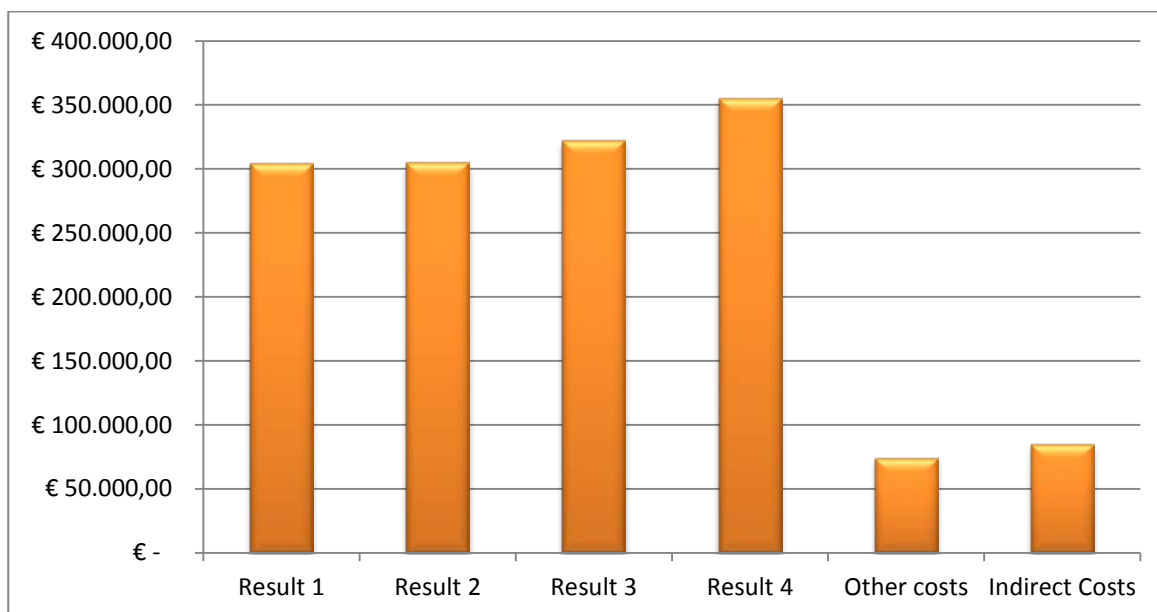

**Main activities:**

- 1.1 Initial assessment in the targeted 5 departmental and 30 municipal governments on capacities, EWS and vulnerable groups.
- 1.2 Participatory design of 4 DRM guidelines for departmental and municipal governments.
- 1.3 Training and technical assistance on guidelines implementation.
- 2.1 Support to the implementation in municipalities of legal regulations, COMURADE, financial mechanisms and Tool Box.
- 2.2 Provision of technical support to VIDECI in the coordination of EWS board for the definition, validation and dissemination of guidelines for the management of information systems and early warning framed in the 4 territorial levels.
- 2.3 Production of appropriate materials and trainings of DGR/UGR (National, departmental, Municipal, Indigenous Autonomies) selected for the definition of information and warning protocols included in the contingency plans, in coordination with VIDECI and SENAMHI.
- 3.1 Establishment and strengthening of neighborhood EOCs and BRES in 4 macro-districts and training on DRR issues for municipal staff.
- 3.2 Implementation of a citizenship culture campaign to raise awareness on inclusive DRR in El Alto.
- 3.3 Design and remodel the new offices of the municipal EOC with technical and financial support from the municipal government of El Alto.
- 4.1 Promote the exchange of experiences and knowledge within the framework of South-South cooperation.
- 4.2 Awareness raising events and campaigns on inclusion for preparing for and responding to disasters for state and non-state actors
- 4.3 Training of trainers of the Armed Forces RAMBO course and of the EGPP course for journalists.
