Summary

On January 17th 2017, the Missions of Canada, the United States, the Organization of Islamic Cooperation, and the Delegation of the European Union to the United Nations will jointly host a full-day High-Level Forum on Combating anti-Muslim Discrimination and Hatred.

This high-level forum will highlight the growing challenges of anti-Muslim discrimination and hatred in various contexts, and focus on substantive tools for addressing them. Three interactive panels will consider important and complementary tools to combat anti-Muslim discrimination and hatred in anti-discrimination law enforcement, civil society coalition-building, and positive narratives to promote pluralism and inclusion.

Panelists will include government, civil society, and private sector representatives. They will assess the scope of rising anti-Muslim discrimination and hatred worldwide, compare government and private sector responses, share best practices, and provide concrete recommendations for combating anti-Muslim discrimination and hatred.
