Purpose of the processing activity

The purpose of the processing activity is to receive and analyse the views of those concerned by the topics of the survey (including staff opinion survey), questionnaire, quiz, public consultation and to potentially publish the views and/or the analysis, anonymously in case of surveys, questionnaires and guizzes, on the relevant website.

Description

EEAS carries out internal and external (with interested parties and in cases with the general public) surveys / questionnaires / quizzes / public consultations of stakeholders and/or the public on any initiative that would benefit from external input at various stages including development, implementation and evaluation. Consultations give the possibility to interested parties to be heard. Stakeholders may be invited to present their views in writing, in the context of public consultations. The public and interested parties at large may be invited via e-mail, the Internet (e.g. IPM EU surveys IT Tool on via EEAS website) or traditional alternatives (press releases, mailings), to fill in an on-line questionnaire or to provide feedback by e-mail or any other means.

Data shall be provided by the interested parties on a voluntary basis. The stakeholders and the public at large, as well, send their contributions to public consultations on a voluntary basis.

The following types of surveys / questionnaires / guizzes / public consultations may be launched:

- Surveys / questionnaires / quizzes / public consultations launched through the IT Tool IPM EU survey or equivalent, or through EEAS website
- Surveys / questionnaires / quizzes / public consultations launched by e-mail
- Surveys / questionnaires / quizzes / public consultations launched by conferences
- Surveys / questionnaires / quizzes / public consultations launched by an external company, acting as processor \*
- \* Certain online surveys, questionnaires and quizzes are provided / maintained by specific IT platforms, recommended by the service provider under the Framework Contract. One of the providers for Europe Day 2021 is taken over from an EEA-based company by United Kingdom / Ukraine based company.

For illustration purposes – Description of the Europe Day 2020, which will include the objectives of the upcoming Europe Day quizzes.

The purpose of the data processing is to manage the online Quiz developed specifically for the EUROPE DAY 2020. The Quiz targets all public of different age groups, including younger generations and it puts the European Union and EU achievements, values and benefits into focus for European citizens and worldwide. It is provided on an online platform made available by SEEOUX, an Italian-based service provider and managed by the Strategic Communications team of the European External Action Service with the technical assistance of IBF International, a Belgian enterprise. The processing of personal data is based on voluntary registration. Data is collected in order to facilitate the management and technical functionalities of the quiz as well as to contact you if you have won any prize, applicable in certain EU Delegations. If you give your consent to be contacted by email, the data will be processed also to be able for you to receive a feedback with your results and share it on social networks of your preference. You can also share the quiz itself without giving any personal data to the EEAS. You attention is drawn to the fact that when you use your own social network accounts, such as Facebook or Twitter, you leave our site and you are redirected to external sites. Giving data, including your name, e-mail, age-range, occupation is entirely optional and these data will only be used to prepare anonymous statistics about the correlation of the results with these characteristics of respondents.

7	Legal basis and lawfulness	The processing of personal data related to communication with the wider public, including the launching of surveys, quizzes and consultations is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest as mandated by the Treaties, in particular by articles 5, 11, 20, 21-40, 42, 43 of the of the Treaty on European Union (TEU) and Article 27 of TEU as well as 2 (4) and (5), 205, 220-221, 326 – 334 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union (TFEU).
		The personal data processing operations linked to surveys, questionnaires, quizzes and consultations are indispensable for having the views, as widely as possible, of stakeholders or the public at large in developing new or existing policies and for the implementation of the related-programmes managed by the EEAS. Additionally, public consultation contributes to regulatory quality and transparency and increases the involvement of stakeholders and the public at large in the frame of better regulation. - Occupation (optional data for statistical purposes)
- User Name (avatar names and/or real names)
- Nationality, e.g. for individuals portrayed in a video, influencers
- Age e.g. for individuals portrayed in a video, influencers
- Contact data (Influencers and users are primarily contacted via their social media profiles. In Delegations former contacts could be followed up using pre-established contact channels
- Interest in specific topics, domains
- Promotion material, including videos, communicated for further sharing
- Information about accounts, such as profile name, age, number of followers in different social media channels and potential reach/pick-up of posts.

Material shared in social media if the influencers or users give their consent to use it in the communication activities of the EEAS or EU Delegations on social media.

