Data from the EU Regional Trust Fund in Response to the Syrian Crisis' 8th Results Report



Almost €3.3 billion total EU assistance to Jordan since 2011



Over 109,000 children and youth from Jordan and Syria had access to education since 2015



Over 152,000 Jordanians and refugees from Syria benefitted from health services since 2015



Over 107,000 Jordanians and refugees from Syria benefitted from livelihood support since 2015



Over 210,000 Jordanians and refugees from Syria benefitted from protection and social cohesion related services since 2015



Over 80,000 Jordanians and refugees from Syria had access to clean water since 2015

"The training in home maintenance and electricity was very useful. We were taught how to work as a team, to cooperate and respect each other, in addition to preparing us for a future job. This will be a source of income for my family and my children", said **Huda**, one of the over 664,000 refugees from Syria registered in Jordan (UNHCR, February 2021). **The EU works to improve livelihood opportunities for refugee women from Syria and local communities' women in Jordan.**



€1.2 billion in BILATERAL ASSISTANCE

Focusing on:

- Regional stability and security, and border management
- Socio-economic development, growth and job creation

- Democratic governance, rule of law and human rights
- Helping Jordan cope with and recover from the impact of COVID-19



€390 million in HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE

The EU responds to the most urgent needs of Syrians in Jordan with:

- Assistance to cover basic humanitarian needs
- Education
- Access to healthcare
- Protection activities including legal assistance to facilitate civil and status regularisation



€1.7 billion in RESILIENCE ASSISTANCE

The EU creates perspectives for both Syrians and Jordanians in the long term by:

- Helping Jordan address the economic fallout of the crisis, ensuring that structural reforms lead to growth and prosperity
- Supporting Jordan in delivering access to social protection, improved education, health and water services through the **EU Regional Trust Fund in Response to the Syrian Crisis*** to address the needs of Jordanians and refugees from Syria
