As a result of the increased demolition and reconstruction of private houses, the volume of construction waste increases, which entails a certain risk to the health of residents and the environment. Solutions and measures to reduce the emerging risks will be discussed at the roundtable.

During the event, information materials will be distributed to promote proper waste management.

Significant improvements are already visible in the system of municipal waste management in Samarkand, although some problems can still be identified: the insufficient number of containers for collecting municipal waste, low culture of waste management by consumers - residents often place waste in improper places, which worsens the sanitary condition of the city.

In order to solve these problems and provide modernization of the municipal waste management system, Samarkand is implementing an integrated waste management Project, which aims to improve the system of collection, removal and disposal of MSW, improving the sanitary and environmental condition of the city, reducing emissions of harmful substances into the atmosphere, involving the public in waste management.

Summary of Funding and Components of the Project:

European Union Grant, 8 million euros. Technical assistance, financing of public awareness campaign, detailed design of waste management facilities and required surveys, landfill biogas capture and utilization system, procurement of equipment and GIS tools, training and capacity building.

AFD loan, 23.53 million euros. Procurement of 80 new waste collection trucks for MSW collection and disposal, construction of 15 modern waste collection points, construction of new garage, Material Recovery Facility and new landfill, closure of old landfill, etc.

Budget of RUz, 5,64 min. Reconstruction and overhaul of 41 waste collection points, construction of 135 new waste collection points, procurement of 2,100 new containers, provision of tax and customs benefits.
