## EUROPEAN UNION SUPPORT TO THE WATER SECTOR



Since 2011, the EU has been supporting investments to ensure that safe drinking water supply, including sanitation and wastewater services are available across Kyrgyzstan.

So far the EU has granted over 50 Million Euros to address urgently needed infrastructure and rehabilitation needs in the water sector, through the Investment Facility for Central Asia (IFCA).








In cooperation with EBRD and EIB, these investments aim to:

- Provide the population with an economically sustainable, affordable service for safe and high quality drinking water and sanitation;
- operations Upgrade and maintenance equipment, together with the provision of wastewater services;
- Establish proper institutional and operational reforms for effective and rational use of water resources meant to reduce water-



The European Union has also been supporting regional programmes aiming at strengthening water management in Kyrgyzstan and support regional water cooperation.

Promoting water and energy strengthening security by national institutional capacities and sector performance, regional cooperation on the dialogue agenda to create an enabling environment for achieving national and regional energy and security through Central Asia Water and Energy Program (CAWEP).

Support water policies in Central Asia strengthen and policy dialogue and cooperation and regional level through the "European Union – Central Asia Water, Environment and Climate Change Cooperation" (WECOOP). Support National Policy Dialogues on Integrated Water Resources Management.



Assist to remediate uranium legacy sites, in accordance with international standards and good practices through the Environmental Remediation Account for Central Asia (ERA). Remediation work is planned to start at the uranium legacy site of Shekaftar in the Kyrgyz Republic in the first quarter of 2020 followed by remediation works at the Min-Kush site.
