Spain, France, United Kingdom, Italy, Sweden, Belgium and Netherlands have provided assistance to Ecuador through the EU Civil Protection Mechanism.

HUMANITARIAN AID

milion has been granted by the European Commission's Humanitarian Aid and Civil Protection Department (ECHO) to provide immediate assistance to the victims of the earthquake in Ecuador. This aid will be delivered through EU's humanitarian partners in the country.



Humanitarian relief includes essentials such as clean water, medicine, food and temporary shelter.



World Food Programme **£500 000** to provide cash-based

transfers to assist +/-20 000 people in Pedernales, Manta and Esmeraldas. The assistance will reach people living in shelters and those who have been affected but still have a house.

> **£350 000** to provide some 5 400 people with water, emergency shelter and disease prevention. In addition, 600 children will recieve psychological support to overcome the trauma.

- Six provinces have declared the state of emergency.



The European Commission's Emergency **Response Coordination Centre (ERCC)**

is facilitating the coordination and support with co-financing the transport of relief items, and has deployed an EU civil protection team (10 experts) to Quito to support the national authorities in their relief efforts.

Deployment of 33 French firefighters specialized on water treatment.
