# **EU support inside Syria**

€1.8 billion EU assistance inside Syria since 2011



**5.5 million people inside Syria** received **food** assistance to meet their daily needs in 2020



Over 53,000 Syrian farmers and livestock holders

received support for their **agriculture** activities in 2020



Almost 10 million Syrians benefitted from primary health care, physiotherapy and psychosocial support in 2020



Umm Ahmed required urgent medical treatment for her weak heart and benefitted from free consultations at a primary health care center in the north of Idlib funded by the EU. In 2020, the EU facilitated access to health services to vulnerable people in north-west Syria such as Umm Ahmed with 342,271 primary health care consultations in reproductive and maternal health care, mental health, paediatric care and nutrition.



#### Paving the way for a PEACEFUL SOLUTION TO THE CONFLICT

The EU stands with the Syrian people and is working to support a genuine political solution that is Syrian-led and Syrian-owned, in line with UNSC Resolution 2254 and within the UN-facilitated Geneva process:

Data as of March 2027

- Diplomatic efforts to halt the violence inside Syria and support an inclusive Syrian-led political settlement that would unlock reconstruction funds in line with UNSC Resolution 2254
- Support for Syrians to protect their rights (human, housing, land and property) and make their voices heard
- Support to Syrian women and youth as key actors in peacebuilding and conflict prevention
- · Assistance to the families of the missing and the detained
- Support for the prosecution of persons responsible for crimes under International Law, seeking to promote a better access to justice for Syrians



## €1.3 billion in HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE

The EU responds to the life-saving needs of vulnerable Syrians with:

- Emergency health services, including trauma aid and child health care
- Food aid and support to livelihoods including multipurpose cash assistance
- Protection programmes, including child protection and prevention of gender-based violence
- · Access to safe drinking water and sanitation services
- · Education in emergencies
- · Humanitarian demining and risk awareness projects



## €532 million in STABILISATION & LONGER-TERM ASSISTANCE

The EU is the largest donor to Syrian civil society and creates perspectives for Syrians by:

- · Promoting access to justice
- · Empowering Syrians to protect their civic space
- Promoting dialogue as well as social and community cohesion
- Supporting Syrian youth and women through better livelihoods
- · Funding agriculture and food security
- Providing non-formal education, Technical and Vocational Education and Training programmes
- Delivering health care and psycho-social support, and countering sexual and gender-based violence