10 Recipients of data – Access to data

- Assigned staff member(s) of the relevant department / division / directorate responsible for launching the survey / questionnaire / quiz / public consultation. The access to all personal data as well as all information collected in the context of this survey / questionnaire / quiz / public consultation is only granted through ECAS or UserId/Password to a defined population of users, without prejudice to a possible transmission to the bodies in charge of a monitoring or inspection task in accordance with Union legislation. These users typically are members of the EEAS department, directorate, division or EU delegation organising the survey / questionnaire / quiz / public consultation.
- Contractor assigned staff, if the survey, quiz or consultation is launched by an external company, acting as a data processor. The contracted service provider with its subcontractor(s) will process data on behalf of the EEAS in accordance with Article 29 of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725, only on documented instructions, ensuring appropriate safeguards and security measures. Further information on how providers process personal data, including their privacy policy can be found on their websites.

Data will not be used for profiling . The EEAS will not share personal data with third parties for direct marketing purposes. For certain processing activities opinions and results of survey / questionnaire / quiz / public consultation may be published in anonymous form on the web and made publicly available. In case some personal data is intended to be published on the web, you will be informed by the instruction notice of the survey / questionnaire / quiz / public consultation. If you do not agree with the publication of your personal data, please opt-out by informing the data sub-controller, i.e. the department organising the survey / questionnaire / quiz / public consultation by using the contact information available on the survey / questionnaire / quiz / public consultation application or the Controller. In case of public consultations, received contributions, i.e. answers to the given questions, together with the identity of the contributor, could be published on the Internet, unless you, as contributor object to publication of the personal data. In this case the contribution may be published in anonymous form. Any objections concerning publication of personal data should be sent by informing the controller contact team – the EEAS entity – organising the survey / questionnaire / quiz / public consultation by using the contact information available on the survey / questionnaire / quiz / public consultation application. Personal data is not intended to be transferred to a Third Country, not to an international organisation. The given information will not be communicated to third parties, except where necessary for the purposes outlined above.



11	Transfer to Third Countries or International Organizations (IOs) and suitable safeguards (if applicable)	As part of the survey, quiz, questionnaire and consultation, some data - primarily aggregated results - may be transferred to the web. If personal data are published on a publicly available website, these data are accessible worldwide. 12	Time limit for keeping the data - Retention period	Personal data is kept as long as follow-up actions to the surveys / questionnaires / quizzes / public consultations are necessary with regard to the purpose(s) of the processing of personal data as well as for the surveys / questionnaires / quizzes / public consultations and its related management.  All personal data will be deleted from databases 1 year after the last action in relation to the surveys / questionnaires / quizzes / public consultations. Nevertheless, especially with regard to public consultations personal data - a list of contact details - could be kept longer for contacting participants in the context of future EEAS activities. You can request the abandon of such an extension, i.e. if you do not agree with this, please contact the sub-controller, the department organising the survey / questionnaire / quizzes / public consultation by using the contact information available on the survey / questionnaire / quizzes / public consultation application or the Controller by explicitly specifying your request. Reports containing personal data will be archived according to appropriate provisions. Personal data stored by the external company in charge of the surveys / questionnaires / quizzes / public consultations should be deleted as mentioned above.
13	Data Storage	The personal data are stored on servers that abide by pertinent security rules. Physical copies of personal data, if prepared, are stored in a properly secured manner.
14	General description of security measures	Appropriate organisational and technical measures are ensured according to Article 33 of Reg. (EU) 2018/1725. The personal data collected by the EEAS/EU Delegation are stored on servers that abide by pertinent security rules. Data is processed by assigned staff members. Access to specific files requires authorisation. Measures are provided to prevent unauthorised entities from access, alteration, deletion, disclosure of data. General access to personal data is only possible to recipients with a UserID/Password. Physical copies of personal data are stored in a properly secured manner.



15	Rights of individuals	Individuals have the right of access to their personal data and the right to correct any inaccurate or incomplete personal data. The right of rectification can only apply to factual data processed. Under certain conditions, individuals have the right to ask the deletion of their personal data or restrict their use as well as to object at any time to the processing of their personal data on grounds relating to their particular situation. The EEAS will consider the request, take a decision and communicate it to the individuals without undue delay and in any event within one month of receipt of the request.
