, the EU mobilised a tailor-made COVID-19 response package specifically for Azerbaijan worth about €31.6 million. This helped to provide targeted assistance to the Azerbaijan's public health system, including 20 hospitals and 5 primary healthcare facilities as well as provisioning essential medical supplies for patient care. EU assisted training of more than 2,900 health care workers, 98 laboratory technicians, 1,400 medical and nursing students and other health professionals, including in such areas as mental health and psychosocial support, infection prevention and public hygiene.
