<b>Objectives</b>	<b>Overall objective:</b> To contribute to poverty reduction and resilient livelihoods of extremely poor households in the three Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT) districts of Bangladesh
<b>Target group(s)</b>	The project will also carry out high-level policy dialogue on building capacity for partners to discuss opportunities and challenges to implementation and begin the process of developing a clear strategy to advance the SDGs for CHT. The major targets groups will be: The major target groups are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• CHT institutions i.e. MoCHTA, CHT Regional Council and three Hill District Councils, and CHT Land Commissions</li> <li>• Ministry of Legislative and Parliamentary Affairs through MoCHTA</li> <li>• ERD and Planning Commissions</li> <li>• Elected representatives, traditional leaders, and women leaders</li> <li>• Youth from both tribal and Bengali communities residing in the hot spots in the CHT</li> <li>• Volunteer mediator networks.</li> </ul>
