He notably served as a youth delegate at the Peace for Ukraine forum, organized by the EU delegation to Indonesia and the Ukrainian Embassy. In this role, he leveraged his legal expertise to raise awareness about peace and devised strategies to combat disinformation. A key turning point in Dirga's career came while assisting in a significant acquisition for a mining investment company in Indonesia. During this time, he witnessed firsthand the severe environmental impacts on local communities. This experience sparked a deep realisation about the law's dual role—either serving the interests of the powerful or ensuring justice for marginalised groups. Driven by a newfound commitment to human rights and environmental justice, Dirga transitioned from corporate law to academia and research at Universitas Gadjah Mada and the Climate Unit of the Foreign Policy Community of Indonesia (FPCI). Despite current limitations in influencing policy direction, his decision reflects a proactive stance toward advocating for meaningful reforms ensuring that grassroots voices resonate with both local and international stakeholders. Through his involvement in initiatives like the International Conference on Disability Rights (ICDR), the ASEAN Youth Initiative Empowerment Programme (AYIEP), and the Youth Sounding Board - Friends of the European Union, Dirga aims to drive substantial improvements in human rights and climate action. He seeks to inspire others to join him in creating a fairer and more sustainable future for Indonesia.
