The Mecklenburg-Vorpommern is a frigate of the German Navy Type F123, also known as Brandenburg-class. It is the fourth unit of this class, and after the state Mecklenburg-Vorpommern named. The Brandenburg-class was ordered by the German Navy in June 1989, and then completed and commissioned between 1994 and 1996 to replace the Hamburg-class destroyers. These frigates primarily carry out antisubmarine warfare, but they also contribute to anti air warfare, surface-to-surface warfare operations and act as tactical command platform. They are also fitted with a flight deck and able to carry two SEA LYNX helicopters. Their design includes stealth features.

The ship can accommodate up to 250 people including not only the crew but also a boarding team and staff members. The frigate Mecklenburg-Vorpommern took part in various operations, including the United Nation mission off the coast of Lebanon and Operation Enduring Freedom at the Horn of Africa.

In September 2016, FGS Mecklenburg-Vorpommern joined EUNAVFOR MED operation SOPHIA.
